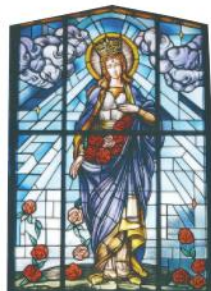

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR



Today's second reading is from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. It is the most frequent scripture verse read at weddings: "Love never fails." Why is this true? Simply put, love never fails because it is something that has been instituted by God. We like to think that love is a purely human emotion,

but it has been placed in our hearts from the time we were conceived. In the first reading, from the Prophet Jeremiah, He says, "Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you..." When we tell someone that we love them, we are saying that the love which God has planted in us, we choose to share with them. When a couple is married, this choice to share God's love is forever. In today's world, we have diminished the meaning of the word "Love." To say that I love my car, or I love french fries, or I love football, is a mis-statement of the emotion. When we are taught to love our neighbor and to love our God, that is serious business. Be careful with this precious gift from God, and it will never fail.

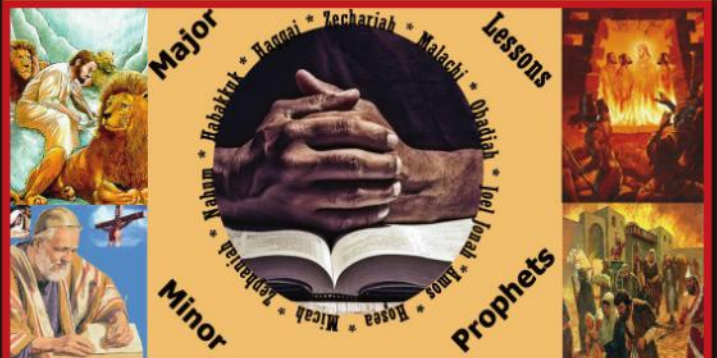


Baptismal Classes
