Definition of a valid BINGO: Vertical, Horizontal, Diagonal, and 4-Corners or Special Games Patterns.









BINGO Papers must be purchased immediately prior to the start of a BINGO Game and are subject to serial number verification. It is illegal {State Law} to use BINGO paper purchased during any previous BINGO event, or from any other location. We will be playing with a standard **3 Face Bingo Paper**, and will alternate colors at each game. Game Night Packs (10 games) are available at the Presales Table. **Cost \$12.00/Game Pack**

Extra Sheets for Regular Bingo, Letter T & Letter X ARE \$1.00/Sheet and Blackout Games are \$2.00/Sheet

Splitting or cutting of BINGO paper is prohibited. Your BINGO will be voided if you split your BINGO paper with someone else.

Players under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. All BINGO paper must be purchased by a person 18 years or older or by a person younger than 18 in the presence of parent or guardian. All winnings must be redeemed by a person 18 years or older, or by a person younger than 18 in the presence of a parent or guardian. We reserve the right to ask for photo ID at any time.

You must use a BINGO dauber, and the number daubed must be clearly readable. No Highlighters (felt tip markers) or any other type of marking devices are allowed. Violation of this rule will void your BINGO.

Ball numbers are not official until the number is read out loud by the BINGO caller.

The electronic flashboard is for the convenience of the players only. Any discrepancies between the flashboard and actual numbers called will be resolved through visual verification of the numbers on the balls that have been called and placed in the ball rack.

All prizes will be paid in cash. The Prize Money will be announced by the Caller for each game and are listed on the back.

The maximum prize amount allowed by Texas law is \$5,000.00 for the night and there is no limit per individual game.

Process of determining the winner of a BINGO game: A floor worker verifies the card is correct for the game being played and numbers are verified by the Caller. The prize amount paid to the winner will be rounded up to the nearest \$0.25.

Procedure for handling multiple winners of a BINGO game: All BINGOs are collected by a Floor Worker and the cards are verified to be correct for the game being played. Each BINGO is then verified by the Caller. The Caller asks if there are any more BINGOs, and after announcing the number of winning BINGOs closes out the game. Multiple BINGOs on a single face pay only ONE share of the prize. More than one BINGO on a sheet will be considered multiple winners so long as the BINGOs are on separate faces. Winners will share equally in the prize amount paid. The prize amount paid to each winner will be rounded up to the nearest \$0.25.

Any player may request a verification of the numbers drawn at the time a winner is determined and a verification of the balls remaining in the ball rack and not drawn.

Once the caller has closed a game, no other BINGOs will be valid for that game.

BINGO Operators reserve the right to refuse admission to anyone, and to remove anyone who is disruptive to the games because of inappropriate behavior including and not limited to profanity, noise, and cell phone usage.

Anyone caught knowingly participating in the awarding of a prize to a BINGO player in a manner that disregards the random selection of numbers or symbols shall be prosecuted.

IN CASE OF ANY DISCREPANCIES DURING THE BINGO SESSION, THE RULING OF THE OPERATOR-ON-DUTY IS FINAL
