Please contact the parish office to schedule a baptism. It is recommended that parents seeking Baptism for their child attend two baptismal preparation classes.


Sacrament of Marriage:

Reclaiming the Sacred

With some regularity, incense has been used at each offering of Holy Mass on the weekends at our Family of Parishes. When people ask if there is something special happening, I respond that it's Sunday! Celebrating the Day of our Lord Jesus' Resurrection is reason enough. We have lost the sense of the sacred: what is recognized as holy, set apart for the Lord. In various parts of the nation, the sacred liturgy has lost its identity. Just the other day, I watched a so-called "synod Mass" where someone was engaging in some pagan practice in the sanctuary area during the offering of Holy Mass. There is nothing good or Godly about it. This is what happens when we don't have a clear grasp of our identity in what happens at Holy Mass. All that the bishop, the priest, and the deacon are permitted to do in the offering of Holy Mass is found in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM). I have watched a Mass in another diocese where they created their own creed. No! We don't do this. That's wrong. What is done at Holy Mass is found in the GIRM.

Incense reminds us it's not about us, but about giving God what is His due. It reminds us that our prayers rise like incense before Him (Ps 141:2). Incense elevates our worship of God. Holy Mass engages all the senses (that's why we have the Sanctus bells that are rung).

During our first meeting as the Family Pastoral Council, I expressed the concerns that were brought up concerning incense, in particular those who have difficulty due to asthma and other breathing problems.

Having Covid myself and multifocal pneumonia, I understand the difficulty, but I still use it nonetheless: the good outweighs everything else.

We firmly believe that Jesus heals today. And just because I or someone else prayed for it once and there was no healing, keep seeking it out! It exercises and builds our faith. This is one of the reasons why we have a prayer team that is available to pray with people after the 10:30am offering of Holy Mass at Holy Family! That's why John led the 14 week series on the Holy Spirit and why he offered the 4 week series on Intercessory Prayer! In each occasion, individuals were present to pray for healing. Don't miss these opportunities to seek healing for asthma or other issues! While He heals as He wills and when He wills, He also encourages us to ask, seek, and knock. Too often people give up so easily because it doesn't happen immediately or because they think they have asked sufficiently. However, did you know that sometimes healing is not granted because of some underlying issue that needs to be addressed, oftentimes it is with unforgiveness? With that, there's Unbound prayer! Any one can call the parish office and ask to be paired up with an Unbound prayer minister and receive a greater experience of Jesus' healing! But you have to search for it.

With the help of Fr. Steve, hypoallergenic incense is now used at

every offering of Holy Mass. It was already at St. Augustine and St. Mary Mystical Rose. For a few weeks, it has been used at Holy Family.

Because we recognize that healing may take time with others, it was the decision of the Family Pastoral Council to ensure that there is one Mass available in the Family that is without incense. The particular Mass is still being assessed. Also, at St. Mary Mystical Rose the closed circuit television system in the parish hall has been utilized: it is an option where people who would like more distancing as well as no incense could go. At Holy Family, there is also a closed circuit system that will be utilized for the same purpose. We are in the process of making sure that is all setup on a regular basis as a trial run. These areas are also good for those who want to have more social distancing as well. We hope to have that all in place at the beginning of the new liturgical year, in Advent. Being hydrated also is another way to help if there are coughing issues with incense.

Pilgrimage

Please pray for the safety of Fr. Steve and those who accompany him as he leaves for pilgrimage this week and next. We pray that it is a time that refreshes him, and that it is able to bear much fruit!

Q: The minister at my nephew's protestant church told her congregation that Jesus did not actually multiply the loaves and fishes; the real miracle was that he got people to share. Has the Catholic Church ever taught this? Where does this idea come from?

A: Let's take the second part of your question first. This teaching, developed in the early 1970s, has no merit. The Catholic Church has never taught such a thing. Think about this for a moment. Scripture records 5,000 men, not counting women and children, shared 5 loaves and two fish (Matthew 14:13-21). Without multiplying the loaves and fish, the miracle would have been that anyone could see or touch the tiny, microscopic morsel that each person would have received. Now, add to this, how would there have been 12 baskets of leftovers?

Shortly after concocting this scenario, somebody pointed out this absurdity. Perhaps it was a second grade math or science student? Whoever it was, it was determined by these liberal ministers that rather than retract this attack on Sacred Scripture, a revision was all that was needed. The "spin" given was to suggest an equally ridiculous denial of the miracle that took place. The claim became several hundred people felt guilty and tossed their box lunches onto some sort of large communal blanket. This is another devious denial of the validity of scriptural text.

Denying that a plainly described miracle took place is extremely disrespectful of the text and of our Lord. Jesus plainly said, "*they have no food*" (Matt 15:32). The disciples observe the same and offer as evidence only a mere five loaves and two fish. Furthermore the text is abundantly clear; it is from these five loaves and two fishes that Jesus miraculously feeds the multitude.

