

From Our Pastor

Dear People of St. Stephen,

Today is Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week, the most sacred days of our Church year. These are the "high holy days" for Catholics. The words of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane, "Not my will, but yours be done," express the spirit of this week. Jesus willingly embraces the Cross to bring us salvation and God's life. We enter into the spirit of this week when, reflecting Jesus' prayer, we pray "Lord, grant me the courage to accept humbly and follow obediently Your will for me."

I encourage everyone to enter into the spirit of this week and to participate in as many of the Holy Week liturgies as you can. Our Palm Sunday liturgy today begins with the gospel reading of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. The palms we hold signify our giving glory to Christ as the people of Jerusalem did on that first Palm Sunday. But the "Hosannas" of the entry into Jerusalem soon turn to people calling for Jesus to be crucified. The irony is that the Cross was the way to the glory for the risen Lord who is King of Kings.

Holy Thursday celebrates the Last Supper and the two great gifts that Jesus gave us that night. The first is the gift of the Eucharist, our regular nourishment as Catholics. Jesus' words—"This is My Body; This is My Blood"—emphasize the truth that Christ is really present to us in the Eucharist. The Eucharist is not just a symbol. Jesus is really present in the Eucharist. Every time we receive communion the Lord comes to us in a

special way. When you receive communion, think of Jesus saying to you "I love you and I want to be close to you". We honor Christ's presence in the Eucharist by the practice of adoration and the quiet prayer in our church until midnight after the Mass of the Lord's Supper.

The second great gift of Holy Thursday is the ideal of service. We remember Jesus' washing the feet of the apostles in the ritual of the foot washing after the homily on Holy Thursday. The ritual calls us to be like Christ - to be people of service to others.

Good Friday remembers Jesus' Passion and Death. Good Friday is the only day of the year when the Church does not celebrate Mass. The Liturgy of the Lord's Passion that we celebrate on Good Friday has three elements: the Liturgy of the Word that includes the reading of the Passion story from St. John's gospel; the ceremony of veneration of the Cross; and a communion ritual in which hosts consecrated on Holy Thursday provide us with the Eucharist. We celebrate the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion at 3 PM in English and at 5 PM in Polish. At 7:30 PM on Good Friday our teens with some adults along with our music ministry present a very moving presentation of the Living Stations of the Cross. It is an excellent way to reflect upon Jesus' sacrifice on the Cross that gives us life.

By Church law the only liturgy on Holy Saturday is the Easter Vigil, the most solemn liturgy of the year. It is celebrated after sundown, at 7:30 PM here at St. Stephen. There are four elements in this liturgy: the service of the new fire which celebrates the light of the resurrection that breaks the darkness of sin; an extended Liturgy of the Word; the celebration of the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation for new members of our church along with a renewal of our baptismal promises; and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The Easter Vigil includes Easter Mass. The liturgy is about two hours long and is very moving. I invite everyone to join us for this most sacred liturgy of our Church

Easter Sunday's liturgies celebrate Jesus' resurrection. Easter is our greatest feast as Catholics, since our faith and hope have their foundation in the resurrection of Jesus. The Easter Vigil as well as our 7 AM Mass on Easter morning have good crowds but little standing. The 8:30 AM, 10 AM, and 11:30 AM Masses are very full, with a number of standees. Our Polish parishioners have a 5 AM Mass to greet the risen Lord at dawn, a Mass that is also quite full. Our 1 PM (Polish) and 6:15 PM Masses have had only a slightly larger crowd than normal. I encourage everyone to join us in celebration of the Lord's resurrection this Easter and to make some special time for prayer on these most sacred days of our faith.



Lenten Regulations

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

Lenten Recipe

Rolled Away

These breakfast buns will remind you of Jesus' resurrection.

1 pkg frozen rolls, thawed* 25 large marshmallows 1/4 cup melted butter or margarine 6 tablespoons sugar 1 tsp. cinnamon

Press the rolls into flat circles Place a marshmallow in the center of each roll and pinch the dough around it. Roll the marshmallow-filled rolls into round balls. Brush each ball with the butter and sprinkle it with cinnamon and sugar. Let the rolls rise for 30 to 45 minutes. Then bake then at 350 degrees for 15 minutes until they're golden brown.

