I am . . . the one who is and who was and who is to come. (Revelation 1:8)

Today's feast of Christ the King marks the culmination of everything that our readings over the past month have been leading up to. Even as we live in the "already" (Jesus has come!) and the "not yet" (*Jesus will return and establish his reign forever!*), we take time today to declare that Jesus is King, both now and forever. He is "the one who is and who was and who is to come" (Revelation 1:8).

Just as Jesus is our eternal King, his kingdom is an everlasting kingdom. It reaches beyond time and space. And its population is unique: the "poor in spirit" are given places of honor, along with those who mourn and who are meek and lowly of heart (Matthew 5:3-5).

So what does it mean for us to be citizens of this wonderful, everlasting kingdom? How can the "already," the "right now," and the "not yet" truths of this kingdom affect our lives?

- Jesus has *already* freed you from sin by his blood (Revelation 1:5). You can receive this freedom by faith and Baptism, by repentance, and by staying united to him through the sacraments.
- Nothing can separate you from his love (Romans 8:39). Today, *right now*, you can invite Jesus to remove any barriers that keep you from experiencing the joys of his kingdom.
- You will *one day* reign with the Lord (2 Timothy 2:12). It's awe-inspiring to think of, but in Jesus' kingdom, "Whoever humbles himself will be exalted" (Matthew 23:12). If you try to stay close to him in this life, he promises to give you a place near him as he reigns eternally (25:34). Rejoice today that Jesus is your eternal King. Invite him to reign in your heart even more, as you await his reign of love over the whole world.

Raise your heads! (Luke 21:28)

In the Gospel of Luke 21:21-28, Jesus describes a time when Jerusalem will be plunged into unrelenting violence. And Revelation 18:2 describes the destruction of “Babylon the great,” considered by many scholars to be the city of Rome. Taken together, these two cities symbolize the whole world—the sacred and the profane. No one, it seems, will escape the “terrible calamity” set to “come upon the earth” (Luke 21:23). And so Jesus warned his disciples to help them prepare for whatever was coming.

It doesn't take a detailed investigation to see that Jesus' warning is for us as well. We are all aware of how widespread war, violence, famine, and abuse have become. Even our environment (the frightening “roaring” of the oceans—Luke 21:25) is suffering the effects of human sin!

So how should we respond? By following Jesus' exhortation: “Stand erect and raise your heads” (Luke 12:28).


- *Lift up your head!* Fix your eyes on Jesus and pray. Your prayers have power (James 5:16)! Pray for the healing of people closest to you who are suffering. Pray for the deliverance of those still trapped in cycles of sin and violence. Pray even for world leaders, that they will pursue peace.
 - *Lift up your head!* Look up to heaven, where the God of mercy reigns. Ask his forgiveness for any way you have contributed to the sin in the world—including the sin of indifference to other people's needs. But also seek the grace to forgive anyone who has hurt you. Pursue the mercy of the Lord so that you can help create an environment of mercy and compassion in your home, neighborhood, or workplace.
 - *Lift up your head!* Let your faith and trust in the Lord be visible to the people around you. Join your heart with all believers so you can “shine like lights in the world” (Philippians 2:15). Let your peace draw others to the Lord so they can become instruments of peace as well.
- Never forget the love and faithfulness of the Lord. Let him help you stand firm. And for heaven's sake—and for the sake of everyone else—lift up your head!

Distractions are the wanderings of our imagination.



If we deliberately let it wander and do not even try to pray, that is a sin.

If you notice a distraction, gently turn your mind back to some thought of God. Meanwhile, your heart is praying all the time.

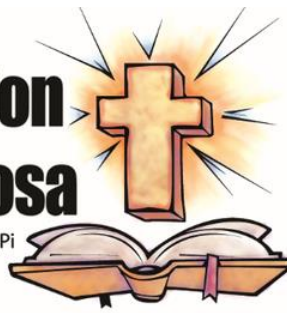

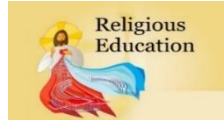

High School RICH Youth Ministry: Classes are held on every other Sunday from 5:30 pm to 7:30 pm. All classes will include a meal from 5:30 pm to 6:00 pm. **RICH (Resting in Christ's Hands) Youth Ministry** utilizes the Life Teen Program – as well as Diocesan approved curriculum. Curriculum includes Call to Protect the Youth, Morality, Sacramental Prep, Liturgical Celebrations, Theology of the Body, Bible Study, Praise and Worship as well as lots of Fun/Games. High School Classes are combined with Blanco and Johnson City students. We meet at the St. Ferdinand Youth Building (Trailer). *Life Teen is an environment in which high school youth can come into a deeper relationship with God through spiritual, educational, emotional, and social experiences. Our Youth Ministry follows the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) guidelines for comprehensive youth ministry programs.*

Middle School EDGE Youth Ministry: Middle School classes are held in the summer for middle school. Curriculum includes Call to Protect for Youth, Catholic Social Teachings, Morality, Sacrament teachings, Praise and Worship, Bible Study, Fun & Games. *Blanco and Johnson City middle school students participate in EDGE Youth Ministry, EDGE is part of the LIFE TEEN Middle School youth ministry. We focus on Leadership, Prayer, Service and Unity. Classes will be held July 8th – 18th, 2025*
