# Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

## FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR



In today's Second Reading, St. Paul addresses Christians in Ephesus. He tells them not to act like fools by following the evil ways of popular culture. He is saying the same thing to us. The Christians in Ephesus in the first century were still battling against foolishness and sin, even though they were baptized and going to Mass regularly. He explains to

the Ephesians two key ingredients for Christian wisdom, two key skills that we all need to develop if we want to experience life as God meant it to be experienced. First, we have to overcome ignorance by becoming experts in God's plan and his will. This applies both to how we see our individual lives, and also to how we see the world around us. In both, we want to learn to follow God's will, not ours. And second, we have to put material pleasures in second place, and spiritual pleasures in first place. Or as St. Paul says, "do not get drunk on wine, but be filled with the spirit."

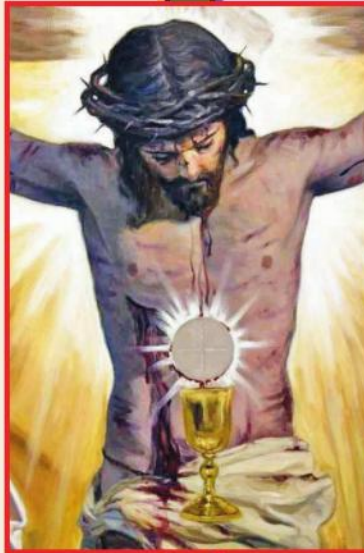
