Guest Speaker – Life Care Pregnancy Center (LCPC)

Kathy Wharton thanked the WSH members for their donations and the hospitality committee for the beautiful decorations. WSH wrote words of inspiration / prayers for the women supported by LCPC. A "Guess the number of Teddy Grahams" was enjoyed by all.

History – Mary Stevens's son volunteered at the LCPC.

LCPC – Barbara Lamblin explained the end of the year flyers on the tables and bumper stickers on the tables. She also provided some information about the LCPC. They've been serving the community for 33 years. Last year 215 women were serviced. 70% of these women are unattended. The #1 support for a pregnant woman is a man. The #2 support is time. She also detailed the NC law on abortions. She introduced the guest speaker, Jeff.

LCPC guest speaker – Jeff (mentors men)

Everything he and the LCPC does is about Jesus. For a transformation to take place, the client comes to know Christ and that abortion is wrong. He gave the point of view of both the mother and father. He explained that just being prolife is not enough. Jeff gave the statistics on men who support impregnated woman, abortion, and the lives saved by organizations like LCPC. Jeff also provided information about the Summit Meeting held in Moore County. He noted that no pastors from the 8 largest churches in the area attended. Jeff is in need of women encouraging men to get involved with PCPC. He is currently involved in a study - faith without works is dead.

Jeff closed his presentation with a beautiful prayer.

He then entertained a short Q & A session.

Lunch was enjoyed by WSH and LCPC attendees.
