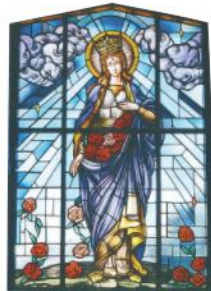

Baptism: Parents are to call Bertha at x221 or email
office@stelizabethdallas.org to schedule an appointment to
arrange for the Baptismal class. Both parents and godparents are
required to take the class. These classes are held in our parish on
the 2nd Saturday of each month at 2:00 PM in the Grahmann
Center. Upon completion, a certificate is issued which remains
valid for a three year period. After the class is completed, then a
baptismal time will be scheduled.

Evangelization: Children and Teen Formation: We provide a total

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR



Memorial of St. Elizabeth of Hungary

Today we celebrate the memorial of St. Elizabeth of Hungary, our patron. She was the daughter of Andrew II, King of Hungary, and wife of Duke Louis IV of Thuringia. She is famous for her great kindness and inexhaustible charity towards the poor and the sick. After

the early death of her husband, Elizabeth laid aside all royal dignities in order to serve God more freely. She put on simple clothing and showed great patience and humility. Because of her love for the poor and needy, the goods belonging to her as a widow were withheld by her family, and she was forced to leave her home. With her three young children in tow, she became a Third Order Franciscan and built a hospital for the poor with the property which she had managed to keep. She died in 1231, at the young age of 24. We begin our Mass today with this prayer, *"O God, by whose gift Saint Elizabeth of Hungary recognized and revered Christ in the poor, grant through her intercession, that we may serve with unfailing charity the needy and those afflicted."* Reflect on this prayer with your family and talk about ways you might better serve the poor, the hungry and the marginalized in our community in honor of St. Elizabeth.

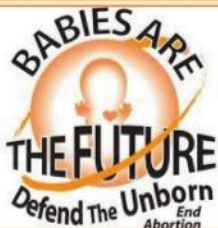
