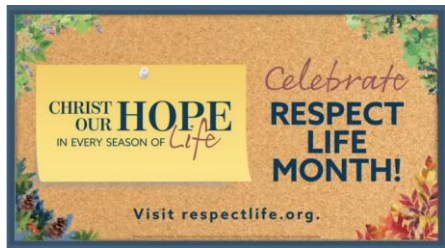

Mass Preparation
October 12, The Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: 2 Kings 5:14-17
Naaman is cleansed of his leprosy and chooses to serve the God of Israel.

Psalm: 98:1-4
Rejoice! The salvation of God is made known to all.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 2:8-13
Those who remain faithful to Christ will share Christ's glory.

Gospel Reading: Luke 17:11-19
Jesus heals 10 lepers, and one, the Samaritan, returns to give thanks.



Today's first reading relays a frank conversation between the prophet Habakkuk and the Lord. Habakkuk is worried that God isn't answering his prayers about the darkness he sees all around him. With an unjust king in Jerusalem oppressing the poor and Babylon posing an ever-growing threat of invasion, it seems that "misery" and "destruction and violence" are all he can see (Habakkuk 1:3). And so he asks the Lord, "How long, O Lord? I cry for help but you do not listen" (1:2). *This isn't how it's supposed to be! You're supposed to be a good and loving God who protects his people!*

In reply, God counsels patience. He has a vision for how things will be, and that vision is slowly taking shape. Until then, he says, "The just one, because of his faith, shall live" (Habakkuk 2:4). *Trust in me. All will be revealed in time.*

Are you worried about the darkness in the world or your family or perhaps in your own heart? Do you find your attention fixed mostly on the problems around you, the tragedies of war, wounded families, and disregard for the poor?

That's not the full picture! God sees all the turmoil, but he also has a vision for the day when his light will triumph. And that vision is unfolding even now as believers bring his healing mercy to a suffering world. Every act of faith, justice, and love brings God's vision one step closer to completion—and he rejoices to see it!

God also sees you. He sees every way that your faith (even if it seems as small as a "mustard seed"—Luke 17:6) is growing and deepening. He sees your efforts to share his good news and to witness to his salvation.

So let God's vision for this world fill you with hope! Remember that it "still has its time," but it will certainly come (Habakkuk 2:3).

The Story of Our Lady of the Rosary, Feast Day—October 7, 2025

Saint Pius V established the feast of Our Lady of Victory to thank God for the Christian defeat of the Turks at Lepanto—a victory attributed to praying the rosary. Pope Gregory XIII changed the name to Feast of the Holy Rosary—originally celebrated on the first Sunday in October—in 1573. Pope Clement XI extended the feast to the universal Church in 1716. And in 1913, Saint Pius X set the date for the feast that we know today of October 7.

The development of the rosary has a long history. First a practice developed of praying 150 Our Fathers in imitation of the 150 Psalms. Then there was a parallel practice of praying 150 Hail Marys. Soon a mystery of Jesus' life was attached to each Hail Mary. Though Mary's giving of the rosary to Saint Dominic is recognized as a legend, the development of this prayer form owes much to the followers of Saint Dominic. One of them, Alan de la Roche, was known as "the apostle of the rosary." He founded the first Confraternity of the Rosary in the 15th century. In the 16th century, the rosary was developed to consist of 15 mysteries: joyful, sorrowful and glorious. In 2002, Pope John Paul II added the five Mysteries of Light to this devotion.

The purpose of the rosary is to help us meditate on the great mysteries of our salvation. Pius XII called it a compendium of the gospel. The main focus is on Jesus—his birth, life, death, and resurrection. The "Our Fathers" remind us that Jesus' Father is the initiator of salvation. The "Hail Marys" remind us to join with Mary in contemplating these mysteries. They also make us aware that Mary was and is intimately joined with her Son in all the mysteries of his earthly and heavenly existence. The "Glory Bes" remind us that the purpose of all life is the glory of the Trinity.

