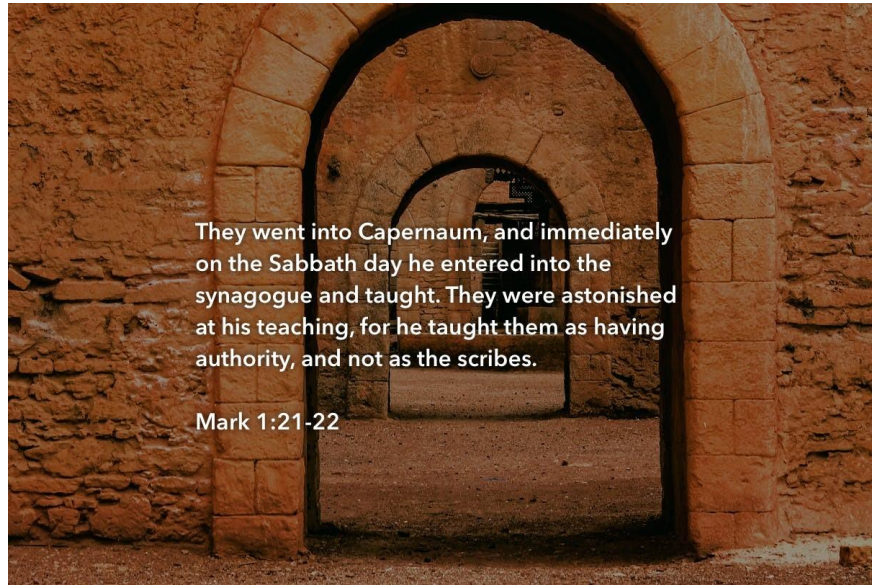

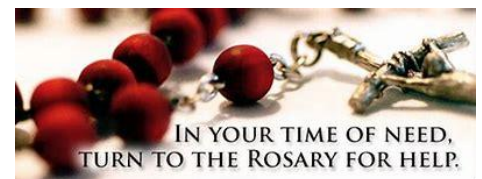

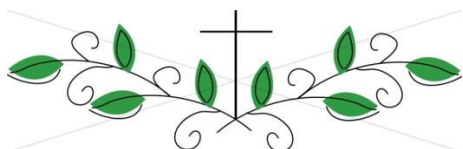

Mass Preparation
 February 4, Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time

First Reading: Job 7:1-4,6-7
Job laments his sufferings and his life.

Psalm: 147:1-6
A song of praise for the Lord’s goodness to the lowly.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 9:16-19,22-23
Paul explains the conditions under which he preaches the gospel and the reasons why he will not accept financial help from the Corinthians.

Gospel Reading: Mark 1:29-39
Jesus cures Simon’s mother-in-law and many others as well.

Let us not again hear the voice of the Lord. (Deuteronomy 18:16)

Addressing the Israelites as they are about to enter the Promised Land, Moses recalls what happened when God was about to give them the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai. God announced his presence with lightning, thunder, a deafening shofar blast, and menacing dark smoke (Exodus 20:18-19). Terrified, the people backed away, saying, "Let us not again hear the voice of the Lord!" (Deuteronomy 18:16). They begged Moses to go and bring God's word back to them!

Now, knowing he was not going to be with them much longer, Moses promises that God will send them someone to take his place, "a prophet like me . . . to whom you shall listen" (Deuteronomy 18:15). What a relief! God promises they will never have to endure the trauma of hearing him directly.

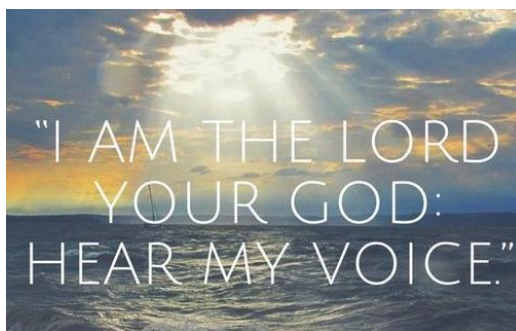
And so it was. In every generation, God raised up prophets for the people. Deborah, Elijah, Isaiah, Jeremiah: these and others heard God directly and proclaimed what they heard.

