SEVENTH GRADE SOCIAL STUDIES

First semester: North American and World Geography

Students will study use a new program entitled: Geography Alive-Regions and People

This program was created in partnership with scholars from the National Council for Geographic Education. It is a stimulating, case-study approach to geography. The program is designed to reach learners of all abilities using multiple intelligences teaching strategies and theory and research-based active instruction.

Students have online access to the test book. They also have an interactive notebook and there is a set of text books available in the classroom.

- Develop essay writing skills- how to write and develop an argument

- Reading and understanding current events using articles from the <u>Upfront</u> magazine
- Develop an understanding of how Catholics and the Catholic Church have influenced American history
- Use of *Thinking Maps*
- Students will have choice about how to display mastery of some concepts
- Participation in STEM and interdisciplinary activities
- Use of ipads research, games, presentations-many of these are displayed on Seesaw

Grading:

Weighted values are assigned as follows

First and third quarters: Class Work (can include participation) = 30%, Daily Homework= 10%, Quizzes= 20%, Tests/Projects= 40%

Second and fourth quarters: Class Work (can include participation) = 25%, Daily Homework= 10%, Quizzes= 20%, Tests/Projects= 35%, Final= 10%

Absences:

Class work and homework that are missed because of an absence may be turned in no later than 3 school days after the student returns to school. Long-term projects may still be due on the date assigned, if reasonable. If not, an extension of no more than 3 days may be given. Absence work is recorded as a "1" in the grade book.