Easter Basket Blessing—Holy Saturday

On Holy Saturday, March 26, St. Stephen will have our traditional blessing of the Easter baskets. There will be two services at 11:00am and 12:00 noon. Both services will be bilingual.

Every nationality and family has their own Easter traditions, whether they are traditional or non-traditional. For those who observe the custom of Easter basket blessing, whether you do your basket the traditional way, or your own version (i.e., biscuits, wine, fruits, vegetables, Peeps, chocolate or other candy), the choice is yours to make. Since we have a large Polish representation in the parish, we thought we would use their version. The following is their traditional foods and their meanings:

Polish Easter (Swieconka) Basket Contents and Symbolism

Maslo/Butter: This dairy product is often shaped into a lamb (Baranek Wielkanocny), reminding us of the goodness of Christ that we should have toward all things.

Chleb/Easter Bread: A round rye loaf topped with a cross, symbolic of Jesus, the Bread of Life.

Chrzan/Horseradish: Symbolic of the Passion of Christ still in our minds, but sweetened with some sugar because of the Resurrection. May be white or pink (with grated red beets).

Jaijka/Eggs and Pisanki: Indicates new life and Christ's Resurrection from the Tomb.

Kielbasa/Sausage: A spicy sausage of pork products, indicative of God's favor and generosity.

Szynka/Ham: Symbolic of great joy and abundance. In addition to the large ham cooked for the Easter Meal, often a special small ham, call the Szynka Wielkanoczyn is purchased specially for the Swieconka basket.

Slonina/Smoked Bacon: A symbol of the over abundance of God's mercy and generosity.

Sol/Salt: So necessary an element in our physical life, that Jesus used its symbolism: "You are the salt of the earth."

Ser/Cheese: Shaped into a ball, it is the symbol of the moderation Christians should have.

Holy Water: Holy water is used to bless the home, animals, and fields and is used in religious rituals throughout the year.

A **candle**, often marked like the Paschal Candle lit during the Easter Vigil, is inserted into the basket to represent Christ, Light of the World.

A colorful **ribbon** and sometimes sprigs of greenery are attached.

The **linen cover** is drawn over the top and is ready for the trek to the blessing.

7th Grade Service Project



On Sunday, February 21, the 7th grade students from St. Stephen, Cardinal Bernardin School and St. Elizabeth Seton participated in a service project as part of their Confirmation preparation. The students gathered personal toiletry items like tooth paste, combs, shampoo, bar soap, socks, gloves, hats, etc...you may have seen the collection boxes and lists of needed items in the narthex and in our bulletin the last few weeks. Through the generosity of the students, their families, parishioners, and a couple of local businesses, we gathered well over one thousand items.

I would like to thank Cardinal Bernardin School and St. Elizabeth Seton Parish for the use of their Parish Life Center. Without the spacious accommodations, the service project day would have been unmanageable.

It is important to mention that as a collaborative effort between our parishes, over 120 young men and women learned a little bit more about social service and our Baptismal call to diakonia (service to others).

Let me just mention the coordinated staff because without their fine work this would not have taken place:

Sandi Morgan, Director of Religious Education at St. Stephen, and Joann Buryj, Laura Laird, and Karen Cole of her Religious Education staff.

Mary Iannucilli, Principal at Cardinal Bernardin School, and Mary Vlamming, Director of Religious Education at St. Elizabeth Seton.

It was though the direct efforts of the above mentioned people that 120+ young men and women came together on a Sunday morning, in many cases accompanied by their parents who joined in the project, that the 1K+ items were bagged individually, packaged and boxed for delivery to the Illinois Veterans Home, Manteno (27 boxes); South Suburban PADS (5 boxes) and St. Leo Veterans Residence in Chicago (8 boxes) and also some particular items to the Franciscan Outreach, Chicago, IL and the South Suburban Crisis Center. Deacon Pete and I spent the day on Monday

delivering these essential items and I assure you the efforts were well received and very gratefully welcomed.

