

DEACON GERALD – TUITION PAYMENTS FOR CCE STUDENTS

It has been asked: “Why do parents have to pay for their children to learn about God?” This question was directed to me because of our decision to charge tuition for CCE attendance.

There is a lot of teaching about God that is available at no charge to parents. It is on the internet, in books, and on TV. Most of it is very inaccurate, or blatantly wrong. A parent must be sure what their children learn about God is The Truth. St. Anthony’s works hard to provide a CCE program that teaches only the Truth. We see ourselves providing a sound Faith Foundation to the youth as an aid to parents who are the primary teachers of their children about God and about the Christian Faith. Unfortunately, most parents have given that total responsibility to the Church. Most parents feel inadequate to provide this education for their children and are not willing to delve into the training necessary to give them a complete Faith education. That being said, whether one works at developing their own teaching skills, or they pass that responsibility on to someone else; there is a cost to training, books, and supplies for that effort.

St. Anthony’s has two paid employees who are paid approximately 40 hours each week “between them” to present a very fine program. These employees spend an additional 20 hours+ (unpaid) to ensure that your children get the best Christian education we can provide. In addition, there are approximately 20 volunteers who work to teach and assist in these efforts. All teaching staff, whether paid or volunteers, must have tools and supplies (including workbooks) in these classes to be effective.

Last year St. Anthony’s spent approximately \$40,000 on Religious Education. Of that money, less than half was spent on salaries. Someone must pay for those expenditures. We had a fundraiser to help pay these expenses and intend to do so again this year. It seems only right that parents, who are asking the Church to educate their children, would be willing to make the small investment we ask to help pay a small portion of these expenses. We see parents spending tremendous amounts of money to teach their children how to play sports or learn other secular skills. Why would any parent be bashful about investing in a program to provide their children with a solid Religious Education?

\$45 for a year’s worth of Religious Education seems pretty minimal to me. And \$40 dollars to help pay for the “retreat” expenses associated with 1st Communion and Confirmation preparation does not seem excessive. On the other hand, if anyone is “not able” to pay for their children’s tuition, the tuition can be waived, or entirely removed. In addition, there are numerous paths to have the tuition waived, one way is volunteering to help with the program.

Send forth Your Spirit of Wisdom and Love, O Jesus our King, that He may renew the face of the earth.


