God is talking to one of his angels. He says, "Do you know what I have just done? I have just created a 24hour period of alternating light and darkness on Earth. Isn't that good?" The angel says, "Yes, but what will you do now?" God says, "I think I'll call it a day."

Won't get to hold that little one for a month after she is born so her immune system can build due to the virus and new parents concerned about their baby. 


