Baptism: Parents are to call Bertha at x221 or email office@stelizabethdallas.org to schedule an appointment to arrange for the Baptismal class. Both parents and godparents are required to take the class. These classes are held in our parish on the 2nd Saturday of each month at 10:00-11:30 AM in the Grahmann Center. Upon completion, a certificate is issued which remains valid for a three year period. After the class is completed, then a baptismal time will be scheduled.

Evangelization: Children and Teen Formation: We provide a total formation program for Catholics from Pre-4 to Adult. Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

From the Desk of the Pastoral Administrator



You might notice sometimes at Sunday Mass that the second reading is thematically unrelated to the rest of the readings. You're not imagining it: in the current Lectionary (that is, the collection of Scripture passages we read at Mass throughout the year), the first reading and responsorial psalm are almost always paired with the Gospel — often to show how the Old Testa-

ment is fulfilled in the New — while the second reading takes us independently through the works of St. Paul or one of the other Apostles. This is especially true during Ordinary Time.

The result of this is that, since the Gospel is rightly the most compelling component of the Liturgy of the Word, the writings of St. Paul often go overlooked in the homily. But St. Paul is worth getting to know, and has some good insights into the Christian life and community that are relevant still today.

In this week's second reading, St. Paul cautions us against division and factionalism in the Church, and extolls us to unity in Christ. Just as in his day, people were calling themselves "Paul Christians" and "Cephas Christians" and "Apollos Christians", so in our day, some call themselves "Vatican II Catholics" or "Traditional Catholics". But these labels only harm the body. Instead of focusing on our differences, we should focus on Christ our Lord, and let Him unite us.

January 22nd is the feast of St. Vincent, deacon and martyr, though we don't celebrate it liturgically this year because it falls on a Sunday, and Sunday almost always takes precedence over feasts of the Saints. Still, St. Vincent has a special place in my heart, given my work with the deacons of this diocese. Please pray, through the intercession of St. Vincent, that many good men in our diocese will answer the call to discern the diaconate. More information can be found at https://www.cathdal.org/ deacons. And if you'd like to support the diaconate program financially, please be sure to contribute to the Bishop's Annual Appeal.

Finally, after over six months of waiting, I am pleased to announce that the granite work over the front entrance is complete, and we can once again safely use those doors. I know the closure of those doors has been a burden especially to those of you with limited mobility, and so I thank you again for your patience while we got it fixed. I hope to have more work done to improve accessibility in the future. Stay tuned!


