Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

From the Desk of the Parochial Vicar



Self-justification as opposed to Justification by God.

Three Sundays ago, the Gospel of Luke admonished us with the words "when you have done all you have been commanded say, we are unprofitable servants" (Lk 17,10), indicating the gratuitous nature of our calling and service to others. The Gospel of today presents similar admonition concerning our spiritual life that requires humility, gratitude to God and compassionate solidarity towards fellow

brothers and sisters. St. Luke reminds us today that when we are convinced of our righteousness and for that despise everyone else, we run the risk of condemning ourselves before God. (Lk 18,9)

It is only God that can justify us. As such, those who are convinced of their own righteousness run the risk of presumption. Though the example of the Gospel mentioned a Pharisee who was praying in the temple, his attitude can be likened to an approach to Christian discipleship where there is personal selection of the content of faith, liturgy and worship of God and sacramental life, which are not the same with what the Catholic Church believes, teaches, prays, and lives. The practical implication of this type of Christian discipleship is the common selfjustification of one's attitude towards Holy Communion, sacrament of reconciliation, certain moral issues not acceptable to our contemporary modern society and culture, and obviously a form of exclusive personal approach to prayer and worship that relativizes praying together with the community. Therefore, when we 'pick and choose' according to our relativistic criteria, we are not far from the self-righteous attitude condemned by Christ in the Gospel of today.

The second aspect that Jesus warns us is as regards the consideration of our righteousness in relation to others. When we overestimate the efforts, we are making towards obeying God's commandments, as if it is all by our own making, and underestimate the efforts of those whom we consider sinners are making without so much to show externally for it according to our own logic and not that of God, we run into spiritual pride. Of course, such a spiritual pride has its accompanying vices of arrogance, indifference, and ignorance.

Let humility, selflessness, gratitude, and compassion be our watchwords as we meditate on our spiritual journey with Christ in the company of our fellow brothers and sisters.




