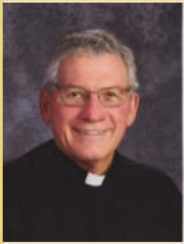

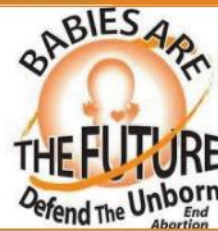

Lent is Fast Approaching

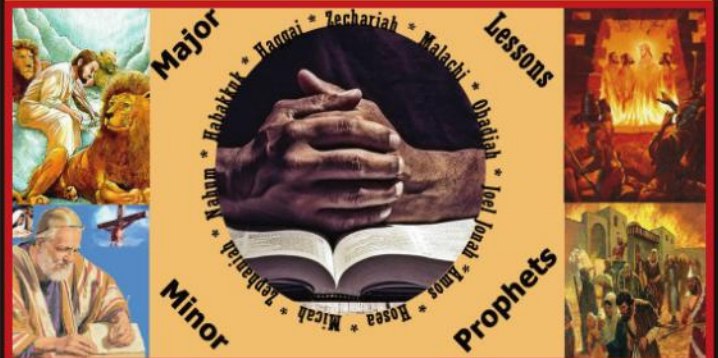
