From the Desk of the Parochial Vicar



Gaining Back Others in Love

Some people fear divulging the good things that happen in their lives because of the fear that enemies are everywhere. For such people, it's better not to announce any good fortune to the public otherwise they may not live to enjoy them. But the moment

they feel hurt and angry, they tell everyone how cruel that brother, sister, family member, co-worker, Church and government acted towards them, without, first, reaching out to the offender. How good would your story be to the offenders if they are not aware of the gravity of their wrongdoing towards you? Jesus calls on us today, the 23rd Sunday in ordinary time, to desist from such attitude.

Jesus asks us in the gospel to go to our offender instead and tell him or her our hurts and disappointment with the sole aim of reconciliation and gaining him or her back in love. This is the beginning of healing and peace process. If this does not work, Jesus commands us to take extra steps by involving two or three persons, and the Church before we take them as one who needs our prayers and support instead of our criticism and condemnation; in imitation of Jesus who does not condemn the pagans and sinners but continues to find new opportunities to win them over to the right path (Jn. 8:1-11).

The reason Jesus wants us to go this far in the path of reconciliation is because gaining a brother or a sister through reconciliatory discussion is better than coercing him or her to accept his or her wrongs or beating him in a law court. But it demands courage and patience especially when the person has truly offended us. It requires an internalization of Christ's spirit of forgiveness, who, while hanging on the cross, forgave and prayed for those who crucified him (Luke 23:34).

Jesus knows that people tend to respond positively when their wrongdoings are brought to their notice in a fraternal manner and in private. Why not follow his words when you encounter problems and misunderstanding in your relationship with another person? We are created for one another; and so, we should seek each other's good. The psalmist extols the beauty of fraternal life when he says, "how good and delightful it is to live together as brothers" (Ps. 133:1). To achieve this, St. Paul tells to owe nothing to anyone except the debt of love. Love searches for the other and keeps no record of offense (1 Cor. 13:5). Recall God's question to Cain: "Where is your brother, Abel?". Cain, not realizing that God had appointed him a watchman over his brother, as read in the first reading, replied: "I do not know; am I my brother's keeper?" (Gen 4:9). Yes, we are our brothers' and sisters' keepers, and let this question: where is your sibling, mother, father, wife, husband, child(ren), parishioner, co-worker, friend and others, especially those who offend us, re-echo in our hearts. The response to today's responsorial psalm urges us thus: "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts". So, reach out!
