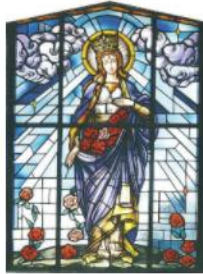

From the Desk of the Parochial Vicar



Significance of Some Liturgical Postures and Gestures

There are different postures and gestures that occur during liturgical celebrations. While some are particular to the principal celebrants, the priests, the deacons, the altar servers, the congregation, and other ministers; there are some that are commonly observed by all. I will briefly explain a few of them.

The sign of the cross is the basic Christian gesture of prayer. It is the gesture with which the Mass and many other liturgical celebrations begin and end. It symbolically reaffirms faith in the Holy Trinity, the Father, the Son, and Holy Spirit. The sign of the cross is also a public testimony of our belief that Jesus secured our salvation through the cross, and that through this sign we shall be victorious. It is also a visible and efficacious sign of sanctification of oneself and one's daily activities. We also make the sign of the cross in moments of temptation and danger, to be strengthened and protected by God.

Standing is a natural expression of respect and reverence. When it is observed in liturgical celebration, then the respect and reverence is addressed to God. In the Old Testament, Moses stood before the glory of God while he listened to him. The Israelites stood at the entrance of their tents each time Moses went up to the Tent (cf. Ex. 33:8-10). Elijah stood before the Lord each time he sensed the presence of God (I Kg. 19:11,13). Standing is also used for the exercise of the priesthood as seen in the story of Zachariah, the father of John the Baptist (cf. Lk. 1:11).

Sitting is a normal posture for a religious teacher (Jesus sat while teaching the beatitudes and while teaching in the temple, cf. Mt. 5:3 and Jn. 8:2), and of a judge (cf. Mt. 25:31, Rev. 20:4). Also, the child Jesus was found in the temple seated among the teachers as he listened and asked them questions (Lk. 2:46); and that's part of the reason the congregations sit during the readings (except the gospel) and homily at Mass. Sitting has an eschatological meaning which refers to the rest the people of God anticipate after the toils of this world.

Kneeling has become a posture proper to prayer. Jesus knelt in his Gethsemane prayer (Lk. 22:41), the deacon Stephen also knelt to pray before his execution (cf. Acts 7:60). Kneeling is also a posture that reflects humility, sorrow, and penance. Understanding the significance of these postures and gestures and devoutly engaging in them, to the extent we are not genuinely inhibited, helps in active participation at liturgical celebrations.

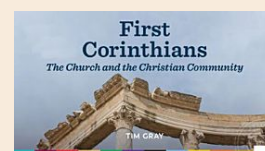

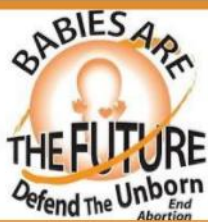
