



MALLIA'S MOMENTS

I want to begin by thanking all of you who prayed for us while we were away last week for our convocation. It is always a good opportunity to share ideas, pray together and have a few laughs with some priests that I do not see very often because of location and various assignments, even away from the diocese.

For awhile now I have been asking for you to pray about the upcoming Missionary Strategic Planning process and in response to how God may be calling you to share the resources God has provided for you. The readings today remind us of how powerful prayer is when done in faith and when it is not only looking to "get something" from God, but rather responding to God. Prayer by its very nature is two-fold. It seeks to praise God and it seeks to grow in deeper relationship with God. As people of faith, we need to always open ourselves up to the presence of God through our prayer. So, pray in faith and seek to always give thanks to God first and foremost.

Couple of reminders:

It is very easy to get in a routine and as a result our actions can be rather mindless reactions than true expressions. That is why I wanted to take this opportunity to call to mind some things so that we are not falling into bad habits.

The first is making the sign of the cross. Make sure that you are actually touching your forehead, your breastbone and both shoulders. Don't rush it! The cross is an important reminder of our salvation and that should never be taken casually. Please be sure that you make the sign of the cross respectfully.

Secondly, I would like to remind you that when we make the sign of the cross on our foreheads, lips and heart before the Gospel, we are doing so while asking God to allow the words of the Gospel to enlighten our minds, be on our lips and be in our heart. There is a purpose for doing this action at mass and hopefully it will remind us to be open to what we are hearing and seek to live it in our lives.

Finally, please try to be a bit more intentional about genuflecting towards the tabernacle and not towards the pew you are about to enter. Genuflection is an act of reverence towards the Real Presence of Christ in the tabernacle.

All of these bad habits can be easily corrected if we simply slow down what we are doing, be mindful of why we are doing it and not be embarrassed because we are doing it. Thank you.

Speaking of registration:

I would strongly urge you register at either of the two parishes if you are not already. If you have moved into the area and are attending either of our parishes and have not registered, this would be the time to do so. Also, if you are out of college and working a regular job it would be best to register on your own and not simply under your parent's registration. Please do not wait until you have a baby or are about to get married to register. Having accurate information about our membership will really help us in planning as we move forward in our planning process. Thank you.

If you have not yet purchased your ticket for the upcoming fundraising event, I would strongly urge you to do so. The event price includes dinner, open bar and entertainment provided by Phoenix Theory. 

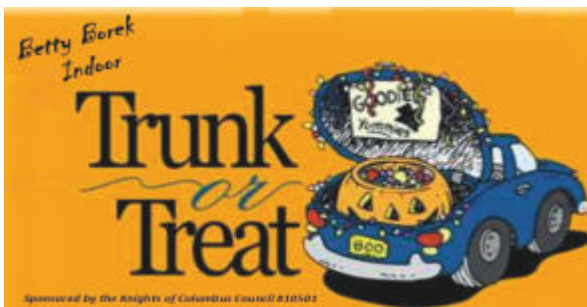
