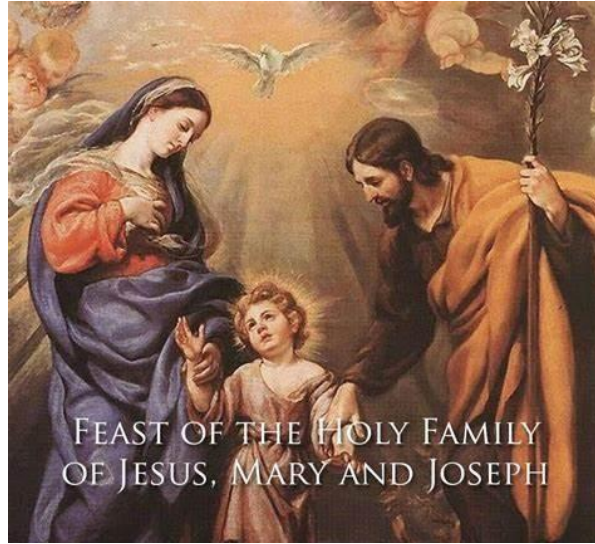

# The Feast of the Holy Family

*Put on love. (Colossians 3:14)*

A wise man once joked, "It's called *Holy Matrimony* because so many holy martyrs are made there!" When you add children into the mix, the opportunities for "martyrdom" rise exponentially.

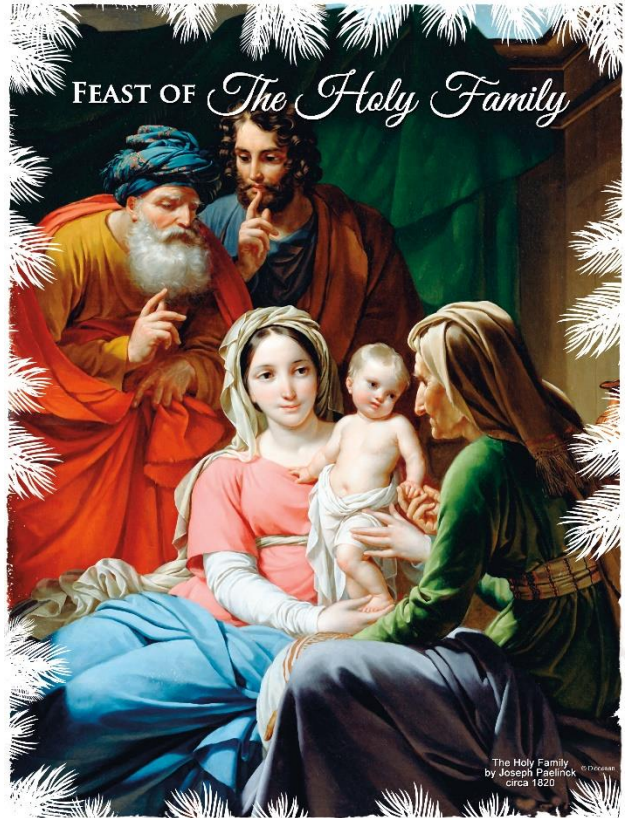
Jokes aside, the Holy Family was holy because each member decided to "put on love"—to sacrifice their own preferences and give of themselves to one another. Whether it was Mary and Joseph's patience in the face of anxiety or misunderstanding or Jesus' humble, obedient return to Nazareth, their holiness shone through their care for one another (Luke 2:48-49, 51).

As you celebrate the Holy Family today, know that you grow in holiness *through* your vocation to family life, not in spite of it. God designed us to be part of a family, whether as a spouse, parent, or child. That means you can become holy as you imitate the Holy Family in your own family.

Even more, you are called to build a "civilization of love," as St. John Paul II said in his *Letter to Families* (13). It's a civilization that starts with that foundational building block of the family and reaches outward. It grows as each member gives themselves to God and, then in love, give of themselves to other people. John Paul said that when we're faithful to our vocation, whether as a married person or as a single person, priest, or religious, our witness of love affects everyone around us.

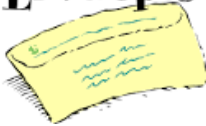
So take some time today to reflect on how your family can help you grow in holiness. Think about how you can put on the virtues St. Paul describes in today's second reading and, over them all, love (Colossians 3:12-14). And then allow yourself to dream of how your decisions to love might just change civilization.

