# Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

### From the Desk of the Parochial Vicar



#### The Lord who Calms Our Fears

A man returned home and found his house on fire. He screamed for help because his son was right inside the burning house, but there was nobody to help. Suddenly he heard a wail, it was his boy at his bedroom

window, crying and rubbing his eyes. Knowing the danger of entering the house, the father called, "Jump, Son! I will catch you!". Between sobs, the boy responded to the voice he knew so well. "But I can't see you, Daddy!" The father answered with great assurance. "No, Son, you can't see me, but I can see you! Jump!" At that, the boy jumped into the smoky darkness, and found himself safely cradled in his father's arms. This story points to theme of my reflection drawn from the gospel reading of today, the 19th Sunday in ordinary time.

Isn't it surprising that the disciples of Jesus who have been with him failed to recognize him as he came to them in the middle of the night walking on the sea? It was not the darkness of the night that made it difficult for them to recognize Jesus. It was not also because Jesus did something extraordinary, like walking on the sea, that made them mistook him for a ghost. The cause of this mistaken identity was that the disciples were beclouded by fear. Before Jesus appeared, they were already battling with a near death experience as the wind threatened to capsize their boat. So, the sudden appearance of Jesus in a strange manner compounded their fear. Fear was the reason Peter could not continue his walk on the sea, despite the invitation of Jesus. Peter walked on the sea as he set his gaze on Jesus but began to sink when he turned his gaze towards the wind. Fear is quicksand. It brings doubt, which is detrimental to faith. It quickly swallows anyone, and introduces a sense evil, mistrust, doubt even in noblest actions and events.

We are not impervious to stormy and fearful moments in our lives. It could be marriage storms, business storms, health storms, academic storms, opposition storms, and other storms of life that will shake our faith. In moments like this let us fix our eyes on the Lord in prayer and trust. The presence of Jesus makes these troubles and challenges very easy to overcome. Our problem is that often we focus on the weight of our crises and allow it to completely overwhelm us that we fail to see God who still is in-charge even during our crises. And this is why we hear people ask where God was when this and that happened to them.

If only we can be calm a bit and listen, we will see clearly and hear that still voice of God that will calm our troubled soul. It is true that some crises in life can so shatter us that it becomes difficult to gather ourselves together. But a little bit of calmness and listening can answer the innumerable questions we asked when encapsulated by the world's crisis and fear. Jesus must be our focus, especially in trying times. If we depend on him, he will carry us through.
