

Mass Preparation

January 23, 2022, Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Nehemiah 8:2-4a,5-6,8-10

Ezra reads from the book of the Law and interprets it for all to understand.

Psalm 19:8-10,15

A song in praise of the Law of the Lord.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:12-30

Paul explains that all were baptized into the one body of Christ.

Gospel Reading: Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21

In the synagogue at Nazareth, Jesus reads aloud from the scroll of the prophet Isaiah and announces that this Scripture is now fulfilled.



Jesus will be with us always

Jesus . . . revealed his glory. (John 2:11)

Why was Mary so insistent that Jesus do something about the shortage of wine at the wedding at Cana? Perhaps she was a close friend of the bridegroom's family. If that was the case, of course she would have cared that they not be embarrassed about the wine running out.

In this very personal, familial setting, Jesus performs his first sign by turning water into the finest wine. But the miracle didn't just save face for the parents of the bridegroom. Jesus was revealing his glory. He was showing his disciples that he was no ordinary rabbi. He had come as the promised Messiah, to be the "new wine" that would save the world (Matthew 9:17; see Isaiah 25:6).

From the personal to the prophetic. From the specific circumstance to the universal truth. So often this is how Jesus works. Just look at some of the "signs" in John's Gospel. He takes five loaves and two fish and feeds five

thousand, revealing how he intends to feed and nourish us for all time in the Eucharist (6:5-14). Lazarus dies, but Jesus raises him, showing us that he came to defeat death once and for all (11:1-45).

Isn't this the case for all of us? We ask Jesus to come into a specific situation, as Mary did at the wedding at Cana. And when we see him acting—whether that's through answering our prayer or reassuring us of his presence—he reveals something about himself. That he loves us. That he cares for us. That he has come to save us. That he will be with us always.

Is there some situation in your life that you want the Lord to enter into? As you pray, remember that he wants to do more than just resolve the immediate problem you are facing. He wants you to know who he is and why he came. He wants to reveal his glory to you.

"Jesus, open my eyes to your glory in my life!"

God of miracles and wonders, open our minds to your word, to your presence, to your truth. Clear away the clouds of confusion so that we may focus fully on you.

¿Por qué María insistió tanto en que Jesús hiciera algo sobre la escasez de vino en las bodas de Caná? Tal vez ella era una amiga cercana de la familia del novio. Si ese fuera el caso, por supuesto que le habría importado que no se avergonzaran de que el vino se agotara.

En este entorno muy personal y familiar, Jesús realiza su primera señal convirtiendo el agua en el mejor vino. Pero el milagro no solo salvó la cara a los padres del novio. Jesús estaba revelando su gloria. Estaba mostrando a sus discípulos que no era un rabino ordinario. Él había venido como el Mesías prometido, para ser el "vino nuevo" que salvaría al mundo (Mateo 9:17; véase Isaías 25:6).

De lo personal a lo profético. De la circunstancia específica a la verdad universal. Muy a menudo así es como Jesús trabaja. Basta con mirar algunas de las "señales" en el Evangelio de Juan. Toma cinco panes y dos peces y alimenta a cinco mil, revelando cómo pretende alimentarnos y nutrirnos para siempre en la Eucaristía (6:5-14). Lázaro muere, pero Jesús lo resucita, mostrándonos que vino a derrotar a la muerte de una vez por todas. (11:1-45).

¿No es este el caso para todos nosotros? Le pedimos a Jesús que entre en una situación específica, como lo hizo María en las bodas de Caná. Y cuando lo vemos actuar, ya sea respondiendo a nuestra oración o asegurándonos de su presencia, revela algo sobre sí mismo. Que nos ama. Que se preocupa por nosotros. Que ha venido a salvarnos. Que estará con nosotros siempre.

¿Hay alguna situación en tu vida en la que quieras que el Señor entre? Mientras oras, recuerda que él quiere hacer algo más que resolver el problema inmediato que estás enfrentando. Él quiere que sepas quién es él y por qué vino. Él quiere revelarte su gloria.

"¡Jesús, abre mis ojos a tu gloria en mi vida!"

Dios de milagros y maravillas, abre nuestras mentes a tu palabra, a tu presencia, a tu verdad. Despeja las nubes de confusión para que podamos centrarnos plenamente en ti.




