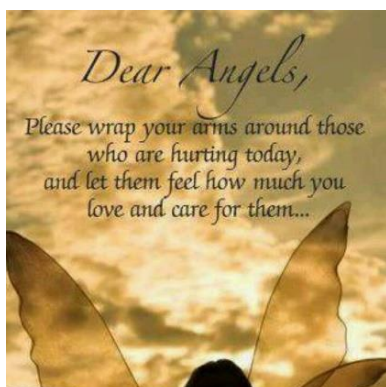

Be generous and God will bless you.

She, from her poverty, has contributed all she had. (Mark 12:44)

What was it about this widow that drew Jesus' attention and delighted him so much? Many others had given far more to the Temple treasury than she had. No, it wasn't the size of her gift that touched him so deeply. It was her willingness to give all.

You can see a similar mindset in the widow in today's first reading. She used the last of her provisions to feed the prophet Elijah. Notice how God blessed her generosity and provided for her—and Elijah—through the famine.

The willingness of these two widows to offer their meager gifts was pleasing to the Lord. That's because sacrificial giving reflects the character of God himself. Just think of the way Jesus held nothing back when he gave himself to us. He gave every drop of blood, every ounce of mercy and love.

Does this mean that God expects us to empty our bank accounts or our pantries? Not necessarily. But he does want

us to pour out our hearts. Whether we are giving financially or sacrificing our time or attention, he wants to see us become as generous as he is.

There are times when, like the widows in today's readings, you might feel as if you don't have much left. Beyond the financial, you might be "scraping the bottom of the barrel" of your patience or your sympathy or your forbearance.

But know that when you ask God for the grace and strength to give from what little you have, he will bless you. He might give you what you lack, or he might give you the strength to spend yourself a little more. Even when it seems like a drop in the bucket, your decision to give pleases the Lord. That's because each time you choose to give of yourself, you become more like him. He is building his own character in you!

"Lord, help me give of myself as generously as you did."

Jesus, you are the Bread of Life, the food that nourishes, the presence that comforts, the truth that lights the way. Stay with us; live in us. Amen.



Ella, desde su pobreza, ha aportado todo lo que tenía. (Marcos 12:44)

¿Qué fue lo que atrajo la atención de Jesús y lo deleitó tanto de esta viuda? Muchos otros habían dado mucho más al tesoro del Templo que ella. No, no fue el tamaño de su regalo lo que lo conmovió tan profundamente. Era su voluntad de darlo todo.

Puedes ver una mentalidad similar en la viuda en la primera lectura de hoy. Ella usó la última de sus provisiones para alimentar al profeta Elías. Observe cómo Dios bendijo su generosidad y proveyó para ella, y para Elías, a través de la hambruna.

La disposición de estas dos viudas de ofrecer sus escasos dones fue agradable al Señor. Esto se debe a que el dar con sacrificio refleja el carácter de Dios mismo. Solo piense en la forma en que Jesús no retuvo nada cuando se entregó a nosotros. Él dio cada gota de sangre, cada onza de misericordia y amor.

¿Significa esto que Dios espera que vaciemos nuestras cuentas bancarias o nuestras despensas? No necesariamente. Pero si quiere que derramemos nuestros corazones. Ya sea que estemos dando financieramente o sacrificando nuestro tiempo o atención, él quiere vernos ser tan generosos como él.

Hay momentos en los que, como las viudas en las lecturas de hoy, puedes sentir que no te queda mucho. Más allá de lo financiero, es posible que estés "raspando el fondo del barril" de tu paciencia o tu simpatía o tu tolerancia.

Pero sepan que cuando le pidan a Dios la gracia y la fuerza para dar de lo poco que tienen, Él los bendecirá. Él podría darte lo que te falta, o podría darte la fuerza para gastarte un poco más. Incluso cuando parece una gota en el cubo, tu decisión de dar agrada al Señor. Esto se debe a que cada vez que eliges dar de ti mismo, te vuelves más como él. ¡Él está construyendo su propio carácter en ti!

Jesús, tú eres el Pan de Vida, el alimento que nutre, la presencia que consuela, la verdad que ilumina el camino. Quédate con nosotros; vive en nosotros. Amén.

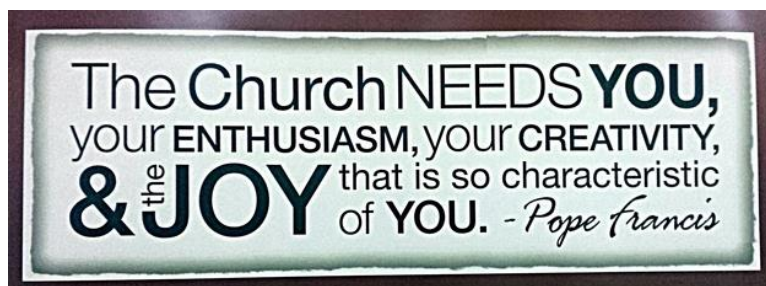
