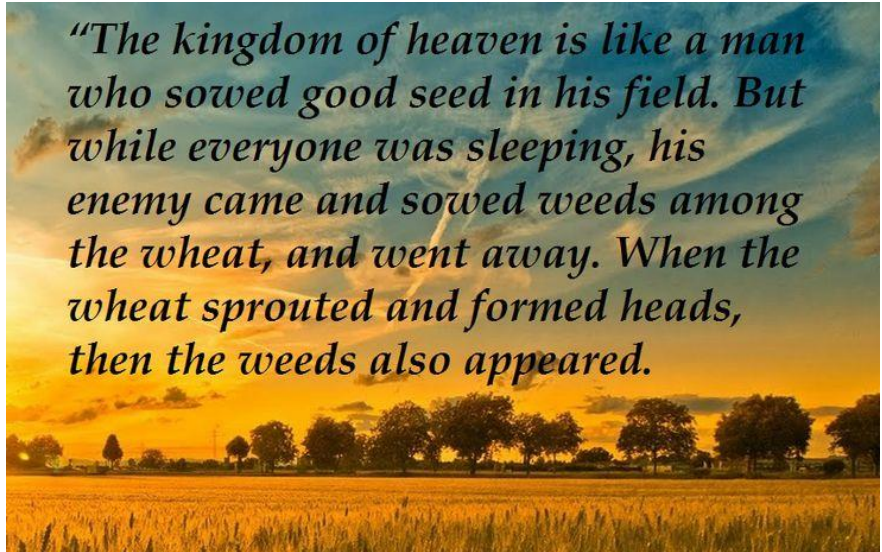

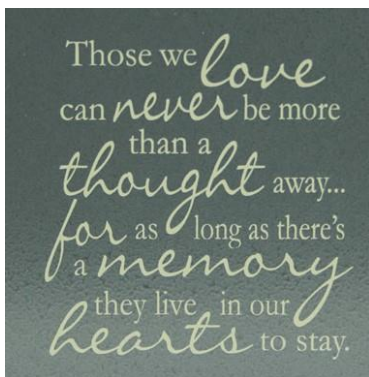

Mass Preparation
July 30th, Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: 1 Kings 3:5,7-12
Solomon pleases God when he asks for a wise and understanding heart to better govern the people.

Psalm: 119:57,72,76-77,127-130
The law of the Lord is more precious than silver and gold.

Second Reading: Romans 8:28-30
God chose us to be conformed to the image of his Son.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 13:44-52
Jesus teaches about the Kingdom of Heaven.

Whoever has ears ought to hear. (Matthew 13:43)

Does Jesus' explanation of today's parable make you uncomfortable? Especially his image of God sending his angels to toss the "children of the evil one" into a "fiery furnace" (Matthew 13:38, 42)? If a loving human father would never treat his children that way, how could God, our heavenly Father, do such a thing?

If you find this story troubling, it might help to know you're in good company. Even the ancient Fathers of the Church were divided on how to interpret it. In the third century, Origen of Alexandria taught that these "children of the evil one" were not individual people (Matthew 13:38). Rather, they were the "evil opinions" that the devil sows in our souls (Commentary on Matthew, 10.2). He said that God wants to burn these sinful thoughts and attitudes out of all people so that they can enter eternal life.

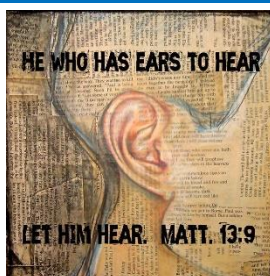
On the other hand, St. John Chrysostom, writing about a

hundred years later, said that the "children of the evil one" were indeed sinners. These, Chrysostom said, would be "given over to punishment," and a "severe" punishment at that. Meanwhile, the righteous would "depart into the kingdom of heaven" (On Matthew, Homily 47).

You may favor Origen's view or Chrysostom's, but both men make one thing clear: sin is serious. It burdens us. It darkens our minds and poisons our hearts. It keeps us from loving each other and receiving God's love. But they both also taught that Jesus offers us the only way to escape its grasp: his cross and resurrection.

Jesus ended his parable with a warning: "Whoever has ears ought to hear" (Matthew 13:43). Let's do just that. Let's take his words to heart. Let's believe that his grace is powerful enough to save us from sin. Let's trust that he can make us "shine like the sun" (13:43).

"Jesus, give me ears to hear you as you call me out of sin and into your kingdom."



Quien tiene oídos, que oiga. (Mateo 13:43)

¿La explicación de Jesús de la parábola de hoy te hace sentir incómodo? ¿Especialmente su imagen de Dios enviando a sus ángeles para arrojar a los "hijos del maligno" a un "horno ardiente" (Mateo 13:38, 42)? Si un padre humano amoroso nunca trataría a sus hijos de esa manera, ¿cómo podría Dios, nuestro Padre celestial, hacer tal cosa?

Si encuentras esta historia alarmante, podría ser útil saber que estás en buena compañía. Incluso los antiguos Padres de la Iglesia estaban divididos sobre cómo interpretarla. En el siglo III, En los Orígenes de Alejandría, aprendemos que estos "hijos del maligno" no eran personas individuales (Mateo 13:38). Más bien, eran las "malas opiniones" que el diablo siembra en nuestras almas (Comentario sobre Mateo, 10.2). Dijo que Dios quiere quemar estos pensamientos y actitudes pecaminosas de todas las personas para que puedan entrar en la vida eterna.

