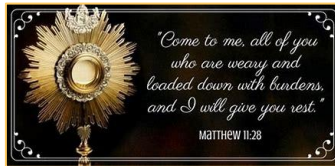

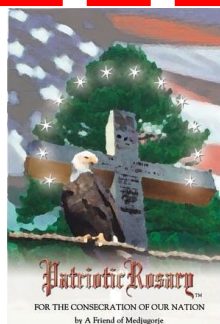

Mass Preparation

July 5th, Fourteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

First Reading: Zechariah 9:9-10

The Lord shall come to reign in Zion.

Psalm: 145:1-2,8-11,13-14

A prayer of praise to God who is our king.

Second Reading: Romans 8:9,11-13

Those in whom the Spirit of God dwells must now live according to the Spirit, not the flesh.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 11:25-30

Jesus prays in thanks to God, who has revealed himself to the lowly.

Whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me. (Matthew 10:38)

Did you know that this is the first time the cross is mentioned in Matthew's Gospel? It comes at a time when Jesus is commissioning the Twelve to go out preaching and healing. Jesus doesn't directly predict his own death, either. He's telling his closest followers the conditions of discipleship!

We might not quite grasp what a challenging statement Jesus was making. As Christians, we might think that taking up the cross means bearing life's burdens, whether they be inconveniences, sickness, or hardship. And that's not wrong.

But his disciples would have understood that the call to take up their cross meant something much more radical. Crucifixion was a feared, brutal, shameful manner of execution. So they understood that Jesus was telling them to be willing to give up everything to follow him and witness to him—even their lives, if necessary. It's not so different from what Jesus had said just before this: whoever loves father or mother, son or daughter more than him is not worthy of him (Matthew 10:37). Even important family ties must be second to our commitment to Jesus.

This is not an easy message. But consider who is asking it of us. Jesus is not merely a teacher or philosopher. He's not simply a compassionate wonder-worker or dedicated advocate for the poor. He is God himself. Of course we should have nothing above God in our lives!

Consider also that the One who asks this of us lived out this command perfectly. He humbled himself and laid down his life to free us from sin and death and restore us to the Father. How could we respond with anything less?

Today, hear Jesus' demanding call. Ask him for the grace to follow him wholeheartedly.

"Jesus, I embrace this hard saying. Help me to put you first in every area of my life."

Sisters of Mary Morning Star, Mission Appeal, June 27-28



The Sisters of Mary Morning Star are an international community of contemplative Sisters living a religious life based on the mystery of the Virgin Mary before her Assumption into Heaven. The Sisters live a simple life close to the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, keeping his Word, interceding for the Church and the world. While they preserve true cloisters for their convents - laces of silence and solitude where the sisters can focus on a life lived for God alone - they also open their doors to all those who wish to share in their times of prayer.

The Mission Appeal of June 27-28 will be presented by the Sisters from the Waco convent for one of their 3 convents in Cameroon, Africa, where civil war has raged since 2013. Their new mission in Bamenda needs your help in building a convent and chapel.

Until a few weeks ago you may never have heard of the city of Bamenda, but it recently had the honor of welcoming the Holy Father, Pope Leo, during his trip to Cameroon. 16 of our sisters, including the General Prioress, had the grace of being present at this historic meeting. Some Sisters came from a second convent, in Kumbo, even further in the heart of this zone of conflict, where our sisters hear gun shots almost daily and have had to console countless families for the loss of their young sons who have been dragged into this conflict.

The Archbishop of Bamenda is very eager to help the Sisters build this chapel and gather the local people to help with the actual manual labor, but support is needed from overseas to pay for the cost of the raw materials. The estimated total cost will be around \$500,000. Already raising \$20,000 through mission appeals could allow our sisters to build the first set of bedrooms and lay the foundation for a chapel.

Checks can be made payable to the parish, with a note for the SMSM mission appeal. Thank you for helping the Sisters continue their witness of hope through prayer and trust in God.

Do we trust our Father?

Dear Parishioners of St. Ferdinand & Good Shepherd,

The Christian life is defined by union with Jesus, who is the Son of God. This union that we have with Him by our baptism is indescribably intimate and close, and at all times, Jesus is calling us to live in this place of union with Him. This union goes so far as to unite His identity as the Father's beloved Son to each one of us. In our baptism, we all have the same perfect and divine Father who loves us more deeply and intimately than we could possibly imagine. In baptism, you are called the beloved with whom He is well pleased.



Yet, how often do we go about our day motivated by an anxiety or fear of being rejected or abandoned in both little and great ways. We so often live and move as if we are orphans needing to fend for ourselves, rather than a child who has confidence in the love of his Father. Like orphans, we grasp for what we think will satisfy our hearts and constantly are left unfulfilled. Rather, we must heed Christ's invitation to be "Be not afraid". To live unafraid is to live confidently of the love the Father has for you, by virtue of our union with Christ. This is true freedom: to see that God has loved you so dearly in creating and saving you, and in response to that love, you trust Him with everything as an act of love, just as a son loves his father by his faith that his father will continue to be a father to him.

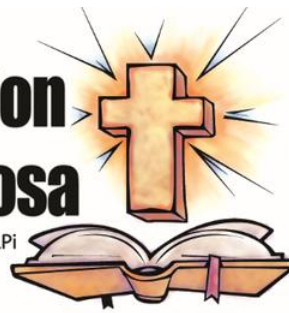
