ARCHDIOCESE FOR THE MILITARY SERVICES, USA

Our parishes will take up the Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS), a collection approved by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to be taken every three years. The AMS provides pastoral care to Catholic men and women serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, enrolled at a U.S. Military Academy, being treated as a patient at any of the 153 U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers, or who work for the federal government beyond U.S. borders - including those from our own parish and diocese. The AMS does not receive any funding from the government or military, and has no parishes from which to receive a weekly assessment.

Mass Preparation

June 1, The Ascension of the Lord

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

Jesus is taken up to heaven in the presence of the Apostles.

Psalm: 47:2-3,6-9

Sing praise to God as he mounts his throne.

Second Reading: Ephesians 1:17-23 or Hebrews 9:24-28; 10:19-23

God raised Jesus from the dead and seated him at his right hand.

Gospel Reading: Luke 24:46-53

Jesus is taken to heaven and the disciples remain in Jerusalem awaiting his sending of the Spirit.

I have told you this . . . (John 14:25)

Grief, fear, and anxiety. What a range of emotions the disciples must have felt as they listened to Jesus' final words before his arrest and crucifixion! And yet in today's Gospel, Jesus is also making a number of promises that surely sustained them in the days and years ahead. Amazingly, these same promises are also meant for us.

Whoever loves me will keep my word, . . . and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him (John 14:23). Jesus will be put to death, rise, and then ascend to heaven, but he is still present to us. When we follow him, he promises not just to accompany us but to live in us! He is as close to us as we are to ourselves.

The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, . . . will teach you everything (John 14:26). Jesus taught his followers many things that the Gospels record, but he wants to continue speaking to our minds and hearts. That's why he sent us the Holy Spirit. He will lead us and guide us in every situation we face.

My peace I give to you (John 14:27). After Jesus' ascension, the disciples will face persecution and even martyrdom. But despite these trials, Jesus' peace will remain with them. They will know a wholeness and tranquility that can only come from the Lord. This is his gift to us as well.

How have you seen these promises fulfilled in your walk with the Lord? Think of all the times you have felt his presence in your heart. Recall when the Holy Spirit helped you understand more about the Lord or guided you in a specific way. Remember how God's peace descended on you in a hectic or difficult time. God always fulfills his promises. So wherever you find yourself today, believe what Jesus has "told you" (John 14:25, 29). Then look for how he is working in your life, just as he said he would!

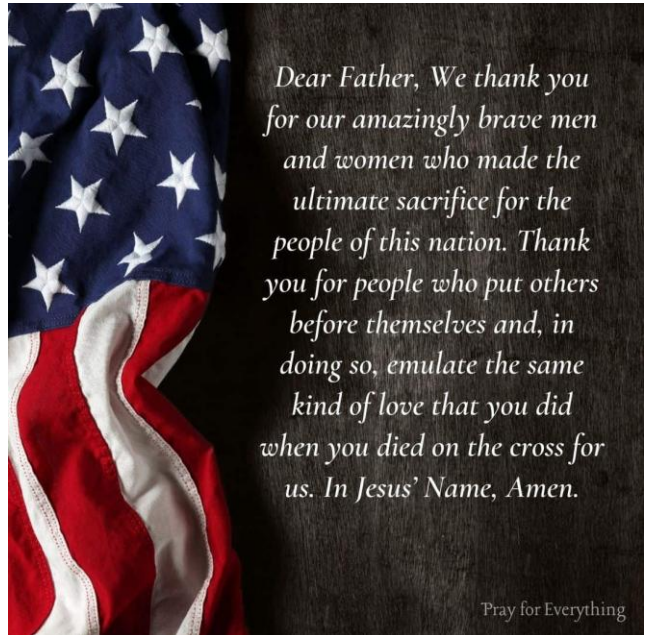

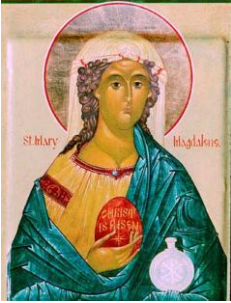
Portraits of Paschaltide

Dear sons & daughters,

He is risen!

