Baptism: Parents are to call Bertha at x221 or email office@stelizabethdallas.org to schedule an appointment to arrange for the Baptismal class. Both parents and godparents are required to take the class. These classes are held in our parish on the 2nd Saturday of each month at 2:00 PM in the Grahmann Center. Upon completion, a certificate is issued which remains valid for a three year period. After the class is completed, then a baptismal time will be scheduled.

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR



In today's Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples, "Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them." Everyone wants to feel welcomed, but sometimes being welcoming pushes us outside our comfort zone. When someone looks, speaks, or dresses differently

from us, we tend to be stand-offish. We have heard much lately about welcoming the stranger, the immigrant and the refugee and we try to be supportive of the efforts to provide for them and treat them with fairness and justice. But how do we do in our own parish? I know that sometimes when a homeless person, or a person with active toddlers, or someone who is dressed inappropriately sits near us we are uncomfortable. But consider this: that homeless person may be trying to find hope, that person who is not properly dressed may be seeking a relationship with God, and the kids...thank God that their parents think it is important to worship

together as a family. Let's do all we can to make these people feel welcome, so they don't "shake the dust off their feet and move on."

New to the Parish?




