March 14, 2024

10:15 Meeting Commenced with the Pledge of allegiance, followed by the Memorare Prayer <u>Birthdays</u> Happy Birthday was sung to Lew Nuzzie

Golf Kathy Flautt mentioned that there are 42 Players signed up for the April 17th Golf Outing. There is a maximum of 48. April 3rd is the cutoff date.

- Water Bottles will be placed in the carts for each player. These will be purchased by Mary and Janet.
- Snacks will also be placed in the carts, these will be purchased by Nancy and Lea.
- Cost is \$70 for Golf and Lunch, \$25 for lunch alone.
- All levels of golfers are welcome.

<u>Veteran's Baskets</u> 41 Easter Baskets (update:48 baskets) for local veterans were collected on the stage, what a beautiful site! In addition, Grocery Gift cards donated from the parish for the Easter Baskets for local Veterans brought in \$1,185 (update: \$1,285).

<u>Board Nominating Committee:</u> The Nominating Committee for the 2024-2025 Board is comprised of Patricia Diamond, Sue Ferretti, and Mary Flynn.

Bylaw Change: A formal floor vote was held to change the annual membership dues from \$15 to \$20. Also, a Life Membership will no longer be an option. There was a unanimous vote of Yea and there were no dissenting opinions.

LAMB Presentation – Lew Nuzzie: LAMB's story starts 64 years ago at a local North Carolina Knights of Columbus council of Bill Scott. Bill and his wife Maureen had two children with intellectual disabilities. They experienced first-hand the desperate need to help fund facilities schools and organizations that cared for, educated, and, supported people like their children, Bill's idea grew, and by 1974 he enlisted the help of fellow state officers to present his program to the local Knights of Columbus councils across North Carolina. The idea was simple, if each local council collected funds on an entirely volunteer basis all of the money raised could go directly to where it was needed most to schools and institutions that cared for people with intellectual disabilities. The program operation LAMB was unanimously approved and adopted. The Knights of Columbus across the state wore iconic yellow aprons and handed out Tootsie

rolls to raise money for LAMB which is an acronym derived from the biblical phrase in Matthew to serve the least among my brethren. Today, North Carolina has 130 councils with more than 16,000 members who take to streets and storefronts at various times throughout the year offering Tootsie rolls to passersby for voluntary donations. A substantial portion of the funds raised also comes from the generous donations of local corporations and individuals to help sponsor the North Carolina Special Olympics. In addition to scheduling storefront or grocery store donations, many councils had successful fundraisers consisting of take-home dinners. At Sacred Heart, our council decided to raise funds through take home dinners. We approached various restaurants to ask about purchasing chili, fish, or sauces for our fundraiser. When we asked Valenti's Italian restaurant in Vass, Adam Valenti offered to donate his marinara sauce for free if we furnish the containers. We were overwhelmed! We approached Harris Teeter, Walmart, Food Lion, and Lowe's for quantity discounts on 1 LB boxes of spaghetti. All were generous. When you shop at these merchants, take a minute to ask for the manager and thank them for supporting the Knights of Columbus and their fundraisers. In addition, LAMB receives annual donations from the Women of the Sacred Heart for which we are truly appreciative. We Thank You!

<u>Saint Patrick:</u> We had a special visitor to our General Meeting – St. Patrick Himself! Photo-ops and hugs Galore! (many thanks to Stu Heilman)