Here we are already over half-way through Paschaltide! In true Catholic spirit, this joyful time is rife with symbolism, so I thought it might be good to go over some of these, even if a little late...

First of all, as I mentioned, bunny rabbits are NOT a Christian symbol, so don't use them. They are actually a pagan symbol for "Eostre," the Anglo-Saxon fertility goddess, whose cult we glorious replaced with the providential timing of the Resurrection, which is how we started using the name "Easter" in English. This isn't a problem in other languages (e.g. "Pascua" in Spanish; that is, "Passover"). This is also why I prefer "Paschaltide".



Eggs, however, are very Christian and one of the oldest symbols of the Resurrection, traditionally tracing all the way back to St. Mary Magdalene herself! They symbolize the tomb of Christ and bringing forth new life.



The Peacock (seen here on the High Altar at St. Mary's Seminary in Houston, where I studied), is another ancient symbol of resurrection, since every year the male peacock sheds his beautiful feathers – and they come back even more beautiful than before!



The Pelican, while not a resurrection symbol specifically, is certainly a symbol of Christ in the Eucharist – legend has it that the mother pelican, if it cannot find food, will bleed itself in order to feed her young.



The Butterfly, rounding out our animal analogies, though not an ancient symbol, can also remind us of resurrection – the caterpillar enters into the cocoon (the tomb) and dies, only to be reborn as a beautiful butterfly!



Baptism, of course, is THE Paschal Sacrament (seen here from our own Chapel), and has many symbols of its own:

- Water**, in which we died with Christ as we entered it, and rose with Christ as we came out of it,
- A White Garment**, which we received at our Baptism, signifying our newfound purity and new life, and
- The Hand of God**, while not always pictured with Baptism, reminds us that it is the Resurrected Christ that performs every Sacrament, not the minister alone.



The Paschal Candle (St. Ferdinand's seen here) is the ever-present symbol of the Resurrected Christ throughout Paschaltide, and burns brightly at every Baptism and Funeral – for we die and rise with Christ! It also has its own symbols:

- The Cross**, which is the symbol of true love, and
- Alpha & Omega**, the first and the last letters of the Greek alphabet, remind us of Revelation 22:13, in which Christ proclaims Himself the Beginning and the End, the immortal and eternal One!



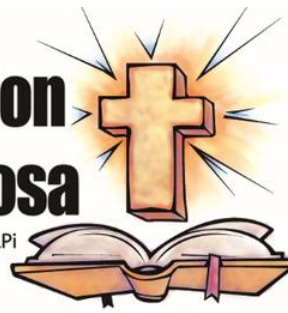
The Lamb of God (also from our Chapel) is one of the most important and ancient of Christian symbols, reminding us of Christ as the Lamb Who sacrificed Himself for us (His entire purpose for coming), and bearing the banner of the Cross, the symbol of His triumph!

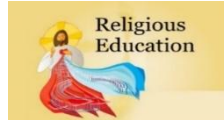

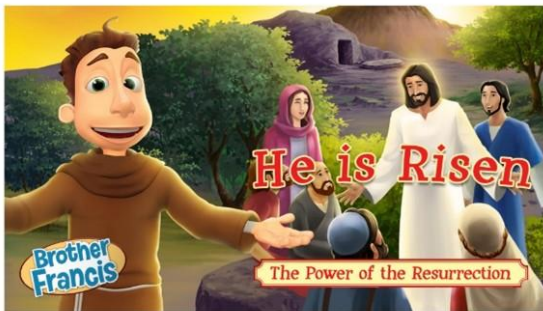

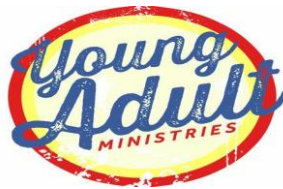
