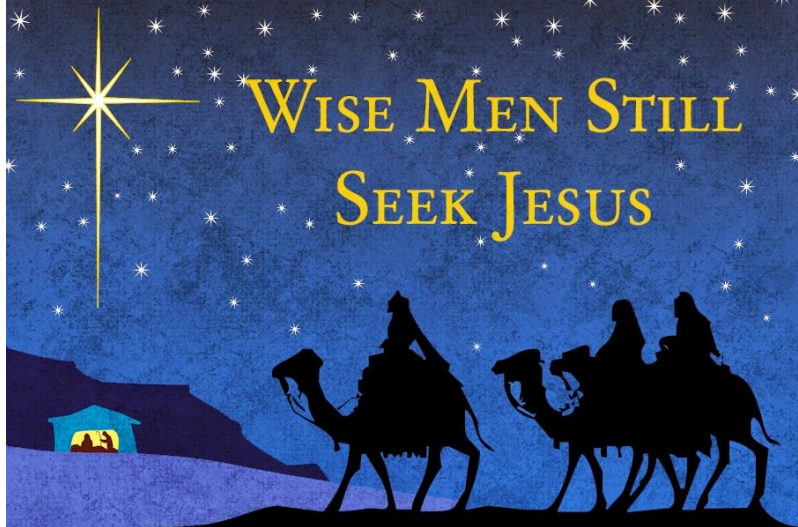

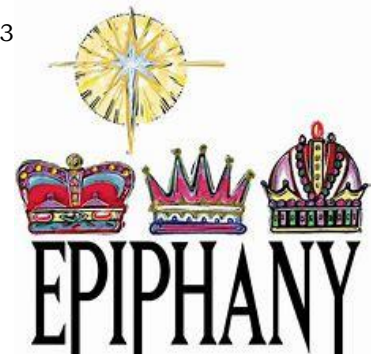

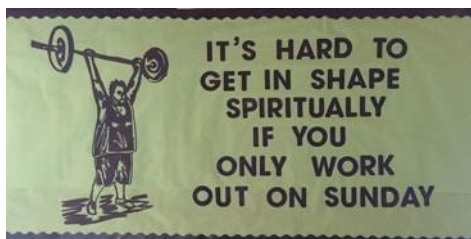

Mass Preparation
January 12, The Baptism of the Lord

First Reading: Isaiah 40:1-5,9-11
Isaiah tells the people to prepare a way for the Lord.

Psalm: 104:1b-4,24-25,27-30
A prayer praising God's greatness

Jesus is baptized by John.



“We three kings of Orient are bearing gifts we traverse afar.” This popular Christmas carol is appropriate for today’s feast of the Epiphany. But were they “three”? Were they “kings”? Matthew only tells us that “magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem” (2:1). He doesn’t say how many they were, and he definitely doesn’t say anything about them being kings.

The reason we may think they were kings is because of today’s first reading, which tells the people of Jerusalem, “Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance” (Isaiah 60:3). And we usually think there were three of them because they offered Jesus three gifts—gold, frankincense, and myrrh. So although we don’t know their names, how many they were, or their countries of origin, we do know the most important thing: when they found the child Jesus, they “prostrated themselves and . . . offered him gifts” (Matthew 2:11).

Let’s ponder the gifts that we might offer our King today:

- Gold is a precious metal that represents wealth. What is your *gold*? Maybe it’s the time you offer to serve him, or it’s your money that you can share with the poor.
- Frankincense was a gift of worship. You can offer him the *frankincense* of the prayers and praises that rise from your heart to the throne of the Lord Almighty.
- The myrrh is a perfume that foreshadowed Jesus’ sacrifice on the cross. The *myrrh* you can offer are the times you sacrifice yourself to care for your family or those closest to you.

On this feast day, bring your precious gifts to the Lord. Offer him everything you have. Pour out your life before him and pay him homage. Jesus is pleased with every gift that you have for him.

