



SUNDAY CONNECTION: AS ONE HAVING AUTHORITY

In the synagogue in Capernaum those attending that day “were astounded at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority.” There was real power in the way that Jesus read and commented on the sacred text. The Word of God in the scroll came alive in a way that they had never experienced before. Then suddenly that awful cry, a voice from beyond this world challenges Jesus as the Rabbi that day. The voice of that unclean spirit tries to control Jesus by using his name and fails. Jesus silences the outcry and calm is restored.


The name of Jesus is powerful. The demon thought it could control Jesus by the use of his name. St. Paul knew better. He writes in Philippians 2:9-11 that God, “bestowed on him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.”

That unclean spirit did bend to Jesus. It cried out and left the man healed before them all. A moment of silent amazement must have followed. Close your eyes and take a moment to imagine yourself in that synagogue that day. We still call on the name of Jesus. When

we do we tap into the power that created the universe. Jesus was in control that day and he is in control now. Call on the name of Jesus and know his saving love.

ORATIO

Verses in Psalm 119 capture the power of the Word of God. We can use them in our prayer response to this Gospel passage. “How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth! Through your precepts I get understanding; therefore I hate every false way. Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path” (Psalm 119:103–105 NRSV).



ESTE DOMINGO: CON PLENA AUTORIDAD

En la sinagoga en Cafarnaúm la gente que asistía ese día «se admiraba de cómo enseñaba, porque lo hacía con plena autoridad» (Marcos 1:22). Había un poder real en la forma en que Jesús leía y comentaba sobre el texto sagrado. La Palabra de Dios en el rollo cobró vida de una manera que nunca antes hubiera experimentado. Pero, de pronto, un grito horrible, una voz más allá de este mundo desafía a Jesús como Maestro ese día. La voz del espíritu impuro busca controlar a Jesús usando su nombre y fracasa. Jesús silencia la protesta y restaura la calma.

El nombre de Jesús es poderoso. El demonio pensaba que podría controlar a Jesús por el uso de su nombre. San Pablo lo sabe muy bien. Él escribe en Filipenses 2:9–11 que Dios, «le dio el más alto honor y el más excelente de todos los nombres, para que, ante ese nombre concedido a Jesús, doblen todos las rodillas en el cielo, en la tierra y debajo de la tierra, y todos reconozcan que Jesucristo es Señor, para gloria de Dios Padre».

Ese espíritu impuro sí dobló la rodilla ante

Jesús. Gritó y dejó al hombre sanado ante toda la gente. Un momento de asombro silencioso debe haber seguido. Cierra los ojos y toma un momento para imaginarte en la sinagoga ese día.

Todavía invocamos el nombre de Jesús. Cuando lo hacemos aprovechamos el poder que creó todo el universo. Jesús tenía el control ese día y ahora él tiene el control. Invoca el nombre de Jesús y conoce su amor que salva.

ORACIÓN

Los versículos del Salmo 119 captan el poder de la Palabra de Dios. Podemos usarlos en nuestro responso de oración después de meditar sobre este pasaje del Evangelio. «Tu promesa es más dulce a mi paladar que la miel a mi boca. De tus preceptos he sacado entendimiento; por eso odio toda conducta falsa. Tu palabra es una lámpara a mis pies y una luz en mi camino» (Salmos 119:103–105).



Called to Protect for Children is a sexual abuse education and prevention program that gives our youngest children practical tools, using simple activities, to help them understand a fundamental teaching of our faith: that every human being is created in the image and likeness of God and that this sacredness should be treated with respect. CTPC is developmentally appropriate and sequential for each age group K-5th. The program instructors are the teachers/catechists the students already know. Information about Called to Protect for Children may be found at the Diocese of Austin website or at the RE office. Parishes in the Diocese of Austin are required to present Called to Protect for Children annually for our K-5th students. SAINT OF THE WEEK: JOHN BOSCO (JANUARY 31)

John Bosco's theory of education could well be used in today's schools. It was a preventive system, rejecting corporal punishment and placing students in surroundings removed from the likelihood of committing sin. He advocated frequent reception of the sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion. He combined catechetical training and fatherly guidance, seeking to unite the spiritual life with one's work, study and play.

Encouraged during his youth to become a priest so he could work with young boys, John was ordained in 1841. His service to young people started when he met a poor orphan and instructed him in preparation for receiving Holy Communion. He then gathered young apprentices and taught them catechism.


After serving as chaplain in a hospice for working girls, John opened the Oratory of St. Francis de

Sales for boys. Several wealthy and powerful patrons contributed money, enabling him to provide two workshops for the boys, shoemaking and tailoring.

By 1856, the institution had grown to 150 boys and had added a printing press for publication of religious and catechetical pamphlets. His interest in vocational education and publishing justify him as patron of young apprentices and Catholic publishers.

John's preaching fame spread and by 1850 he had trained his own helpers because of difficulties in retaining young priests. In 1854, he and his followers informally banded together, inspired by Saint Francis de Sales.

With Pope Pius IX's encouragement, John gathered 17 men and founded the Salesians in 1859. Their activity concentrated on education and mission work. Later, he organized a group of Salesian Sisters to assist girls.