There are thousands of different groups professing to be Christian. Jesus warned: "*For many shall come in my name, and shall deceive many.*" (Matthew 24:5).

How can we protect ourselves from being deceived? Once again, we can look to Jesus for the answer:

"And I say also unto you, that you are Cephas, and upon this Cephas I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it..." (Matthew 16: 17-19)

Jesus left His Church to guide us. He gave her His authority and promised to protect this Church until the end of time. (Matthew 28: 18-20). This same Church is still here today. Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to His Church to guide us into all truth (John 16:13). What a great gift.

**St. Augustine and Holy Family
 Faith Formation
 Footnotes**

In all things we conquer overwhelmingly through him [Jesus] who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life,....nor present things, nor future things....nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." Romans 8:37-39

This month faith formation families will tackle some difficult topics such as death and judgement. But we can't discuss either of these topics without discussing the hope of the resurrection which causes us to cry out "O death, where is your victory?"

Genesis 2:7 tells us, "The Lord God formed man out of the clay of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and so man became a living being."

God clothed Adam and Eve's souls with original holiness; a characteristic that preserved them from all evil desires, suffering, sickness, and death. He also gave them free will, allowing them to choose to obey or disobey His command. Their choice was ultimately to disobey; "Because you...ate from the tree of which I had forbidden you to eat..."

(Genesis 3:17).

Although we were cleansed of original sin at our Baptism, and grace was restored; original holiness was not.

To this day, our nature suffers the effects of Adam and Eve's disobedience. We know that our sins can lead to death, but because of Jesus' sacrifice for us on the cross (God's gift of mercy), we now have the opportunity to repent of our sinfulness through the sacrament of Reconciliation which gives us a fresh start each time we leave the confessional.

We also have the gift of the Eucharist where Christ transforms us, giving us a foretaste of the resurrection.

Through these gifts of the sacraments, though we may fall, there is always hope in rising again. We are cleansed through reconciliation and transformed through the power of the Eucharist, if we allow the ourselves to be.

God's gifts are constant and we must either accept or deny them. Christ is our hope and our comfort, especially during difficult times. But knowing the promise of the Resurrection, we can choose to fix our eyes on Jesus and cry out "O death, where is your victory?"

Flat Stanley

Second graders just completed reading the chapter book Flat Stanley written by the late author, Marc Brown. The tale is of a boy who becomes flat after a bulletin board falls on him. Stanley (the main character) thinks it's pretty cool being flat because he can slide under doors, become part of a museum painting where he catches thieves, and even takes part in a sailboat race where he's the sail!

In the first story, Stanley wishes he could visit a friend in California, but his parents can't afford the airfare. They decide to put him in an envelope and mail him to California.

The second graders developed this into a writing/social studies project. The students begin by decorating their own paper flat Stanley. Then they decide what relative or friend they want Stanley to visit and write a letter to accompany him on his trip. The relative may or may not live in Michigan. Often Stanley travels out of the United States. In past years, he visited Germany and China. This year some of the second graders sent their Stanleys to North Carolina, Arizona, Kentucky and Florida. Their letter instructs the relative to take care of Stanley for a while and then return him with a log of all the adventures they had with him. The students always eagerly await the return of their Flat Stanley!

There are many learning skills acquired in this fun project. The students learn the writing process as they compose letters, edit final copies and then mail them. In addition to strengthening writing skills, students learn basic map skills as we graph all the states Stanley has visited.

Please pray for our safe return of all the Flat Stanleys! Although this project is not in our textbook, it certainly fills each child with wonder and excitement. In fact, many have no idea how much they are learning because they are having so much fun!!

What does it mean to have a Mass "offered" for someone?

An individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died. One must never forget the infinite graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass which benefit one's soul. Pope Leo XIII in his encyclical "*Mirae caritatis*" (1902) beautifully elaborated this point and emphasized the connection between the communion of saints with the Mass: "The grace of mutual love among the living, strengthened and increased by the sacrament of the Eucharist, flows, especially by virtue of the Sacrifice [of the Mass], to all who belong to the communion of saints."

When a priest offers Holy Mass, he has three intentions: First, to offer the Mass reverently and validly in accord with the norms of the Church. Second, to offer the Mass in union with the whole Church and for the good of the whole Church. Third, to offer the Mass for a particular intention, such as the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

The special personal fruits of the Mass benefit the celebrating priest who acts in the person of Christ in offering the Mass and to the people who are in attendance and participate in the offering of the Mass. These fruits are both extensively and intensively finite, since each of us is finite. Therefore, the more a Mass is offered, the more benefit is conferred.
