FROM THE NURSE'S OFFICE

If your student is currently keeping a medication in the school nurse's office (including but not limited to Epi-Pens, inhalers, prescription medication, or over-the-counter medication), please arrange to pick it up by the last day of school. Any medication that is left at school over the summer will be disposed of, per school policy.

BE SURE ALL FEES ARE CURRENT

Parents: Please be aware that all student debts (such as library, cafeteria, school fees, textbook damage/replacement, late pick-up fee, ASP fee, etc.) need to be paid relay race, tug-of-war, obstacle course, water balloon toss, etc. A few reminders:

- -A pizza lunch is provided to all students by the school, so there is no need to send a lunch with students on Field Day unless your child prefers not to eat pizza.
- -Students should wear modest shorts, their Field Day tshirt, and athletic shoes. Field Day shirts were sent home with students on Thursday, including volunteer shirts. Please check those backpacks!

- -We encourage you to apply sunscreen to your child before school, and we encourage your child to wear a hat.

- -Volunteers should wear their "volunteer" Field Day shirt. This is your "ticket" to get in.



Duke TIP: The Duke University Talent Identification Program is dedicated to being a global leader in identifying academically talented students and providing innovative programs to support the development of their optimal educational potential. Many of our students qualified for their 7th Grade Talent Search this year through



scores that are approximately equal to the 50th national percentile rank for college-bound seniors taking the tests. About 35% of Duke TIP students meet that criteria.


