Baptism: Parents are to call Bertha at x221 or email office@stelizabethdallas.org to schedule an appointment to arrange for the Baptismal class. Both parents and godparents are required to take the class. These classes are held in our parish on the 2nd Saturday of each month at 2:00 PM in the Grahmann Center. Upon completion, a certificate is issued which remains valid for a three year period. After the class is completed, then a baptismal time will be scheduled.

Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR



Today's first reading presents one of the most gripping stories in the Bible. The pagan rulers of ancient Israel attempted to force the Jewish people to violate their dietary laws. This was really an effort to persuade them to abandon their relationship with God. And the young men in today's story, together with their mother, all affirmed that they were prepared to die

rather than offend God. Their relationship with God was so real that it brought them to die for the Lord, with the hope of eternal life. There are moments when our relationship with God will cost us. The more any relationship matters to us, the more we're willing to suffer for the person we love. We're all called to live as those young men did, with our eyes fixed on God, on his promises and on his presence. The traditional word for this is "Martyr" from the Greek word martyrios, which means witness. As Christians, we're called to witness to the rest of the world that God is real, that he's good, and that he's worth it.