But now, through Jesus, the living "Word" of God, everything has changed. By destroying sin and death, he has opened the pathway for us sinners to come before the all-holy God. Now, every single person can know God personally. Every single person can hear his voice—in Scripture, through the Church, and most important, in the depths of their hearts.

You don't ever have to be afraid of coming into God's presence! In fact, he is already present in you! Through his Spirit, he is urging you to call out to him, "Abba, Father!" (Romans 8:15). He is waiting to receive you with open arms, to wash you clean in his mercy, and to fill your heart with his joy and consolation.

Your heavenly Father has a message that he wants to speak to you today—a message meant only for you. So quiet your heart, calm your fears, and listen.

"Here I am, Lord! I long to hear your voice today!"



"No puedo seguir mas oyendo la voz del Señor" (Deuteronomio 18:16.)

Dirigiéndose a los israelitas cuando estaban a punto de entrar en la Tierra Prometida, Moisés recuerda lo que sucedió cuando Dios estaba a punto de darles los Diez Mandamientos en el Monte Sinaí. Dios anunció su presencia con relámpagos, truenos, un ensordecedor toque del cuerno y un humo oscuro amenazante (Éxodo 20:18-19). Aterrorizados, el pueblo retrocedió, diciendo: «¡No volvamos a oír la voz del Señor!» (Deuteronomio 18:16). ¡Le rogaron a Moisés que fuera y les trajera la palabra de Dios!

Ahora, sabiendo que no iba a estar con ellos por mucho tiempo más, Moisés promete que Dios les enviará a alguien para que ocupe su lugar, "un profeta como yo [...] a quien escuches" (Deuteronomio 18:15). ¡Qué alivio! Dios promete que nunca tendrán que soportar el trauma de escucharlo directamente.

Y así fue. En cada generación, Dios levantó profetas para el pueblo. Débora, Elías, Isaías, Jeremías: estos y otros escucharon a Dios directamente y proclamaron lo que oyeron.

Pero ahora, a través de Jesús, la "Palabra" viva de Dios, todo ha cambiado. Al destruir el pecado y la muerte, ha abierto el camino para que nosotros, pecadores, nos presentemos ante el Dios santísimo. Ahora, cada persona puede conocer a Dios personalmente. Cada persona puede escuchar su voz, en las Escrituras, a través de la Iglesia y, lo que es más importante, en lo más profundo de sus corazones.

¡ Nunca tienes que tener miedo de venir a la presencia de Dios! De hecho, ¡él ya está presente en ti! A través de su Espíritu, te está invitando a que le clames: "¡Abba, Padre!" (Romanos 8:15). Él te espera para recibirte con los brazos abiertos, para limpiarte en su misericordia y para llenar tu corazón con su alegría y consuelo.

Tu Padre celestial tiene un mensaje que quiere hablarte hoy, un mensaje destinado solo para ti. Así que aquietta tu corazón, calma tus miedos y escucha.

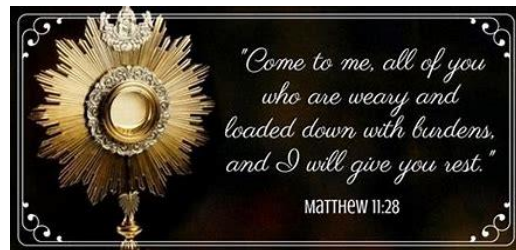

The Presentation of the Lord, February 2

Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord. (Luke 2:22)

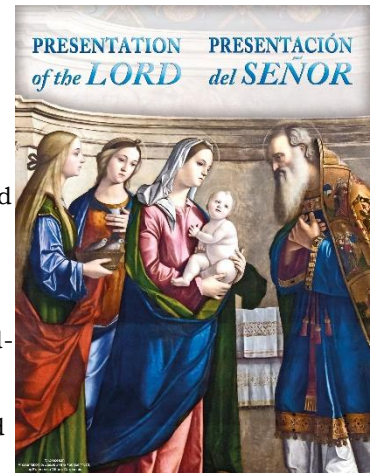
Imagine the generosity of spirit it took for Mary and Joseph to do what they did that day in the Temple. They loved their son, Jesus, and cherished him deeply. They experienced every parental attachment and instinct that all other parents feel. And yet they chose not to follow the Jewish custom of "redeeming" him and claiming him as their own (Numbers 18:15-16). Instead, they offered him back to the Lord.

