

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR



Our world is a strange mixture of goodness and evil. God sows wheat in the field, but the Devil sows weeds. Even so, God can pull good from this situation. If good is to remain strong it must go through struggles. The disciples were impatient, just like we are: we would like to just get rid of everything that is opposed to the Kingdom. But impatience is a bad counselor.

Jesus, on the other hand, says, "wait and see." Modern man seeks immediate results, and he wants them at all costs and with the least amount of effort possible. But this is not how things work! We rush into things and rashly judge others to be good or evil. It is frightening to see that evil spreads so quickly while goodness makes no progress. It is so easy to fall into a state of pessimism and despair! We have such a hard time waiting for solutions to our problems and we begin to question God. We do not recognize his face, and we run the risk of disfiguring it ourselves. With gospel in hand let us remake our image of the merciful face of God. Perhaps the image we have is a product of our own state of emotion. Jesus is the image of the Father: "He who sees me sees my father; he who hears me hears my father." Athenagoras of Athens reminds us that the Holy Spirit is the "sympathy of God." God has a magnanimous heart and he always gives us the chance to repent and turn to him. His patience is at once moderate and clement. It is just as we sing in the responsorial psalm: "Lord, you are good and forgiving!"

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (The Proliferation of Sin)

1865 Sin creates a proclivity to sin; it engenders vice by repetition of the same acts. This results in perverse inclinations which cloud conscience and corrupt the concrete judgment of good and evil. Thus sin tends to reproduce itself and reinforce itself, but it cannot destroy the moral sense at its root.

1868 Sin is a personal act. Moreover, we have a responsibility for the sins committed by others when we cooperate in them: - by participating directly and voluntarily in them; - by ordering, advising, praising, or approving them; - by not disclosing or not hindering them when we have an obligation to do so; - by protecting evil-doers.

1869 Thus sin makes men accomplices of one another and causes concupiscence, violence, and injustice to reign among them. Sins give rise to social situations and institutions that are contrary to the divine goodness. "Structures of sin" are the expression and effect of personal sins. They lead their victims to do evil in their turn. In an analogous sense, they constitute a "social sin."


