Mass Preparation
December 28, 2025, The Feast of the Holy Family

First Reading: Sirach 3:2-7,12-14
Honor to one's parents will be rewarded.

Psalms: 128:1-5
Happy are those who follow the Lord's ways.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:12-21
Do all things in the name of Jesus and give thanks to God.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 2:13-15,19-23
In a dream, God tells Joseph to flee to Egypt to protect Jesus from King Herod.



He was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame. (Matthew 1:19)

What an interesting thing to say about Joseph: he was “righteous” yet “unwilling to expose” Mary “to shame” (Matthew 1:19). It seemed as if there were two different impulses in Joseph as he struggled to decide how to respond to Mary’s pregnancy.

Today’s Gospel tells us that Joseph was a righteous man and a devout observer of the Mosaic law. He was just in his intention to break his union with Mary—she seemed to have violated their betrothal, after all. But still, he didn’t want Mary to become an object of ridicule and shame. So he was merciful in his desire to find a quiet solution that avoided public scandal.

Justice and mercy: these two noble instincts revealed the depth of Joseph’s holiness. And yet God had something better in mind. He wanted to bring Joseph even further along the path of righteousness.

When the angel appeared to him in a dream, he reassured Joseph that he didn’t need to divorce Mary. The child she carried was part of God’s plan to redeem the world. He was Emmanuel, God-with-us, who would fulfill both justice and mercy in himself. Joseph accepted the angel’s words. He came to see that God’s plans were bigger and better than his own, righteous though they were. So Joseph let the Lord redirect his ideas and strategies.

This is a lesson for us. God is always calling us into a deeper relationship with him. He might ask us to set aside our plans or take a step in a direction we don’t understand. But he leads the way for us. Joseph’s yes to the Lord not only protected Mary and Jesus, but it also transformed his own life. Even though Joseph didn’t understand, he was willing to obey. It made all the difference for Joseph, and it can do the same for you!

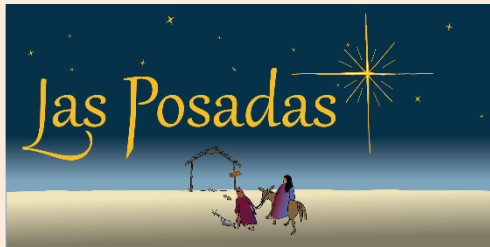
We will host three events throughout the year including:

