Message from the desk of the Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

With the Sunday after Thanksgiving, the Church has begun a new Liturgical year. I would like to take a few lines to share a few thoughts about what the season of Advent is about.

The season of Advent has two main emphasis:

- The first emphasis is as a season to prepare for Christmas when Christ's first coming to us is remembered.
- 2. The second emphasis is as a season when that remembrance directs our minds and hearts to await Christ's second coming at the end of time.

Advent is a time of preparation. A time in which we, as faithful believers in God, prepare to celebrate the fact that our Lord, Jesus Christ was born, to bring salvation to all of us who choose to believe in him. During the season of Advent, the readings all concentrate upon the expected second coming of Christ, encouraging each of us to "prepare the way of the Lord" and "to make straight the way of the Lord."

How can we participate in this preparation?

A very good way would be to daily attend the celebrations of the Eucharist (the Mass) and then receiving the sacrament of Reconciliation. The Church encourages all of us to receive the sacrament of Reconciliation at least during the seasons of Advent and Lent.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is an excellent way of preparing ourselves to celebrate how the Lord came among us to proclaim God's Word to all of us.

I hope and pray that each of you will be able to participate and receive the many benefits of the season of Advent as we wait in joyful anticipation to celebrate and remember that night when our Redeemer was born.

I join our Deacon Gerald and Parish Staff in wishing a most Blessed Christmas to each of you. Our Christmas masses will be offered for all our people. May you experience the presence of your Lord Jesus Christ.


