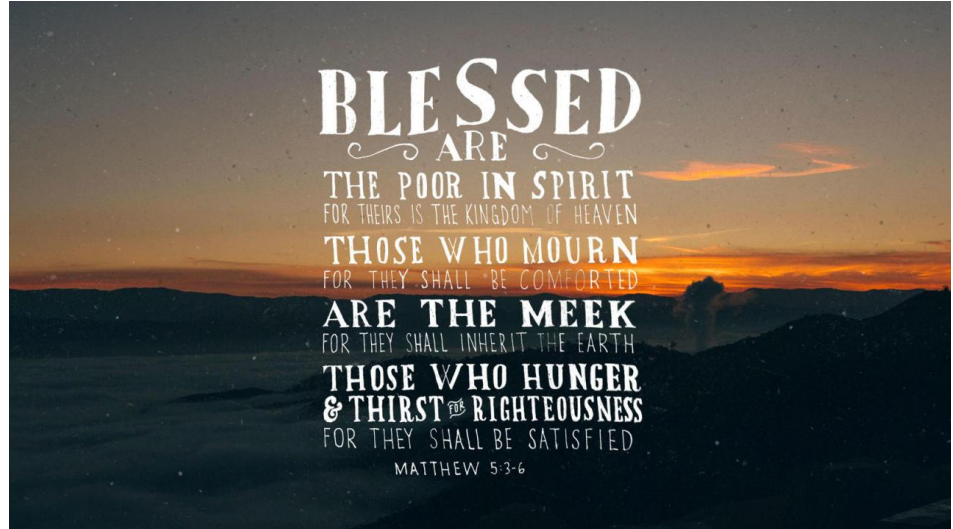

Mass Preparation
February 8, 2026, The Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Isaiah 58:7-10
In the work of justice, light shall break through darkness.

Psalm 112:4-9
The just person will be a light in the darkness.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:1-5
Paul shows that he came to Corinth preaching Christ crucified.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 5:13-16
Jesus teaches that his disciples are to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world.

In today's second reading, St. Paul addresses the Corinthians, who were fighting among themselves. One faction favored the apostle Peter, another preferred Paul, and still another followed Apollos. But Paul rebukes them for their rivalries and reminds them that wisdom, power, and worldly recognition count for nothing before the Lord. Quite the opposite: God delights in choosing "the lowly" (1 Corinthians 1:28).

Jesus tells his disciples something similar in the Gospel for today: "Blessed are the poor in spirit" (Matthew 5:3). This probably surprises them, because self-confidence, prestige, and wealth are typically considered signs of God's blessing. But Jesus turns them upside down. Humility is the path to blessing. That's because when we are poor in spirit, we recognize that God is the source of all that we have and are. Everything is a gift from him. So when we come before the Lord empty-handed, we can allow him to fill us with his gifts, his wisdom, and his grace.

Why did Jesus preach this beatitude? One reason is that it keeps us humble. No matter how gifted we may be, we can't boast about our accomplishments or think of ourselves as superior to anyone else because of them. There is no pecking order with God!

Second, when we are poor in spirit, we are blessed! Our hearts are more free and more open to God. We trust in him to fulfill our needs rather than trying to prove ourselves or rely on our own resources. We are at peace with who we are and the way God made us. And our lives are more fruitful because we are "lowly" enough to ask him to guide us and to bless our efforts.

Today at Mass, come before the Lord poor in spirit and knowing that you are loved by God. Open your heart to him and allow him to fill you!

Mary and Joseph took Jesus . . . to present him to the Lord. (Luke 2:22)

As devoted and faithful Jews, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the Temple, in fulfillment of the Jewish law. They came to give to the Lord what they could—"a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons" (Luke 2:24). But God gave them more than they could have imagined: the confirmation that their child was the One who would bring salvation to the world: "a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for . . . Israel" (Luke 2:32). Through the words of Simeon and Anna, God confirmed that the time of redemption for all people had come.

As we celebrate the feast of the Presentation on Monday, let's consider how simple moments of faithfulness—like Mary and Joseph's trip to the Temple that day—can become gateways to the extraordinary, where heaven touches earth. One way that we see this clearly is through the sacraments, the "signs of grace, . . . by which divine life is dispensed to us" (Catechism, 1131). Outwardly, it's easy to miss the spiritual reality of what is happening when we celebrate a sacrament. But we know, for instance, that in the waters of Baptism, sin is washed away and we are adopted into God's family! We know that in Reconciliation, we are restored "to God's grace" and joined "with him in an intimate friendship" (1468). And we believe that the Eucharist, "the source and summit of the Christian life," unites us to Christ and enables us to "anticipate" heaven (1324, 1326).

Just as Mary and Joseph were blessed to witness God's plan unfold through their simple act of obedience, ask the Lord to help you see how he is at work in your life through the sacraments. The next time you receive the Eucharist, thank him for his presence in what seem like ordinary bread and wine, and for uniting himself to you in such a personal way. As you prepare for Confession, keep in mind the joy you will experience of being reconciled to the Lord. And praise God for all the ways heaven touches earth every single day!

"Lord, open my eyes with wonder to see all that you are doing in my life today."

Sacramentals

Dear sons & daughters,

In the wake of our Epiphany blessings, let us see what the Baltimore Catechism has to tell us about them!

469. What are sacramentals?

Sacramentals are holy things or actions of which the Church makes use to obtain for us from God, through her intercession, spiritual and temporal favors.

470. How do the sacramentals obtain favors from God?

The sacramentals obtain favors from God through the prayers of the Church offered for those who make use of them, and through the devotion they inspire.

472. Which are the chief kinds of sacramentals?

The chief kinds of sacramentals are:

- first*, blessings given by priests and bishops;
- second*, exorcisms against evil spirits;
- third*, blessed objects of devotion.

473. Which are the blessed objects of devotion most used by Catholics?




The blessed objects of devotion most used by Catholics are: holy water, candles, ashes, palms, crucifixes, medals, rosaries, scapulars, and images of Our Lord, the Blessed Virgin, and the saints.

Practice: Treat blessed things with respect.

474. How should we make use of sacramentals?

We should make use of the sacramentals with faith and devotion, and never make them objects of superstition.

Using sacramentals with faith means believing in what they represent and treating them as signs of spiritual things. We break the first commandment by superstition in using them as good luck charms.

Always ask a priest for his blessing. He represents Christ and his blessing obtains special graces.	Exorcism means freeing persons or things from the power of the devil. He rarely possesses persons now, but uses things to tempt us. Exorcisms destroy this power.	Have articles of devotion blessed by a priest. This blessing obtains God's grace to arouse devotion.