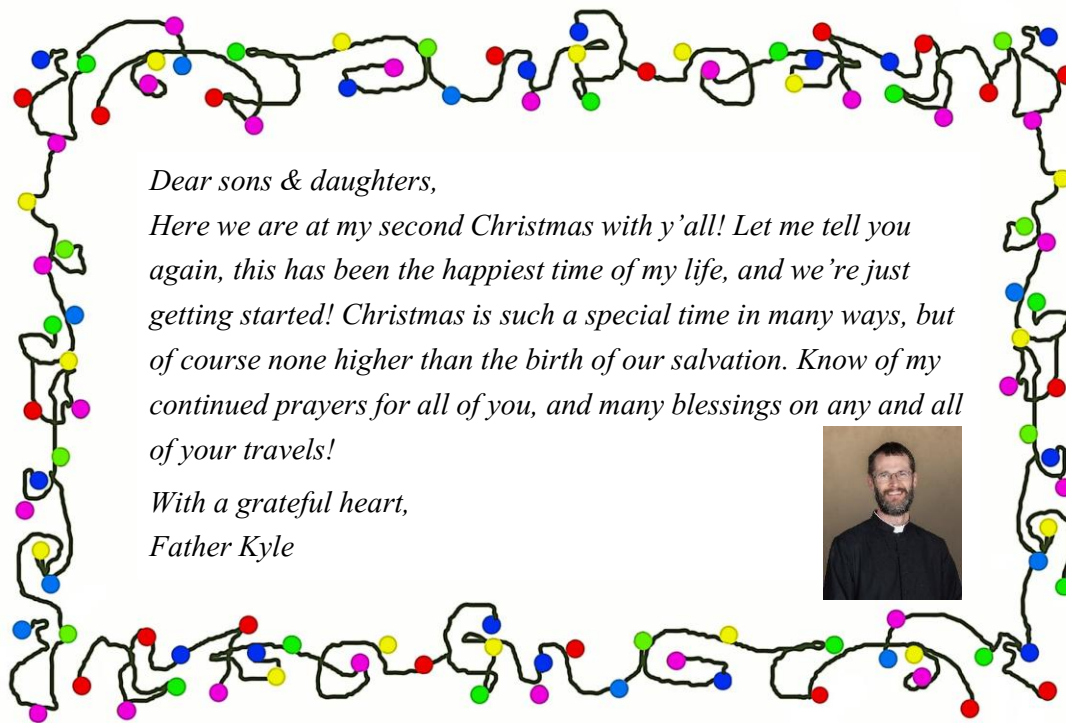

The dawn from on high shall break upon us. (Luke 1:78)

Have you ever taken the time to sit and enjoy an early-morning sunrise? It's almost haunting the way the sky gradually shifts from pitch black to deep gold. Now imagine you were an astronaut on the International Space Station. First, you see the Earth's horizon and, above it, the complete darkness of space. Then, in almost an instant, the brilliant light of the sun breaks over the horizon, blanketing the Earth in light.



This shift from darkness to light is the analogy that Zechariah used to describe the birth of his son, John, and the coming Messiah whom John was called to announce. The "dawn from on high" was just about to break upon the people of God (Luke 1:78).

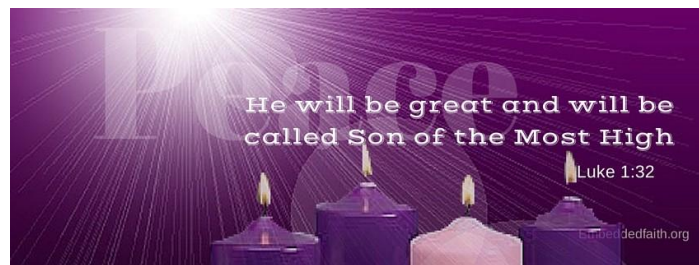
What a beautiful image for where we are right now! Jesus is just about to appear! He's just about to dispel the darkness of sin, division, and all that is opposed to his message of salvation. The dawning of his light, prefigured by the star of Bethlehem, contains the promise of everything that humanity had longed for from the moment our ancestors first sinned.

Even today, God longs to shine the light of his love into every person's heart. The need is so great! Millions around the world are still caught in darkness—and some don't even know that they are looking for him!

So on Christmas Eve, contemplate the light that will break upon the world tomorrow. It's the light of joy, of peace, of tranquility, that came when God first entered the world as one of us. And it's still shining today, as bright as ever.

As you await the dawning of that light, keep praying for those lost in darkness. Pray that the men and women who have not yet encountered the light of the gospel will be touched by its good news during this Christmas season. Pray that those who have closed themselves off from the light will now be open to receiving it. May we all be set on fire with the light of Christ's love!

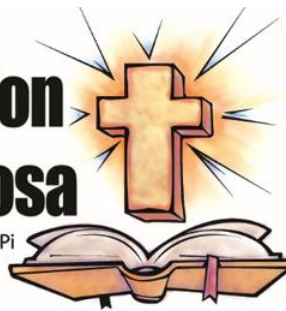


Retreat for men at Eagle's Wings

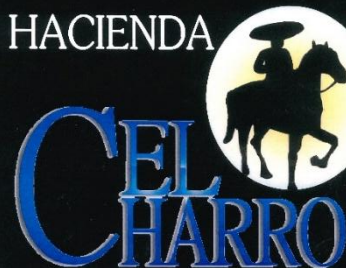