The rosary appeals to many. It is simple. The constant repetition of words helps create an atmosphere in which to contemplate the mysteries of God. We sense that Jesus and Mary are with us in the joys and sorrows of life. We grow in hope that God will bring us to share in the glory of Jesus and Mary forever.



If you do a Google search for “how to pray,” you’ll get hundreds of millions of results. And the number keeps rising. If you ask publishers of religious material what readers want, they’ll say, “Something that teaches the basics of prayer.” And so the volume of books, articles, apps, and e-books on prayer swells every year.

So many choices! So many teachers and approaches! It can give the impression that prayer is a very difficult and complex practice. But Jesus, in Luke 11:1, says otherwise. He teaches us that although prayer is a very deep subject indeed, we don’t need an advanced degree or a cohort of experts to help us grow in our relationship with God.

The disciples came to Jesus with the very request that people are making today: “Teach us to pray” (Luke 11:1). In response, Jesus gave them the Our Father—a simple model of what the content and spirit of their prayer should be. In fact, Luke’s version, which is short and spare compared to Matthew’s, accents simplicity. It consists of five requests that range from the cosmic to the personal. In the first two, Jesus invites us to share in God’s desire that his universal plan of salvation be fulfilled (11:2). Then the last three petitions are for the material and spiritual help we need for our earthly journey (11:3-4).

And the spirit of this prayer that Jesus teaches? It’s simple, too; it’s summed up in one word: “Father” (Luke 11:2). By inviting us to speak so boldly, Jesus assures us that we are beloved children of God. He tells us that our heavenly Father cares for us and always hears us. In a homily not long after his election, Pope Francis proclaimed, “Father—this is the key of prayer.” He went on to say that prayer is nothing but “entrusting ourselves to the Father’s embrace” (June 21, 2013).

So today, listen to Jesus, the great Teacher of prayer, and let your Father embrace you. Reflect on the simple phrases the Lord gave us as you go about your day. Let them sink into your heart, shape the words you speak in prayer, and guide the way you live your life.

It’s all so simple. So profoundly simple.

“Jesus, teach me to pray. Help me to follow you in a spirit of simplicity and trust.”



Meet our New Bishop!

Biography



Bishop Daniel E. Garcia was born on August 30, 1960, and grew up in Waco and Cameron, Texas. He is bilingual in English and Spanish and has three younger sisters.

He earned an Associate of Arts degree from Tyler Junior College in 1982, a Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Arts from the University of St. Thomas in Houston in 1984, while attending St. Mary Seminary, and a Master of Divinity in 1988. Bishop Garcia was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Austin on May 28, 1988, by Bishop John E. McCarthy. In 2007, he earned a Master of Arts in Liturgical Studies from St. John’s University in Collegeville, Minnesota.

His first assignments were as associate pastor at St. Catherine of Siena Parish, Cristo Rey Parish, and St. Louis King of France Parish, all in Austin. From 1992 to 1995, he served in the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston at St. Mary Magdalene Parish in Humble, Texas. In 1995, he was named the founding pastor of St. Vincent de Paul Parish in Austin.

Bishop Garcia has held several diocesan roles, including service in the Vocation Office, Priests’ Personnel Board, College of Consultors, and the Presbyteral Council, where he also served as chair. He was Dean of the Austin North Deanery and contributed to the Liturgical Commission, Diaconal Advisory Committee, and served as Master of Ceremonies for the Bishop’s Office.

In 2014, he was appointed Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia for the Diocese of Austin by Archbishop Joe S. Vásquez. The following year, Pope Francis appointed him Auxiliary Bishop of Austin. In 2018, Pope Francis named Bishop Garcia the Bishop of the Diocese of Monterey, California.

Let us now welcome him home and pray for him daily!

St. Ferdinand Women’s RENEWAL Retreat, October 23-26, 2024

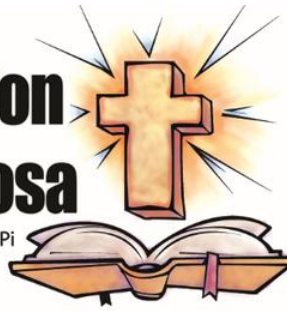
