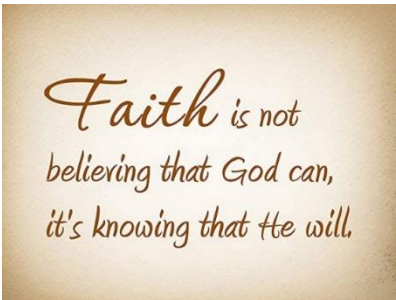

Mass Preparation
August 6th, The Transfiguration of the Lord

First Reading: Daniel 7:9–10,13–14
The prophet Daniel describes his vision of one like the Son of Man who received dominion from God.

Psalm: 97:1–2,5–6,9
A Song of Praise to God our King

Second Reading: 2 Peter 1:16–19
Peter says that the voice heard from Heaven confirmed the truth of his testimony about Christ.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 17:1-9
Jesus is transfigured on the mountain in the presence of Peter, James, and John.

The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field. (Matthew 13:44)

Today's Gospel begins with two parables that, taken together, illustrate a paradox about the kingdom of God. In the first parable, a man discovers, quite by surprise, a treasure "buried in a field" (Matthew 13:44). In the second, a merchant also comes across a great treasure—this time, a pearl—but only after searching very hard for it. So what is the kingdom of God like? Is it something we discover by grace? Or is it something we find through diligent seeking?

Jesus seems to be saying that it's both.

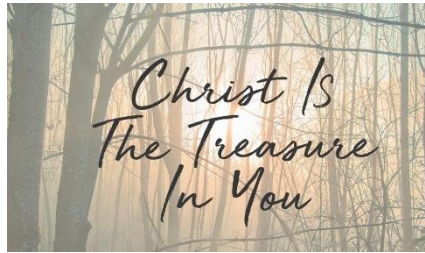
On the one hand, God in his infinite goodness pours grace into our lives whether we are seeking him or not. He buries rich treasure in the field of our lives—treasures of his kindness, his love, his presence—in the hopes that we will find them, and so find him. God provides these gifts for everyone, just as he causes the rain to fall "on the just and the unjust" (Matthew 5:45).

At the same time, there are some graces that we discover only as we seek the Lord. The very act of searching for God opens our hearts more fully to his grace. It stretches us and makes us more willing to let go of anything that would keep us from him. And the more we seek him, the more our capacity for his grace grows. As we "sell" what we have, we experience even more of his goodness, mercy, and joy.

God has so much that he wants to give us. But this all-powerful, ever-generous God will not force his grace upon us. We have to choose to receive it. Even the man who finds the buried treasure by surprise ends up selling all he has "and buys that field" (Matthew 13:44)!

Today, ask the Spirit to help you unearth the treasures of grace in your field. Ask him to help you "sell all you have" to find the Lord and his pearls of grace. Pursue him with all your heart! You won't be disappointed.

"Lord, you are my treasure!"



El reino de los cielos es como un tesoro enterrado en un campo. (Mateo 13:44)

El Evangelio de hoy comienza con dos parábolas que, en conjunto, ilustran una paradoja sobre el reino de Dios. En la primera parábola, un hombre descubre, por sorpresa, un tesoro "enterrado en un campo" (Mateo 13:44). En la segunda, un comerciante también se encuentra con un gran tesoro, esta vez, una perla, pero solo después de buscarlo con mucho esfuerzo. Entonces, ¿cómo es el reino de Dios? ¿Es algo que descubrimos por gracia? ¿O es algo que encontramos a través de la búsqueda diligente?

Jesús parece estar diciendo que son ambas cosas.

Por un lado, Dios en su infinita bondad derrama gracia en nuestras vidas, ya sea que lo busquemos o no. Él entierra ricos tesoros en el campo de nuestras vidas, tesoros de su bondad, su amor, su presencia, con la esperanza de que los encontremos, y así lo encontremos a él. Dios provee estos dones para todos, así como hace que la lluvia caiga "sobre justos e injustos" (Mateo 5:45).

Al mismo tiempo, hay algunas gracias que descubrimos sólo cuando buscamos al Señor. El mismo acto de buscar a Dios abre nuestros corazones más plenamente a su gracia. Nos persigue y nos hace más dispuestos a dejar ir cualquier cosa que nos aleje de él.

Y cuanto más lo buscamos, más crece nuestra capacidad para su gracia. A medida que "vendemos" lo que tenemos, experimentamos aún más de su bondad, misericordia y gozo.

Dios tiene tanto que quiere darnos. Pero este Dios todopoderoso y siempre generoso no impondrá su gracia sobre nosotros. Tenemos que elegir recibirlo. ¡Incluso el hombre que encuentra el tesoro enterrado por sorpresa termina vendiendo todo lo que tiene "y compra ese campo" (Mateo 13:44)!

