Baptism: Parents are to call Bertha at x221 or email office@stelizabethdallas.org to schedule an appointment to arrange for the Baptismal class. Both parents and godparents are required to take the class. These classes are held in our parish on the 2nd Saturday of each month at 2:00 PM in the Grahmann Center. Upon completion, a certificate is issued which remains valid for a three year period. After the class is completed, then a baptismal time will be scheduled.

Evangelization: Children and Teen Formation: We provide a total formation program for Catholics from Pre-4 to Adult. FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR



Many of us have not been to church for a while. We are, rightfully concerned for our safety and the safety of our families. We have substituted Mass on television and personal prayers. Thanks be to God that these options are available to us. Some have even decided that they don't need that weekly (or daily) gathering any longer. Today's readings speak to all of us, but

especially to those who have been gone too long. The Prophet Isaiah says, "All you who are thirsty, come to the water!...Come

to me heedfully, listen, that you may have life." St. Paul asks us, "What will separate us from the love of Christ? Will anguish, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or the sword?" (He does not mention viruses, but I suppose he could have.) "No, in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our

Lord." And finally, in the Gospel we hear the familiar words, "He said the blessing, broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, who in turn gave them to the crowds. They all ate and were satisfied."

I understand that many of you are hesitant to assemble in a group. I want you to know that we have taken significant precautions to assure that you are able to maintain social distancing while at Mass. The church is thoroughly disinfected immediately after each gathering to further reduce risk. Hymnals have been removed from the pews and other steps are taken to reduce contact points. Mass attendance is increasing slightly each week, but I look forward to greeting many more of you in the near future. We will add more Masses as necessary to assure your safety. God Bless You All!

The cardinal virtues

1805 Four virtues play a pivotal role and accordingly are called "cardinal"; all the others are grouped around them. They are: prudence, justice, fortitude, and temperance. "If anyone loves righteousness, [Wisdom's] labors are virtues; for she teaches temperance and prudence, justice, and courage." (see note 64) These virtues are praised under other names in many passages of Scripture.

1810 Human virtues acquired by education, by deliberate acts and by a perseverance ever-renewed in repeated efforts are purified and elevated by divine grace. With God's help, they forge character and give facility in the practice of the good. The virtuous man is happy to practice them.
