PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

As a Catholic school, it is a given that St. Mark places great emphasis on high academic standards and faith formation. What may not be so apparent are the many other aspects of a well-rounded education that our faculty and staff incorporate into the school day. One of these is "growth mindset." Because we feel this is such an important component of your child's education, we will be providing you with some tools throughout the school year that will help you reinforce this concept at home.

What is a "growth mindset?"

It is a term coined decades ago by Dr. Carol Dweck PhD, a psychologist at Stanford University. In the education arena, having a growth mindset means students understand that they can increase their intelligence and success through hard work and asking for help. Individuals with a growth mindset thrive on challenge and learn from their mistakes, using them to push forward towards success. A "fixed mindset" on the other hand, assumes that one's abilities, intelligence, and creativity are set in stone and cannot be altered in a meaningful way.

How do I know what my child's mindset is?

Children tend to exhibit a mindset early on, which continues to inform many aspects of their lives all the way into adulthood. Examples include their approach to success and failure, their behavior, and ultimately their ability to achieve happiness. Does your child give up easily, or keep going in the face of adversity? Does your child bristle at constructive criticism or learn from it? Does he/she find the success of others threatening or inspiring?

What can the school do and what can parents do to encourage a growth mindset?

Growth mindset is an area that St. Mark Catholic School has been focusing on for a couple of years, and one that we will continue to emphasize with our students. Teachers consistently encourage


