Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

From the Desk of the Parochial Vicar



"His disciples came to him, and He began to teach them".

We all seek happiness in life. We search for it in relationships – friendship, marriage, family, and various social associations. We desire to have it at work, in our different careers. It is so fundamental to us that we use it to qualify the various wishes we address to others and ourselves in special moments of life. Thus, happy birthday, happy married life and happy

anniversary. Therefore, in this sense, it becomes also a prayer of blessing.

The Gospel today is on the Beatitudes, which are expressions of various happiness we experience in following the Gospel. They are not wishes of future happiness but the concrete existence of happiness in those who are reborn by personal encounter with Jesus. Being blessed is rather a foretaste of the eternal happiness, as well as an expression of our belonging and participation already here on earth in the kingdom of God.

There is a striking difference between the Ten Commandments in the OT and the Beatitudes communicated by Jesus to new people of God in NT. While Ten Commandments were given to by God through Moses in the form of external law, the beatitudes were given to us by Jesus' concrete life experiences. His 'words and actions' taught us how to be happy. St. Matthew, the Evangelist's choice of words here 'he began to teach them', is not casual nor coincidence but a declaration of God walking along with humanity through his Son Jesus, for the purpose of teaching us how to live happily. So, the beatitudes seen as a programmatic expression of Christian discipleship, is an embodiment of what Jesus said and did all through his life on earth. It is in this sense that it is a concrete guide for all of us who are the disciples of Jesus.

Let us be aware of the fact that the happiness the beatitude invites us to, is not same as that which the spirit of the world offers us. Let us therefore, with faith and open heart, ask the Holy Spirit to illumine us to choose only the true happiness, and not fall into the temptations of the many illusions and parodies of happiness of the world.




