
Marriage

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS SOCCER CHALLENGE

This is a competition designed for players aged 9 through 14 to demonstrate the most basic of soccer skills-the penalty kick. Each player will be

allowed 15 shots at the goal from the penalty line (12 yards). The goal will be divided into a series of five scoring zones. Kicking into the upper and lower corners of the net earn more points than the center. There are three levels of competition: Council (local), District (regional), and State. Eligibility is open to all boys and girls in our community. Age eligibility (9-14) is determined by the age of the contestant as of September 1. Proof of age is required. Competitors must register using an official Entry/ Score form, which will be provided at the Council competition.

First Holy Communion

Per Diocesan Guidelines in order to be eligible for First Reconciliation & First Holy Communion:

- 1. Your child must be baptized and at least 7 years old.
- 2. Must be enrolled in Religious Education with regular attendance (90% of Classes) for one full year prior to the 2nd grade.
- 3. Child must be enrolled in St. Jude's Religious Ed program, another Catholic Church or School (A letter must be provided).
- 4. During the second grade year the child must regularly attend 90% of the Religious Education sessions to fulfill their First Holy Communion requirements.
- 5. Our Sacramental Prep is a two year process, attendance must be 90 % of the classes.

Confirmation

Per the diocesan Guidelines in order to be eligible for Confirmation Your Child must:

- 1. Already received the sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation, and Eucharist-- Please provide Baptismal certificate with notations for Reconciliation and First Holy Communion.
- 2. Family must be registered members of St. Jude the Apostle Parish.
- 3. Record of regular attendance of 90 % of the classes in the St. Jude's Parish Religious Education program.
- 4. Records to be provided from another Catholic Church or Catholic School for 2 full years is needed before candidate may be enrolled for Confirmation preparation.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

September 2, 2018 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Judgment tends to have a bad reputation. We often associate it with condemnation, and in the Gospels, we associate it with the Pharisees. Today's Gospel features the Pharisees doing exactly what we expect. "They observed that some of his disciples ate their meals with unclean, that is, unwashed, hands." The Jewish people had strict purification laws that applied to all areas of life. The Pharisees attempt to accuse Jesus of not following the ancestral traditions. Jesus doesn't take offense at their judgments per se. He instead points out the hypocrisy of their words. "You hypocrites, these people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me."

From there, Jesus turns his attention to the concerns of the heart. "The things that come from within are what defile." He lists off a number of sins, including some the Pharisees were likely struggling with, including evil thoughts, envy, and arrogance. When we examine the list, perhaps we're reminded of our own trips to the confessional! As we strive to follow Jesus and live with integrity, we must be aware of our hearts. We must judge our own actions. Are they leading us closer to God or away from Him? Are we growing in love of our neighbor, or are we becoming more closed in on ourselves? As we move into this week, consider the state of our own heart. Perhaps you are overly scrupulous in less important areas. Perhaps there are large areas of overlooked sin that you've excused for too long. Whatever it is, the judgment of God need not cripple us. He offers us a share in His mercy as soon as we turn to Him. This week, allow your heart to be transformed!
