From Msgr. Pat

Several years ago I would undertake a rather rigorous regimen for Lent. I would abstain from meat. I didn't eat between meals. On Fridays I fasted from all solid food. For the Triduum I fasted from all solid food. I kept my usual routine of activities. Needless to say, by Holy Week I was worn down, cranky, and usually had a flu or strep throat. Finally, one of the priests with whom I served asked, "Is this supposed to be penance for you, or for us?" Clearly, I'm not recommending this for Lent.

My new approach involves two questions for conversation with the Lord: What needs conversion in my heart/life? What Lenten practice would help me cooperate with your grace so this conversion takes place?

This newer approach makes it less likely that I'll unintentionally become someone else's Lenten penance. More importantly, I let the Lord take the lead. After all, He knows me better than I know myself, and He wants good for me even more than I want it for myself. Conversation with Him about the coming Lenten pilgrimage should be my starting point, not my last resort.

In other parishes, I've offered suggestions about possible reading. For example, I may decide to watch less television, and spend the time reading something which leads me closer to Christ. In no particular order, I offer the following (some works are longer, and some more challenging). If you have questions, please ask me, or ask one of the other priests or deacons for suggestions:

1. *A Gospel* (I suggest Matthew, since we're reading it on Sundays for the next several months, or John).

2. *Unleash the Gospel* (Archbishop Vigneron's Pastoral Letter after Synod 16. If you've already read it, its worth revisiting).
3. *Paul: His Story* (Fr. Jerome Murphy-O'Connor)
4. *Witness to Hope: Life of St. John Paul II* (George Weigel)
5. *Story of a Soul* (St. Thérèse of Lisieux)
6. *Life of Edmund Campion* (Evelyn Waugh)
7. *The Screwtape Letters* (CS Lewis)
8. *The Great Divorce* (CS Lewis)
9. *The Chronicles of Narnia* (CS Lewis... for junior or senior high, or adults)
10. *Augustine of Hippo* (Peter Brown)
11. *Men and Women Are From Eden* (Mary Healy...St. John Paul II's Theology of the Body)
12. *Diary of a Country Priest* (George Bernanos...fiction)

I may offer others later, but these are the ones that occur to me now.

Keep in mind that Lenten penance isn't an end itself. Lent exists to prepare catechumens for Baptism, so it's an opportunity for us who accompany them to recall our own Baptism. We'll renew our promises at Easter. And so Lent is about Easter, and Easter is about Baptism, and Baptism is about our identity, who we are as God's beloved daughters and sons.

Whatever I do in addition to what the Church requires should lead me to recover that truth. May God bless you.

Mail Call

Q. Let me see if I have this straight, loosing one's temper and at the spur of the moment blurting out a call for God to damn something is a mortal sin? Is God that thin skinned?

A. Blurting something out at the spur of the moment is not a deliberate, preconceived act. You cannot accidentally commit a mortal sin. Mortal sin is knowingly and deliberately committing a most serious sin. It is a deliberate act of defiance. Nobody accidentally robs a bank. Taking God's name in vain is far more than just cursing in a momentary fit of anger. Remember also, "God" isn't his name, it's his title. It's His office.

It is not logical to think God would set aside one of only Ten Commandments for such an infraction. When you commit this transgression, take it into the confessional. However, we should be more concerned on how such an outburst affects those around us who hear us at the time. *"take heed so that your freedoms do not cause others with a weaker*

conscience to fall away." (1 Corinthians 8:9).

In the Old Testament we find several spellings and pronunciations of God's name. Depending on the original text language, and which of the twenty or so common English translations you use, those names include: Elohim, Adoni, Jehovah, I AM, and YHWH. The four letters YHWH, which may represent "*I am who am*," were so sacred to Jews the name was not to even be spoken out loud.

Furthermore, the Hebrew word commonly translated "take" in Exodus 20:7 is "*nasa*," meaning to "bear" or "lift up." Invoking God's name means to bear it up in an oath. As a bearer of God's name, the oath-taker must accomplish the sworn oath, or face severe consequences.

In ancient Israel, an oath was a solemn statement that began (*chai Adonai*) meaning "as the Lord lives" and meant: "If I don't fulfill the following oath, may the Lord who lives strike me dead!" After Jonathan convinced his father, King Saul, not to kill David, Saul

swore an oath. "As the Lord lives (*chai Adonai*), he shall not be put to death" (1 Sam 19:6). Saul's oath means that if David dies at Saul's hand, then Saul is calling to be struck dead.

Even though "God" is not our Creator's name, in today's world, I think people should be very cautious inserting His title into conversation. When liars casually begin or end a statement with "I swear to God," or when taking an oath of office or when testifying in court, they violate the Ninth Commandment while asking God to witness their dishonesty. Sins of this nature must surely be far worse in God's eyes than a momentary lack of self control.

God is not thin skinned. The problem is that our own understanding of Him, Sacred Scripture, Church teaching and history falls woefully short. The best way for us to improve our understanding is to keep questioning, even challenging our faith. Then, just as Sacred Scripture calls all of us to do, study. (2 Timothy 2:15).

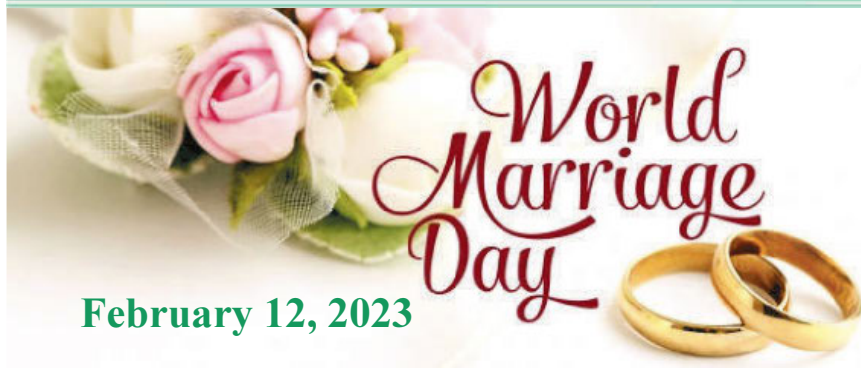

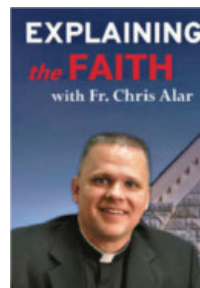

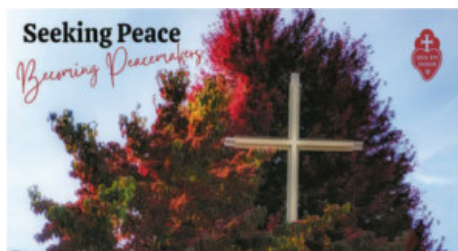
