

FAMILY CONNECTION: THE SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

The mystery of the Trinity can be difficult for us to grasp. Today's Gospel invites us to consider how the three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—work together so that God's salvation is made known to us. Jesus' mission is continued through the activity of the Holy Spirit in the lives of his disciples. We have received this same Spirit through our Baptisms. The Spirit, living and working within us, reveals the mystery of God's love for us. Just as the first disciples were not left orphaned, we are not orphaned;

we remain in God's embrace through the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Gather your family and invite each family member to say what he or she knows about the Holy Spirit. Read aloud today's Gospel, John 14:15-21. What does Jesus say the Holy Spirit will do for the disciples? Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, we come to share in the love of God made known to us in Jesus. Pray together, thanking God for this gift of the Holy Spirit by praying the Prayer to the Holy Spirit.

The language of prayer is mystery, the mystery of the encounter between the human soul and its Creator, the invisible God. Indeed, we scarcely need St. Paul to remind us that "we do not know how to pray as we ought" (Romans 8:26). So many of the circumstances of our lives can defy our poor power to respond in prayer. How do we sing of God's goodness? How do we lament our deepest sorrows? How do we extoll God's glory? What is the language that can express our love of God and our reception of God's love for us?

The Holy Spirit can speak for us through the Scriptures. The Word of God is alive, because it was written under the inspiration of the Spirit. When we take those words upon our own lips, the Spirit speaks anew through us. Many traditional hymns and contemporary worship songs take their lyrics directly from the Scriptures too. Whether we speak or sing biblical texts, we can offer back to the Father, by the Spirit, God's own perfect words.

Sometimes our prayer is beyond being captured by any words. This is when the prayer of our hearts can be made by the Spirit in language beyond our understanding, "with sighs too deep for words" (Romans 8:26). Try the following exercise that can help us to trust the Holy Spirit to pray in and through us.

Prayer Exercise

Come into a space of quiet. Become present to our ever-present God. Invite God to be with you.

Become aware of your breath. The very act of breathing is an expression of the presence of God, who sustains our lives in this moment and every moment. Remember, in Hebrew, Spirit and breath are the same word, ruah.

At our Baptism and Confirmation, God sends his Spirit to reside in us. As you sit in the quiet, notice how you experience the Spirit residing in you. Where in your body do you come to know the active presence of God? In your heart? Your mind? Your gut? Be aware of this truth: God lives in you by the Spirit, here, now.

Continue for as long as you feel called to be in the stillness, aware that God is with you. What might the Spirit be praying in and through you? Set words completely aside. Listen.

SAINT OF THE WEEK: RITA OF CASCIA

Born at Roccaporena in central Italy, Rita wanted to become a nun but was pressured into marrying a harsh and cruel man. During her 18-year marriage, she had two sons. After her husband was killed and her sons had died, Rita tried to join the Augustinian nuns in Cascia. Unsuccessful at first because she was a widow, Rita eventually succeeded.

Over the years, her austerity, prayerfulness, and charity became legendary. When she developed wounds on her forehead, people quickly associated them with the wounds from Christ's crown of thorns. She meditated frequently on Christ's passion. Her care for the sick nuns was especially loving. She also counseled lay people who came to her monastery.

Beatified in 1626, Rita was not canonized until 1900. She has acquired the reputation, together with Saint Jude, as a saint of impossible cases.



Solemnity of the Ascension of Our Lord

Sunday, May 28

The Solemnity of the Ascension of Our Lord is a Holy day of Obligation observed on the Thursday of the sixth week of Easter. The National Conference of Catholic Bishops of the United States decrees that the Ecclesiastical Provinces of the United States may transfer the Solemnity of the Ascension from Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter to the Seventh Sunday of Easter should the Bishops of Dioceses within those provinces agree to do so.

The Diocese of Austin participates in the abrogation of the Solemnity of the Ascension of Our Lord and so the Holy Day will be observed next Sunday at all parishes within the diocese. In the Diocese of Austin There is no obligation to attend mass in order to observe this solemnity on Thursday, May 25.



Gospel Meditation: The Sixth Sunday of Easter

Jesus' actions and words are in total harmony with his relationship to God, his Father. Jesus asks us to have the same relationship. Through our initiation, we have been united with Jesus who is one with the Father. Saying "Amen" at communion is an acknowledgement that the consecrated host is the Body of Christ, and a commitment to be the Body of Christ for others. St. Augustine said, "Be a member of Christ so that your 'Amen' may be true." Do we love Christ? Do our actions express this love? Do we reveal through our words and action our unity with Christ? How true is our "Amen?"

What is TEC?


