SUNDAY CONNECTION: WHAT'S IN A NAME?

MEDITATIO

“All who heard these things took them to heart, saying, ‘What, then, will this child be?’”

In the Gospel of Luke both the neighbors and relatives in our reading and Mary the mother of Jesus “take things to heart.” What does that mean? In the biblical world you do not process thought in your mind (as we do in our Western world) but rather the heart. The heart is the emotionally-infused center of thought, prayer, and applied consideration. You meditate in your heart.

The villagers are intimately involved in the birth, circumcision, and naming of the son born to old Elizabeth and Zechariah. They have witnessed the miracle of the pregnancy, the birth, and now the public celebration making the child a member of the Jewish faith community through the ritual of circumcision. These men and women sense something special about this child given the unusual circumstances surrounding his conception and birth. He is a child of grace and a gift from God. They cannot know what all of this will mean, but they do know that the child

is destined for great things in the service of the Lord.

Can you recall a time when you wondered what a child would become? With five young grandchildren, I am now revisiting these times of wonder all over again. I had an active hand in the formation of our five children but now I have to stand by and watch as my grown children, as parents, follow the Lord as they raise our grandchildren in our midst. What, then, will this child be? It is the perfect question for our meditation this week.

ORATIO

When Zechariah names his son with the name revealed by the angel Gabriel, his tongue is loosed and he begins to speak of the blessings of God. We can share in this blessing of the Lord in our prayer this week gleaned from the opening lines of Zechariah’s inspired prayer in Luke 1:67–79. “Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel, for he has visited and brought redemption to his people” (Luke 1:68).

ESTE DOMINGO: ¿QUÉ HAY EN UN NOMBRE?

MEDITACIÓN

Todos los que lo oían se preguntaban a sí mismos: «¿Qué llegará a ser este niño?» (Lucas 1:66).

En esta lectura del Evangelio de Lucas, tanto los vecinos como los parientes, y María, la madre de Jesús, en varias ocasiones, «se preguntaban a sí mismos» (o, «guardaban [esas cosas] en su corazón»). ¿Qué quiere decir esto? En el mundo bíblico no procesas los pensamientos por medio de la mente (como lo hacemos en el mundo occidental) sino por medio del corazón. El corazón es el centro emocionalmente infundido de los pensamientos, la oración y la consideración aplicada. Medita en tu corazón.

Los aldeanos están involucrados íntimamente con el nacimiento, la circuncisión y el nombramiento del hijo nacido a los ancianos Isabel y Zacarías. Han sido testigos del milagro del embarazo, el nacimiento, y ahora de la celebración pública de hacer al niño un miembro de la comunidad de fe judía por medio del rito de la circuncisión. Estos hombres y mujeres sienten algo especial en cuanto a este niño tomando en consideración las circunstancias poco usuales sobre

su concepción y nacimiento. Él es un niño de gracia y un regalo de Dios. No pueden saber lo que todo esto va a significar, pero sí saben que este niño está destinado para grandes cosas en el servicio del Señor. ¿Recuerdas alguna vez cuando te preguntaras en cuanto al futuro de un niño? Con cinco tiernos nietos, me encuentro nuevamente en estos tiempos de maravilla. Tuve una participación en la formación de nuestros cinco hijos, pero ahora tengo que esperar y mirar, mientras que mis hijos adultos, como padres, siguen al Señor y crían a nuestros nietos en nuestro medio. ¿Qué, entonces, llegará a ser este niño? Es la pregunta perfecta para nuestra meditación esta semana.

ORACIÓN

Cuando Zacarías le pone a su hijo el nombre revelado por el ángel Gabriel, vuelve a hablar y comienza a alabar a Dios por sus bendiciones. Podemos compartir esta bendición del Señor en nuestra oración esta semana, tomada de las primeras líneas de la oración inspirada de Zacarías en Lucas 1:67–79. «¡Bendito sea el Señor, Dios de Israel, porque ha venido a rescatar a su pueblo!» (Lucas 1:68).

SAINT OF THE WEEK: CYRIL OF ALEXANDRIA

Saints are not born with halos around their heads. Cyril, recognized as a great teacher of the Church, began his career as archbishop of Alexandria, Egypt, with impulsive, often violent, actions. He pillaged and closed the churches of the Novatian heretics—who required those who denied the faith to be re-baptized—participated in the deposing of Saint John Chrysostom, and confiscated Jewish property, expelling the Jews from Alexandria in retaliation for their attacks on Christians.


Cyril’s importance for theology and Church history lies in his championing the cause of orthodoxy against the heresy of Nestorius, who taught that in Christ there were two persons, one human and one divine.

The controversy centered around the two natures in Christ. Nestorius would not agree to the title “God-bearer” for Mary. He preferred “Christ-bearer,” saying there are two distinct persons in Christ—divine and human—joined only by a moral union. He said Mary was not the

mother of God but only of the man Christ, whose humanity was only a temple of God. Nestorianism implied that the humanity of Christ was a mere disguise.

Presiding as the pope’s representative at the Council of Ephesus in 431, Cyril condemned Nestorianism and proclaimed Mary truly the “God-bearer”—the mother of the one Person who is truly God and truly human. In the confusion that followed, Cyril was deposed and imprisoned for three months, after which he was welcomed back to Alexandria.

Besides needing to soften some of his opposition to those who had sided with Nestorius, Cyril had difficulties with some of his own allies, who thought he had gone too far, sacrificing not only language but orthodoxy. Until his death, his policy of moderation kept his extreme partisans under control. On his deathbed, despite pressure, he refused to condemn the teacher of Nestorius.


