As I wrote last week, I relied on memory for the books I mentioned. Bad decision. Here are some additional possibilities:

Introduction to the Devout Life

Weeds Among the Wheat Thomas Green, SJ (Discerning God's Will)

I'm writing this on Monday, the commemoration of St. Paul Miki and his companions, martyrs in Japan in the 16th century.

A few years ago I read The Age of Martyrs by Abbot Giuseppi Ricciotti. There I learned that Roman officials would demand that bishops, priests and deacons hand over the copy of the Sacred Scriptures. They would refuse, be arrested, tortured and killed.

It's as if the pagan officials somehow recognized the power of the Scriptures. "If we can deny them their word, they'll crumble." I mentioned in the homily at Mass this morning at St. Augustine that we should ask ourselves this Lent if we appreciate deeply enough the power of God's Word. We should think of the Word of God as an incomparable source of comfort. It is one of the most powerful weapons we have in our battle against evil.

That being the case, I suggest the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7) could serve as a retreat on discipleship throughout the 40 days of Lent. Jesus is talking especially to His disciples (Matt. 5:1), and so to you and me as His disciples in the 21st century in Armada, Memphis, and Richmond.

Take a few verses per day, using the process of *lectio divina* (the ancient practice of praying with Scripture). Many translations make it easy to know where to start and stop within a chapter with helpful headings:

- 1. Take a few deep breaths to slow down.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to guide me. Read the passage aloud, slowly.
- 3. Pause. What word or image strikes me?
- 4. Read the passage again. What feelings arise in my heart?
- 5. Read the passage again.
- Talk with God about the image, and the feelings.
- 7. Sit in silence, enjoying God's Presence.

Remember the two key questions:

- 1. Lord, please show me what needs converting in my heart/life?
- 2. What activity/practice should I take up so your grace can accomplish that change in me?

As you read this, I should be in Galilee with 20 pilgrims. I am taking your intentions, those you wrote in the spirals, and all of you more generally, with me to the Mt. of Beatitudes, Nazareth, Capernaum, Cana and Caesarea Philippi, Bethlehem and Jerusalem. Please pray for us. Pray that I will be the shepherd Jesus wants me to be for the group. We return just before Ash Wednesday.

May God bless you. Msgr. Pat

Pack 85's Pinewood Derby

On Saturday, February 4th, Scout Pack 85, who meets for activities at St Mary Mystical Rose, gathered for their annual Pinewood Derby races. event featured both the boys and the girls who had spent time working on their cars handcrafted from small pieces of wood. Each car is built by the boys and girls with help from their parent(s) and are built to a specific size and weight so that each car is identical. The designs of the cars can be chosen by the builder as long as it follows the guides given. There were 16 different racers with their cars and each car had a personality from its builder. The track was setup in the gathering area, cider and donuts were brought in and race day began at 9am. I arrived just in time to see the first race and it was exciting! All cars got the chance to race at least six times, once on each track lane with three heats of cars. There was electronic timing on the track and it was a good thing as these cars were very fast racing side by side. Some were so close it was too hard to judge without the timing feature. One race was a tie for first place in a heat; two cars with the identical time of 3.041seconds! Scout leader Casev said he had never seen a tie like that before! Made In the Image and Likeness of God

Have you heard of St. John Paul II's teachings entitled Theology of the Body? These teachings are especially relevant to our time. First of all, it is important to understand not only what Theology of the Body is, but also what it is not.

All St. Augustine Catholic School students have started a course in Theology of the Body, (TOB) published by Ruah Woods Press and adopted by the Archdiocese of Detroit's Department of Catholic Schools. Let it be clear from the start, TOB is not a sex education course. TOB is a course on the teachings presented by St. John Paul II about each person's uniqueness and what it means to be a human person. Students at each grade will learn this information at an age-appropriate level. Students will discover their true identity as a child of God and understand how to live in accordance with God's plan for their lives. All children and pre-teens will learn that they have value and that God chose them to live in this time and place as part of his plan.

In the middle school grades, we launched our TOB lessons by looking at creation as a gift. Each of us is created to be a gift to humanity. Sixth, seventh, and eighth graders reflected on how God creates and how He sees all that He creates as good. (Gen 1:10, 12, 18, 21, 25.) When He created humans in his likeness and image, He blessed them (Gen 1:28), and when He brought forth the first humans, God saw everything He

had made and found it "very good." (Gen 1:31.) They learned that every person is made in the image and likeness of God, and additionally, all persons are unique and unrepeatable.

As we explored each unit of the curriculum, we participated in activities to reinforce the lessons learned. In the first unit, our middle school students created snowman ornaments to give as gifts. The ornaments started out the same as they were removed from the package, but it was interesting to see how they changed uniquely as each student envisioned something different for their snowman. The students then shipped these ornaments as gifts to Fr. Kishore's school in India. During Catholic Schools Week, all the students participated in tracing their hands to be placed in the heart of Jesus display. Each hand was a unique expression of who they are as individuals.

We can all help the young members of our community. As parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles and friends, we have the blessed privilege to remind our children that they are unique gifts with intrinsic value. We can encourage them to seek the vocations through prayer that God is calling them to. God has chosen each one of us to be who we are at this time in history. With God's grace, may we raise up the children He has given us to fulfill His plan for their lives.