Por otro lado, San Juan Crisóstomo, escribiendo unos cien años después, dijo que los "hijos del maligno" eran realmente

pecadores. Estos, dijo Crisóstomo, serían "entregados al castigo", y un castigo "severo" por eso. Mientras tanto, los justos "partirían al reino de los cielos" (Sobre Mateo, Homilía 47).

Usted puede favorecer el punto de vista de Orígenes o el de Crisóstomo, pero ambos hombres dejan una cosa clara: el pecado es grave. Nos agobia. Oscurece nuestras mentes y envenena nuestros corazones. Nos impide amarnos unos a otros y recibir el amor de Dios. Pero ambos también enseñaron que Jesús nos ofrece la única manera de escapar de su alcance: su cruz y resurrección.

Jesús terminó su parábola con una advertencia: "El que tiene oídos, que oiga" (Mateo 13:43). Hagamos precisamente eso. Tomemos en serio sus palabras. Creamos que su gracia es lo suficientemente poderosa como para salvarnos del pecado. Confiamos en que él puede hacernos "brillar como el sol" (13:43).

"Jesús, dame oídos para oírte mientras me llamas del pecado a tu reino."

Have you seen him whom my heart loves? (Song of Songs 3:3)

Talk about head over heels! In Song of Songs 3:3 the woman searched for her beloved through the city streets and squares. She wouldn't be satisfied until she found him—she even interrogated the watchmen for any information they might have!

What an appropriate reading for today's feast of St. Mary Magdalene! It echoes Mary's search for Jesus in today's Gospel. Seeing the empty tomb, she was desperate to find out what happened to "him whom my heart loves" (Song of Songs 3:3). Jesus wasn't just a teacher or rabbi to her. He was the One who had delivered her from seven demons (Mark 16:9), taught her a new way to live, and welcomed her as a disciple. Mary loved him deeply. She couldn't bear to be without him.

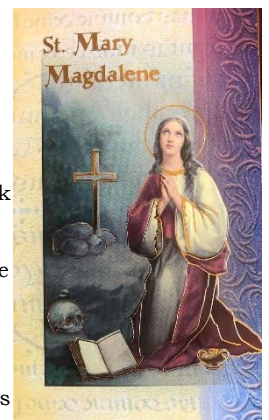
Do we seek Jesus with Mary's intensity? The honest answer is probably not, at least not all the time. Yes, we love the Lord. But sometimes we get distracted by our busy schedules or worries, and the next thing you know, we've "lost" Jesus. We might not even think to look for him.

You can keep the flame of love burning by imitating Mary Magdalene. Yes, Jesus is the Savior of the world, but he is also your own personal Savior, the One who brought you from death to life and who has healed and blessed you in so many specific ways. Let your heart dwell on these grace-filled experiences so that you can see the love and mercy he has always had for you.

As you come to recognize the depth of Jesus' mercy for you, your heart will be changed. Of course, you'll respond with gratitude. But you'll also experience a passionate loyalty and love for him—something that helps you notice that you've drifted from him and drives you to seek him again.

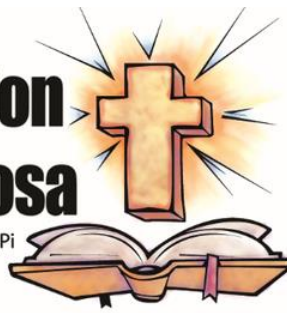
So follow Mary Magdalene's lead. Thank the Lord for all he has done in your life, and let the memory of his mercy fill you with love for him.

"Jesus, you are the One whom my heart loves. Let me find you today!"



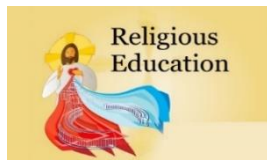

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) Adapted for Children

Do you have children over the age of seven who have not yet received the sacrament of Baptism? The Catholic Church welcomes you! We look forward to helping your family walk through the process called the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (commonly known by its acronym RCIA) Adapted for Children, the process used for the preparation of older children for the sacrament of Baptism.

RCIA Adapted for Children Family Camps are currently forming. These are camps attended by children and at least one parent, to talk about what the Catholic church believes and how Catholics live out their faith. Parents participate in activities with their children. Parents' permission is required for children to participate in and receive any of the sacraments.

High School RICH Youth Ministry: Classes have ended for this school year; we will resume classes in Sept. **RICH (Resting in Christ Hands) Youth Ministry** utilizes the *Life Teen Program* – as well as Diocesan approved curriculum. Curriculum includes Call to Protect the Youth, Morality, Sacramental Prep, Liturgical Celebrations, Theology of the Body, Bible Study, Praise and Worship as well as lots of Fun/Games. High School Classes are combined with Blanco and Johnson City students. We meet at the St. Ferdinand Youth Building (Trailer). *Life Teen is an environment in which high school youth can come into a deeper relationship with God through spiritual, educational, emotional, and social experiences. Our Youth Ministry follows the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) guidelines for comprehensive youth ministry programs.*

Middle School EDGE Youth Ministry: Middle School classes are held in the summer for middle school. Curriculum includes Call to Protect for Youth, Morality, Sacrament teachings, Praise and Worship, Bible Study, Fun & Games. *Blanco and Johnson City middle school students participate in EDGE Youth Ministry, EDGE is part of the LIFE TEEN Middle School youth ministry. We focus on Leadership, Prayer, Service and Unity.*