As you may know the Manteno VA provides residential/multiple levels of care for disabled Illinois Veterans with about 300 living in residence, St. Leo (a collaboration between the VA and Catholic Charities) provides long term residence for 141 formerly homeless and disabled veterans, and South Suburban PADS provides nightly sleeping quarters and hot meals to the homeless.

I have included a few pictures of the young adults in action. On behalf of Deacon Pete and myself, I wish to thank all who supported and participated in this service project. Your time, talent, and treasure has brought an increased level of comfort to our brothers and sisters that



Co to jest sprawiedliwość?

Jesteśmy gotowi do zrywów w imię sprawiedliwości i wolności. Potrafimy walczyć o nasz byt, o rodzinę, region i kraj. Czy potrafimy podobnie walczyć o naszą wiarę, o naszą duchowość? Mamy wspaniały przykład Chrystusa, który nie bacząc na krzywdy i okrucieństwa, jakie Mu zgotowano, walczył o naszą wolność, o naszą wiarę.

Dzisiaj Pan oczekuje z naszej strony właśnie takiego zrywu. Zrywu, który nas umocni, poprowadzi ku zbawieniu. Pozostaje tylko pytanie, czy zdołamy pociągnąć za sobą tych, którzy nie widzą wspólnoty Kościoła, nie czują miłości i wiary?

Prorok Izajasz, powołany przez Boga do oznajmiania Jego woli ludowi wybranemu, a później i nam, daje się poznać, jako mąż odpowiedzialny, posłuszny i kochający Boga. Stwierdza on jednoznacznie, iż po to otrzymał od Boga dar słuchania i mówienia, aby innym oznajmiać to, co jemu zostało objawione. Jak sam mówi: "Pan Bóg Mnie wspomaga, dlatego jestem nieczuły na obelgi, dlatego uczyniłem twarz moją jak głaz i wiem, że wstydu nie doznam." (Iz 50,7). Zaś św. Paweł tłumaczy swej ukochanej gminie Filipii, że nasz Pan, Jezus Chrystus, mimo iż jest Bogiem, zdecydował się na poniżenie, ogołocenie, okazując absolutne posłuszeństwo swemu Ojcu – Bogu: "uniżył samego siebie, stawszy się posłusznym aż do śmierci – i to śmierci krzyżowej. Dlatego też Bóg Go nad wszystko wywyższył i darował Mu imię ponad wszelkie imię, aby na imię Jezusa zgięło się każde kolano istot niebieskich i ziemskich i podziemnych." (Flp 2,8-10).

Pozostaje komentarz do dzisiejszej Ewangelii. Ale ona wprowadza nas już bezpośrednio w klimat Wielkiego Tygodnia, relacjonując nam przebieg całego Misterium Męki i Śmierci Pana Jezusa, na każdym kroku podkreślając olbrzymi ciężar odpowiedzialności – przyjęcie śmierci krzyżowej za nasze grzechy. W rezultacie nasze Zbawienie wynika z wielkiej Miłości do nas, ludzi, i z nadzwyczajnego posłuszeństwa wobec Boga Ojca. To posłuszeństwo widoczne jest w każdej chwili, począwszy od sądu, poprzez biczowanie, drogę na Golgotę, po ostatnie słowa: "Ojcze, w Twoje ręce powierzam ducha mojego." (Łk 23,46b).

Jeśli więc mamy wolność i sprawiedliwość, to pomyślmy o odpowiedzialności i miłości. A jeśli dodamy posłuszeństwo, to otrzymamy pełnię tego, czego oczekuje od nas Pan. Miejmy też w swojej świadomości, że przez wieki tych kilka słów spowodowało tak niesamowity zwrot w życiu całej rodziny ludzkiej. To one zmieniły cały porządek historii, odmieniły nasz los. Warto się nad nimi zastanowić w przededniu Wielkiego Tygodnia.

Jezu Chryste, Zbawicielu, przez Twoją Miłość pozwól nam poczuć odpowiedzialność za nasze czyny. W Wielkim Tygodniu daj nam przeżyć nadchodzące wydarzenia z miłością i zrozumieniem.
