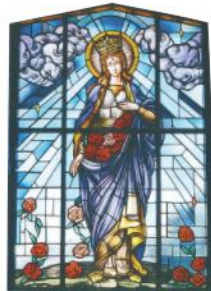

Baptism: Parents are to call Bertha at x221 or email
office@stelizabethdallas.org to schedule an appointment to
arrange for the Baptismal class. Both parents and godparents are
required to take the class. These classes are held in our parish on
the 2nd Saturday of each month at 2:00 PM in the Grahmann
Center. Upon completion, a certificate is issued which remains
valid for a three year period. After the class is completed, then a
baptismal time will be scheduled.

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR



In this week's Gospel Jesus tells the story of a man who was injured by robbers and left half-dead on the side of the road. A priest goes by but does not help him; a Levite walks by and does not pay any attention; only the Samaritan has pity on him. Who was the neighbor to the wounded man? "The one who showed mercy," says Jesus. Then he invites us to "Go and do the same." Christians do not live for themselves but for others. When someone loves God the Father with his whole heart, he takes man seriously, all men. And anyone who loves his fellow man does not ask, "Who do I need to love?" but "Who needs me close to them?" Jesus tells us two things clearly: we are all neighbors and we should all behave like the Good Samaritan. It doesn't matter what their initials are, or their political views or social standing or their religion; what matters is that everyone is my brother and sister. Let us also "go and do the same," with God's help.

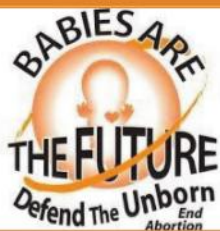

Pope to Canonize John Henry Newman on October 13, 2019

In February, the Pope signed a decree recognizing a second miracle attributed to Blessed John Henry Newman, the inexplicable healing of a woman with a "life-threatening pregnancy".

Blessed **John Henry Newman** was one of the most prominent converts to Catholicism from Anglicanism of the 19th century. He was already an esteemed Anglican theologian when he founded the Oxford Movement to return the Church of England to its Catholic roots, before himself converting to the Catholic faith. He was renowned as a brilliant thinker and was made a cardinal by Pope Leo XIII. He died in Birmingham in 1890, aged 89, after founding the Birmingham Oratory.