Joseph and Mary knew that Jesus had been conceived by the Holy Spirit. They knew that he belonged to the Lord more than he belonged to them. They even knew that he belonged to the world more than to them. And so, selflessly, they promised to share him with everyone.

Look at the reading in the Gospel of Luke (2:22-40) as an example. When Simeon, a complete stranger, came up to them, Mary and Joseph let him take their child in his arms. They heard him say that, if they made good on their promise, Jesus' life would be filled with conflict and that a "sword" would pierce Mary's heart (Luke 2:34-35). But they didn't shrink back. Raising him according to the "wisdom" and "favor of God" (2:40), they continued to prepare him for his mission.

- Even after Joseph died, Mary kept offering her son to the Lord and his people.
- She freely gave him to Peter, John, and the other disciples as he began his ministry. She shared him with the crowds who constantly gathered around him, even when he said that they were now his family (Mark 3:35).
- At the cross, as a "sword" of grief did pierce her heart, Mary made her most painful offering yet. Joining in Jesus' prayer, "Father, forgive them" (Luke 23:34), she offered him not only to God but to the very people who had crucified him.

On the feast of the Presentation, imagine Mary and Joseph freely placing the child Jesus in your arms. Then marvel at their generosity—and the generosity of God!

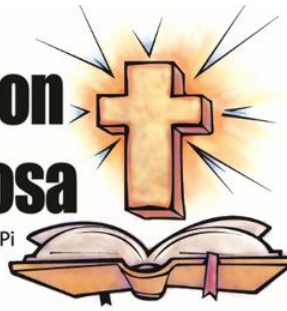
Live the Liturgy

Most of us are not trail blazers. Throughout history though, there have been many folks who tirelessly and persistently pursued the promptings of their hearts without giving any care to what others thought or trends dictated. Jesus is one of them. St. Teresa of Calcutta and St. Francis of Assisi are examples of others. The rest of us are people who take a more measured look at things, want to test the waters, and take our time choosing what path or person to follow. We need credible witnesses of faith. We need the Moses people in our lives to show us by word and deed who God is and what integrity and a purpose-driven life looks like. 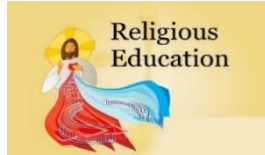

High School RICH Youth Ministry: Classes are held on every other Sunday from 5:30 pm to 7:30 pm. All classes will include a meal from 5:30 pm to 6:00 pm. **RICH (Resting in Christ Hands) Youth Ministry** utilizes the Life Teen Program – as well as Diocesan approved curriculum. Curriculum includes Call to Protect the Youth, Morality, Sacramental Prep, Liturgical Celebrations, Theology of the Body, Bible Study, Praise and Worship as well as lots of Fun/Games. High School Classes are combined with Blanco and Johnson City students. We meet at the St. Ferdinand Youth Building (Trailer). *Life Teen is an environment in which high school youth can come into a deeper relationship with God through spiritual, educational, emotional, and social experiences. Our Youth Ministry follows the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) guidelines for comprehensive youth ministry programs.*

Middle School EDGE Youth Ministry: Middle School classes are held in the summer for middle school. Curriculum includes Call to Protect for Youth, Catholic Social Teachings, Morality, Sacrament teachings, Praise and Worship, Bible Study, Fun & Games. *Blanco and Johnson City middle school students participate in EDGE Youth Ministry, EDGE is part of the LIFE TEEN Middle School youth ministry. We focus on Leadership, Prayer, Service and Unity.*

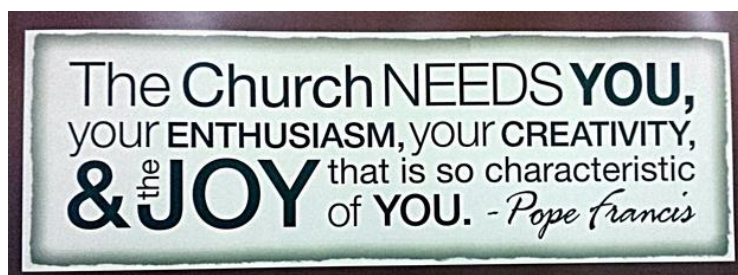