*"Mary and Joseph, pray that your son, Jesus, will help me to be holy in the vocation he has given me."*



*Jesus, Mary and Joseph, like you we are members of the Father's family. We pray that our family love may reflect his love on its openness to all people. May we forgive even when not forgiven, and be patient with others' weaknesses.*

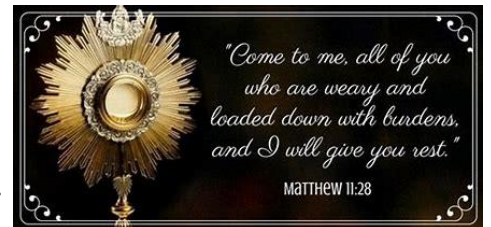

# Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God

January 1st is a celebration of Mary's motherhood of Jesus. On this day, we are reminded of the role that the Blessed Virgin played in the plan of our salvation. Through the Holy Spirit, God the Father prepared Mary to be the dwelling place where His Son and His Spirit could dwell among men. Christ's birth was made possible by Mary's fiat, or sanctioning of God's plan with her words, "Be it done to me according to thy word". Calling Mary "Mother of God" is the highest honor we can give to her. Just as Christmas honors Jesus as the "Prince of Peace", the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God honors Mary as the "Queen of Peace". New Year's Day is also designated as the "World Day of Peace", further acknowledging the role of Mary in our hearts and in our world.

## Epiphany Traditions



In continuing our celebration of Christmas, we soon come to the great solemnity of the Epiphany! Also known as "Twelfthnight", "Theophany", and "Three Kings' Day", it is the crown of the Christmas season, just as Pentecost serves to crown the Easter season.



This beautiful solemnity has an amazing significance for us, as you will hear about in the homilies and Masses, but it also has many local customs and variations associated with it. For example, in many countries, the day for giving gifts is not Christmas, but the Epiphany, in imitation of the Magi (which actually makes more sense). Some of the faithful also use this day to choose a Patron Saint for the year, to bake delightful foods (especially King Cake!), or for the men to give their wives a break by doing the housework (good luck with that one). This is also a day for blessing many religious articles, including of course gold, frankincense, and myrrh; but there are two particular blessings that we are excited to bring back and promote this year – Blessed Chalk and Epiphany Water.

**Blessed chalk** many of you have become familiar, especially through our Faith Formation classes and its growing popularity. As you will see, the tradition consists of using the blessed chalk to write a blessing of protection over the outer doors of your home in honor of the Magi.

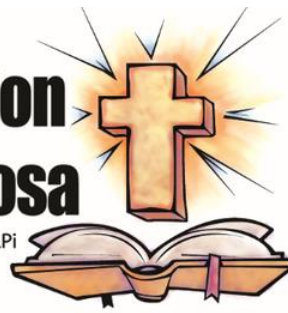
**Epiphany water** is one that is just recently making a comeback – it is one of the most powerful forms of holy water against evil (second only to the old Baptismal water in which the Holy Oils were poured – very hard to come by these days). This water takes at least a half-hour to bless in a beautiful ceremony, and connects not with the Magi, but with the Baptism of the Lord, which is also part of the Epiphany celebration, especially in the Eastern Church, from which this blessing is derived.

All of you are invited to the rite of blessing the chalk and Epiphany water on **Saturday, January 4th, at 1pm in the Church**. Please bring your own bottles to fill up (as long as their dignified – please NO Seven-Eleven cups). We will have a few available for a donation if you don't have one.

It is meaningful traditions like these that make me so happy to be a Catholic! Our Lord comes to us in tangible ways – ways that we can understand and experience with our senses. Let us continue to rejoice in our Lord's birth in the flesh by sanctifying our own!

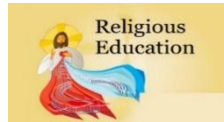

# YOUTH MINISTRY

**High School RICH Youth Ministry:** Classes are held on every other Sunday from 5:30 pm to 7:30 pm. All classes will include a meal from 5:30 pm to 6:00 pm. **RICH (Resting in Christ's Hands) Youth Ministry** utilizes the *Life Teen Program* – as well as Diocesan approved curriculum. Curriculum includes Call to Protect the Youth, Morality, Sacramental Prep, Liturgical Celebrations, Theology of the Body, Bible Study, Praise and Worship as well as lots of Fun/Games. High School Classes are combined with Blanco and Johnson City students. We meet at the St. Ferdinand Youth Building (Trailer). *Life Teen is an environment in which high school youth can come into a deeper relationship with God through spiritual, educational, emotional, and social experiences. Our Youth Ministry follows the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) guidelines for comprehensive youth ministry programs.*

**Middle School EDGE Youth Ministry:** Middle School classes are held in the summer for middle school. Curriculum includes Call to Protect for Youth, Catholic Social Teachings, Morality, Sacrament teachings, Praise and Worship, Bible Study, Fun & Games. *Blanco and Johnson City middle school students participate in EDGE Youth Ministry, EDGE is part of the LIFE TEEN Middle School youth ministry. We focus on Leadership, Prayer, Service and Unity. Classes will be held July 8th – 18th, 2025*



**2024-2025 Confirmation Classes:** Students interested in registering for Confirmation class must be enrolled in RICH Youth Ministry Classes.