Hoy, pídele al Espíritu que te ayude a desenterrar los tesoros de la gracia en tu campo. Pídele que te ayude a "vender todo lo que tienes" para encontrar al Señor y sus perlas de gracia. Persíguelo con todo tu corazón! El no te decepcionará.

It is I; do not be afraid. (Matthew 14:27)

In Matthew 14:27-36, the story of the disciples on the boat reveals how Jesus acts during the storms of life. Let's take a look.

First, we see Jesus on the mountain while the disciples are being tossed about in the boat. Doesn't life feel that way sometimes? You are "down here," rocked by problems and disappointments, and where is Jesus? He seems far away. You wonder, Does he even know what I'm going through?

But Jesus does know! Miraculously walking on the waves, heedless of the storm, he comes to his friends. The elements have no power to stop him. Just so, nothing has the power to prevent Jesus from coming to you. That problem that you are dealing with, the sin that plagues you, those emotions that overwhelm you—none of these can keep him from coming to save you.

Notice that when the disciples see Jesus, they are terrified! They are disturbed by the way he has broken into their storm. And we don't always like it, either. He doesn't do things exactly our way. For instance, he may not get rid of the wind or the waves right away. Sometimes, instead of immediately rescuing us from our troubles, Jesus first speaks words of comfort: "It is I; do not be afraid" (Matthew 14:27). Why is this?

Maybe it's because even before calming our storms, Jesus wants to show us that he's with us in our peril. Perhaps he does it to show us that his presence is enough to calm our fears and that he won't abandon us when life gets hard or scary or messy. Jesus brings the peace that comes from him alone. Like the disciples, we need to learn that having Jesus is even better than getting rescued; he is so much more than a means to an end.

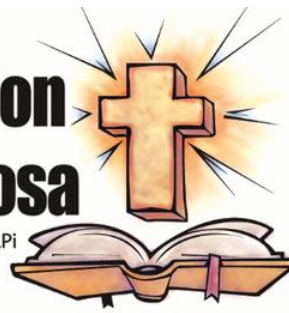
Finally, Jesus calms their storm—and he will calm yours. Not every situation in your life will be calmed as quickly, but every storm will pass. Your storm will pass. Maybe not today. Maybe not next month. Maybe not in six months. But however long it takes, Jesus will remain with you, and his presence will be peace for you. Hear him say, "Do not be afraid; it is I."

"Lord, I believe you are with me! I trust in you!"



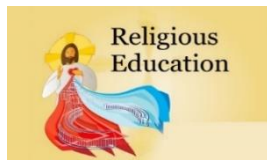

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) Adapted for Children



Do you have children over the age of seven who have not yet received the sacrament of Baptism? The Catholic Church welcomes you! We look forward to helping your family walk through the process called the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (commonly known by its acronym RCIA) Adapted for Children, the process used for the preparation of older children for the sacrament of Baptism.

RCIA Adapted for Children Family Camps are currently forming. These are camps attended by children and at least one parent, to talk about what the Catholic church believes and how Catholics live out their faith. Parents participate in activities with their children. Parents' permission is required for children to participate in and receive any of the sacraments.

High School RICH Youth Ministry: Classes have ended for this school year; we will resume classes in Sept. **RICH (Resting in Christ Hands) Youth Ministry** utilizes the *Life Teen Program* – as well as Diocesan approved curriculum. Curriculum includes Call to Protect the Youth, Morality, Sacramental Prep, Liturgical Celebrations, Theology of the Body, Bible Study, Praise and Worship as well as lots of Fun/Games. High School Classes are combined with Blanco and Johnson City students. We meet at the St. Ferdinand Youth Building (Trailer). *Life Teen is an environment in which high school youth can come into a deeper relationship with God through spiritual, educational, emotional, and social experiences. Our Youth Ministry follows the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) guidelines for comprehensive youth ministry programs.*

Middle School EDGE Youth Ministry: Middle School classes are held in the summer for middle school. Curriculum includes Call to Protect for Youth, Morality, Sacrament teachings, Praise and Worship, Bible Study, Fun & Games. *Blanco and Johnson City middle school students participate in EDGE Youth Ministry, EDGE is part of the LIFE TEEN Middle School youth ministry. Cedarbrake Retreats

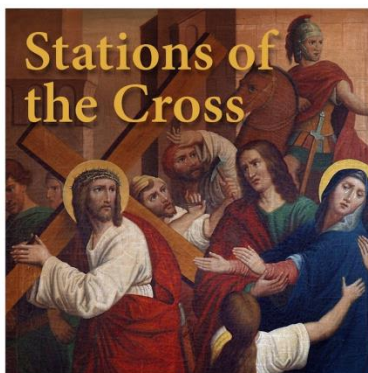
