
In accordance with the guidelines of the Province of Michigan, engaged couples must contact the Parish Office six months prior to the desired date of marriage and complete required preparation.

### From Msgr. Pat

In a parish where I served, a group would show "The Passion of the Christ" every Good Friday evening. I never went. I saw the film on Ash Wednesday the year Mel Gibson released it. Once was enough for me. I still remember sitting in the theatre across from Eastland in Harper Woods with Bp. Don Hanchon. The opening scene showing Jesus' agony in the Garden of Gethsemane was chilling.

A spectral figure, clearly Satan, stands silently off to the side of Jesus, who is aware of his presence. Slowly, a very large albino serpent slithers from under Satan's robe across the ground toward Jesus (I've been afraid of snakes since childhood, so this scene, unfortunately, sticks with me). The enemy of humanity has returned to tempt Jesus again, to turn away from the Father's Will.

That reminds me of a novel I read years ago, Nikos Katzenzakis' *The Last Temptation of Christ* which portrays the enemy of humanity's last effort to dissuade Christ as He hangs on the cross. No serpents, no dark figures. In fact, the temptation is very human and attractive.

As we continue our Lenten pilgrimage toward Easter, we do well to remember that the enemy of humanity, and so my enemy, our enemy, is still after us. Rather than chilling our hearts

and frightening us, like a scene from an excellent but violent film, we "keep our eyes fixed on Jesus" (Hebrews 12:2), and the hope we have because His tomb in Jerusalem is empty.

If we've not yet availed ourselves of grace of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, opportunities are still available. Whatever my sins, the actions themselves aren't the enemy's goal. His goal is to have me/us lose hope, to think that there's no way Christ could love me, a sinner, that His mercy isn't for me. Hear the lie in that? Jesus says, over and over, exactly the opposite. One example is Luke 5 ff., when Peter kneels at Jesus' feet after the miraculous catch of fish. and tells Him to leave, because he's a Instead, Jesus calls Peter to follow Him, not because he's perfect, but because He loves him.

The Easter feast toward which we journey affirms this truth: Jesus suffered, died and rose for you and me. He's won the victory over the enemy of humanity, of that there is no doubt. Yes, we still have battles to fight, temptations to endure, but the outcome is not in doubt. The victory is ours if we hold on to Him Who loves us.

So, keep walking with Him these final weeks, and do so in hope.



Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) is an age-appropriate opportunity for children to celebrate a *concurrent* Liturgy of the Word in a nearby space and then return to the main assembly for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The children experience the same ritual and hear the same scriptures, but proclaimed in simplified language. The most notable difference is that the homily message is delivered as an interactive dialogue.

CLOW is currently happening at the 9:00 a.m. Mass at St. Augustine and the 10:30 a.m. Mass at Holy Family. All children are welcome. No pre-registration is necessary. Please understand that this is not Childcare; the children are only gone for approximately 15-18 minutes. They'll return during the Offertory preparation. CLOW is most appropriate for Pre-school through 2nd grade.

After the Introductory Rites, the celebrant will invite the children and the volunteer leaders forward to be dismissed. The leaders will proclaim the readings and gospel, lead the children in singing a Psalm response, share the main message, and conclude with a simplified creed and intercessory prayers before rejoining their parents. This is not a "Sunday School" format. There are no crafts, coloring pages or snacks offered.

We are in great need of CLOW Leaders. If you enjoy working with children and can spare about 15 minutes of prep time, please consider this ministry. You will work in teams of two and if enough people sign up you will only be scheduled once every five or six weeks. A detailed leader guide is provided. # Corpus Christi -Walk with Jesus Chairperson NEEDED

Our Corpus Christi procession, Walk with Jesus, began in 2008 when Holy Family was newly formed from Holy Rosary, St. Philip Neri, and All Saints. At that time, the walk started at Holy Rosary in Smiths Creek and ended at All Saints in Memphis. In 2010, after the closing of Holy Rosary, the Corpus Christi Walk With Jesus procession continued with a new route from Holy Family *Columbus* (St. Philp Neri) to Holy Family *Memphis* (All Saints). This continued until 2014 when the route once again changed, and the procession went from St. Augustine to Holy Family.

### **Lenten Preparations**

To a first grader, preparing for Easter is a very exciting time of bunnies, colored eggs, and candy. I'm sure if you asked a first grader, "How are you preparing for Easter?" They would say, "It's St. Patrick's day, not Easter!" However, not a St. A's first grader.

Lent in first grade is an important time in preparation for Jesus' resurrection. During this time, students have been praying and learning about this event. Next year, our first graders will be making their first reconciliation. Therefore, it is important that they get the background knowledge necessary to prepare them for their future sacrament. In order to prepare our students, they are taking extra time to practice their prayers by making a prayer lapbook. They will use their lapbook for as long as they need to learn prayers like the Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be. With that, students wrote their own Lent prayer to pray for an intention. These prayers are displayed in our classroom so that we can pray for the intentions in our daily prayers at school. Prayer intentions in first grade range from pets, to grandparents, to friends who are absent. The important thing is that they are taking time from their busy school day to specifically pray for something. I never knew first graders as intentional and thoughtful as St. Augustine first graders. I know our students will be excited for Easter bunnies and candy, but I also know they understand the importance of the Resurrection and what Catholics do to prepare for Easter.


