

First Reading: Exodus 32:7-11,13-14

Moses stands up to God, recalling all of God's great promises.

We are all works in progress.

Which of you wishing to construct a tower does not first sit down and calculate the cost? (Luke 14:28)

Have you heard of the National Monument of Scotland? If not, that's not surprising. It was never finished. Planned as a replica of the Parthenon in Athens, the project ran out of funds shortly after its six-ton foundation stone was laid. It's now known as "Edinburgh's Disgrace." Its unfinished pillars stand as a sobering tribute to poor planning.

That sounds a lot like the builders Jesus describes in today's Gospel. Who would build a tower without first calculating the money needed to complete it? Jesus asks. It seems obvious. But Jesus wasn't talking only about the cost of construction. He was talking about the cost of discipleship.

Jesus wanted the people to understand what following him would mean. Becoming his disciple would change how they prayed, where they lived, and what their future held. Following Jesus would require them to take up their cross,


and he wanted them to choose it with eyes wide-open. Jesus loved them. He didn't want them to end up like those Edinburgh builders, unable to finish what they had started.

In some ways, we're all a bit like that unfinished monument: works in progress. But the good news is that we *can* finish. We just need to keep on choosing to follow Jesus. Jesus tells us that our journey will require more than our own natural resources—not to discourage us, but to point us to God, the finisher of our faith (Hebrews 12:2).

Jesus says, "Come, follow me." He knows the challenges you will face, and he doesn't want you to give up when you realize it costs you more than you expected. He has all the grace you need to resist temptation. His love will strengthen you on your path toward heaven. And he has deep pockets, overflowing with mercy, to help you choose him day after day.

"Lord, I need the riches of your grace today!"

Jesus, you said that you are the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Help us to know the way to you and to be the way for others. Amen.



¿ Quien de ustedes que desea construir una torre no se sienta primero y calcula el costo? (Lucas 14:28)

¿Has oído hablar del Monumento Nacional de Escocia? Si no, eso no es sorprendente. Nunca se terminó. Fue planeado como una réplica del Partenón en Atenas, el proyecto se quedó sin fondos poco después de que se colocara su primera piedra de seis toneladas. Ahora se conoce como "La desgracia de Edimburgo." Sus pilares no terminados se erigen como un soberano tributo a una mala planificación.

Eso suena muy parecido a los constructores que Jesús describe en el Evangelio de hoy. ¿Quién construiría una torre sin calcular primero el dinero necesario para completarla? Jesús pregunta. Parece obvio. Pero Jesús no estaba hablando sólo del costo de la construcción. Él estaba hablando sobre el costo del discipulado.

Jesús quería que la gente entendiera lo que significaría seguirlo. Convertirse en su discípulo cambiaría la forma en que oraban, dónde vivían y lo que les deparaba el futuro. Seguir a Jesús requeriría que tomaran su cruz, y él quería

que la eligieran con los ojos bien abiertos. Jesús los amaba. No quería que terminaran como esos constructores de Edimburgo, incapaces de terminar lo que habían comenzado.

De alguna manera, todos somos un poco como ese monumento no terminado: obras en progreso. Pero la buena noticia es que podemos terminar. Sólo tenemos que mantenernos seguir eligiendolo. Jesús nos dice que nuestro viaje requerirá más que nuestros propios recursos naturales, no para desanimarnos, sino para señalarnos a Dios, el consumador de nuestra fe (Hebreos 12:2).

Jesús dice: "Ven, sígueme." Él conoce los desafios que enfrentarás, y no quiere que te rindas cuando te des cuenta de que te costara más de lo que esperabas. Él tiene toda la gracia que necesitas para resistir la tentación. Su amor te fortalecerá en tu camino hacia el cielo. Y tiene bolsillos profundos, rebosantes de misericordia, para ayudarte a elegirlo día tras día.

"¡Señor,hoy necesito las riquezas de tu gracia!!"

Jesús, dijiste que tú eres el Camino, la Verdad y la Vida. Ayúdanos a conocer el camino hacia ti y a ser el camino para los demás. Amén.

Those who are due for the 3-year update may compete the training by logging into their existing account to access the on-line training (available for only a limited time).




