# Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

## From the Desk of the Pastoral Administrator



In my last bulletin reflection, I wrote about our participation in the Sacred Liturgy — in particular the Mass — and how that participation must be first and foremost the spiritual participation of prayerful receptivity to the grace God desires for us.

And while this is important, and we must return to it from time to time to make sure we aren't losing sight of the most important thing, there are nevertheless other forms of participation that can greatly enrich our parish life. Today I am writing to ask for assistance in some of these secondary forms of participation.

Within the Mass, singing is one of the ways by which we glorify God. (You may have noticed that I like to sing several of the prayers at Sunday Mass, especially at the 10am Mass, which I would like to highlight as the principal Mass of the week.) We should all sing the hymns and Mass parts — Kyrie, Gloria, Holy Holy Holy, etc. — to the best of our abilities. But I am writing to you today to ask for volunteers to serve as Cantors to lead the congregation in these at all four of our weekend Masses, and to recruit for our three choirs, which will serve on a rotating basis at our 10am Mass. In particular, I would like to draw your attention to our Ensemble Choir, which has been inactive for some time now, but which I hope will soon resume!

Besides music ministry, we are also currently in need of more altar servers. This ministry is open to young people in 5th-12th grade. Servers should be attentive, devoted, and dependable, as they are privileged to assist in the handling of sacred objects. Ideally we would have at least four servers at the 10am Mass, and at least two servers at the other three Masses. There will be altar server training on Saturday, September 10th, at 11:30 am. Please contact Deacon Paul Williams if your child is willing to serve regularly at any of the weekend Masses.

We would also be glad to have a few more lectors and ushers. If you're interested in volunteering, please contact Deacon Paul for lectors, or Michael Rangel for ushers. (See front page of bulletin for contact information.)

Finally, outside of the Liturgy, there are many great ways to participate in the life of the parish. We have some great groups here, dedicated to service in different ways, and fostering community life in a way that supplements the community we experience at Mass. I warmly recommend that you get involved in one or more of these, if you aren't already. But that's a topic for another time...



## Catechism of the Catholic Church

### Hell.

**1036** The affirmations of Sacred Scripture and the teachings of the Church on the subject of hell are a call to the responsibility incumbent upon man to make use of his freedom in view of his eternal destiny. They are at the same time an urgent call to conversion: "Enter by the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the way is easy, that

leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. For the gate is narrow and the way is hard, that leads to life, and those who find it are few."

*Since we know neither the day nor the hour, we should follow the advice of the Lord and watch constantly so that, when the single course of our earthly life is completed, we may merit to enter with him into the marriage feast and be numbered among the blessed, and not, like the wicked and slothful servants, be ordered to depart into the eternal fire, into the outer darkness where "men will weep and gnash their teeth."*