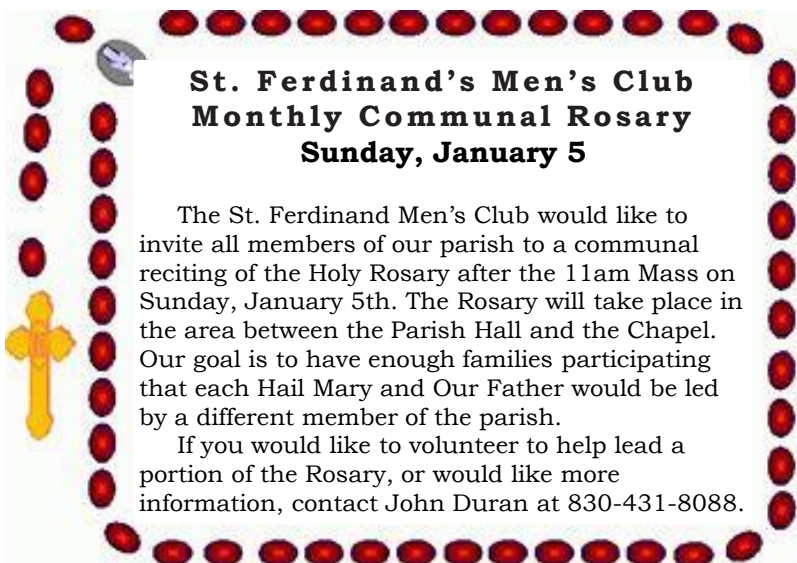

St. Ferdinand’s Men’s Club Monthly Communal Rosary Sunday, January 5

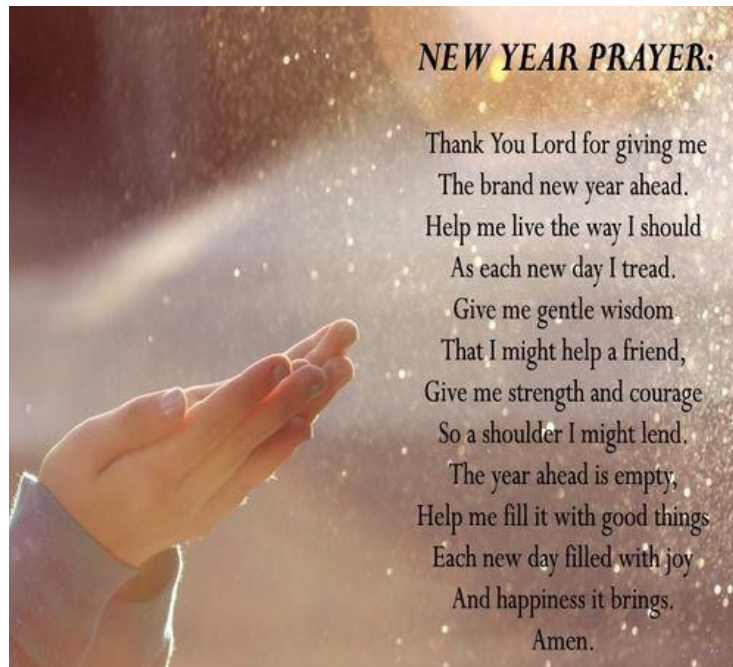

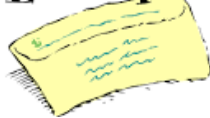


NEW YEAR PRAYER:

The people who sit in darkness have seen a great light. (Matthew 4:16)

The dim glow of a nightlight can be so comforting. Not only does it dispel the pitch-black darkness of night, but it also illuminates obstacles that might get in the way if we want to leave a room. Light enables us to see the reality of the world around us.

Jesus
THE LIGHT of THE WORLD

Matthew quotes the prophet Isaiah, who promises that the people “who sit in darkness” will see “a great light” (Matthew 4:16). In Isaiah’s time, the northern kingdom of Israel was under brutal Assyrian rule. Though they lived in darkness, Isaiah prophesied that one day a light would arise—a child who would become “Prince of Peace” (Isaiah 9:5; Matthew 4:16). By citing Isaiah, Matthew is pointing to Jesus as the fulfillment of this prophecy.

Of course, Jesus didn’t come to liberate us from foreign rulers; he came to set us free from sin and death. He is “the light of the world” (John 8:12) because only he can show us a way out of spiritual darkness. Only he can liberate us from the pain and confusion that have plagued our world throughout history.

Think about all the ways that Jesus is the light of your life. He reveals the truths of the gospel and shows you the paths you should walk in. He opens your eyes so that you can understand how greatly you are loved and how you can share that love with the people around you. He helps you perceive the obstacles that stand in the way of your relationship with him. And he expands your vision to include not only worldly concerns but the promise of eternal life.

If you are facing some kind of “darkness” in your life right now—something confusing or something you can’t see your way out of—fix your eyes on Jesus. Even if you feel as if you are still in the dark, cling to him in trust and believe that he will lead and guide you. Jesus is truly the light of the world. As you follow him step-by-step, he will give you the eyes to see!

“Lead, Kindly Light, amid the encircling gloom. . . . I do not ask to see the distant scene; one step enough for me” (St. John Henry Newman).

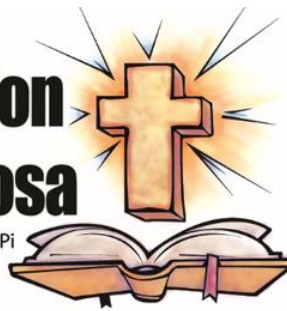


Prayer for Epiphany Sunday

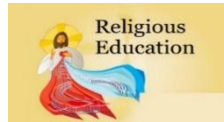

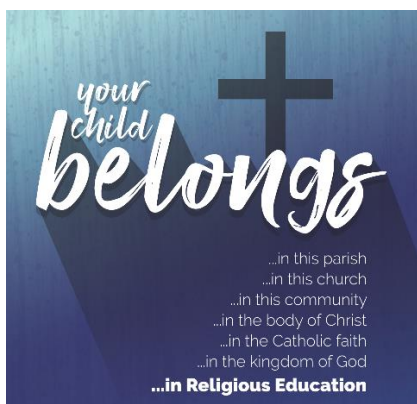

High School RICH Youth Ministry: Classes are held on every other Sunday from 5:30 pm to 7:30 pm. All classes will include a meal from 5:30 pm to 6:00 pm. **RICH (Resting in Christ's Hands) Youth Ministry** utilizes the *Life Teen Program* – as well as Diocesan approved curriculum. Curriculum includes Call to Protect the Youth, Morality, Sacramental Prep, Liturgical Celebrations, Theology of the Body, Bible Study, Praise and Worship as well as lots of Fun/Games. High School Classes are combined with Blanco and Johnson City students. We meet at the St. Ferdinand Youth Building (Trailer). *Life Teen is an environment in which high school youth can come into a deeper relationship with God through spiritual, educational, emotional, and social experiences. Our Youth Ministry follows the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) guidelines for comprehensive youth ministry programs.*

Middle School EDGE Youth Ministry: Middle School classes are held in the summer for middle school. Curriculum includes Call to Protect for Youth, Catholic Social Teachings, Morality, Sacrament teachings, Praise and Worship, Bible Study, Fun & Games. *Blanco and Johnson City middle school students participate in EDGE Youth Ministry, EDGE is part of the LIFE TEEN Middle School youth ministry. We focus on Leadership, Prayer, Service and Unity. Classes will be held July 8th – 18th, 2025*
