FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR



This week Jesus continues with his "Sermon on the Plain." He is in the foothills of the mountains of Galilee, in a grassy meadow. He is surrounded by what Luke calls a "great crowd". In this section of his homily, he paints a simple, powerful portrait of a true Christian. But the true Christian is nothing else but a follower of Christ, another Christ,

in fact. So as he describes the characteristics of a Christian, Jesus indirectly gives us a portrait of himself; he shows us what kind of Lord he really is - a lavish one. Nothing limits his generosity and love - nothing. If we are ungrateful to him, he is still generous with us. If we oppose him, disobey him, insult him, abandon him - he keeps on loving us. He simply doesn't give up on us. Imagine Jesus as he speaks these words: love your enemies, stop judging, stop condemning, forgive, give, bless... Do you think he spoke them with a frown, with a voice like thunder, threatening destruction? Hardly. He probably spoke them with a smile and a perhaps glint in his eye. He spoke eagerly, enthusiastically, because he was imparting to us the secret of what it means to be a child of God. "Your reward will be great!" "Gifts will be given to you, overflowing, will be poured into your lap!" That is the kind of God we serve. One who has no limits on his generosity, no limits on his love. One who is always looking for more ways to shower us with his goodness. As it says in today's Psalm, "The Lord is kind and merciful."

Catechism of the Catholic Church

Respect For the Human Person

1929 Social justice can be obtained only in respecting the transcendent dignity of man. the person represents the ultimate end of society, which is ordered to him: What is at stake is the dignity of the human person, whose defense and promotion have been entrusted to us by the

Creator, and to whom the men and women at every moment of history are strictly and responsibly in debt.

1930 Respect for the human person entails respect for the rights that flow from his dignity as a creature. These rights are prior to society and must be recognized by it. They are the basis of the moral legitimacy of every authority: by flouting them, or refusing to recognize them in its positive legislation, a society undermines its own moral legitimacy. If it does not respect them, authority can rely only on force or violence to obtain obedience from its subjects. It is the Church's role to remind men of good will of these rights and to distinguish them from unwarranted or false claims.

1931 Respect for the human person proceeds by way of respect for the principle that "everyone should look upon his neighbor (without any exception) as 'another self,' above all bearing in mind his life and the means necessary for living it with dignity." No legislation could by itself do away with the fears, prejudices, and attitudes of pride and selfishness which obstruct the establishment of truly fraternal societies. Such behavior will cease only through the charity that finds in every man a "neighbor," a brother.
